What a terrific show! That's what we kept hearing from the hundred plus members and friends of the Art Associ-

ation who traveled with us to Liberty Station to see the San Diego Water-color Society's 37th International Exhibit. 135 artists from the United States, Canada, China and Europe were judged into this international exhibition where we were awed by a watercolor portrait of a fisherman from Myanmar, a mixed media street scene of a Polish village, and an acrylic of a Spanish hillside covered with olive trees. U.S artists honored us with fabulous abstracts and impressionistic works. Our own Susan Gale's abstract was hanging in a prominent place for all to admire. Best in Show was "Coat Check" by U. S. watercolorist John Salminem, dark and muddy, all absorbing. The general consensus was that this show was one of the best we have attended.

Liberty Station itself is a venue well worth the time and trouble to drive down to San Diego. It is 100 park-like acres of the former Naval Training Center featuring historic Spanish Colonial Revival architecture. Nearly 120 galleries, museums, artists' studios and distinctive restaurants and cafes - what more can you want?

General Meeting and Demonstration

Prior to the Demonstration there was a short meeting to vote on the 2018 Officers. The proposed slate of officers was reported in the October Brushstroke. The slate was unanimously accepted.

Peggy Kroll - Demo Artist

Peggy is the first artist we've had to demonstrate in gouache. An award-winning artist, she did not fail to deliver her unique and unmistakable technique. The following are the steps Peggy uses to paint her prize winning work:

She uses a heavy 80-lb paper for her small work, saving 140-lb watercolor paper for larger paintings and is an advocate of Andrew Loomis and utilizes his 8-head figure in her work.

Beginning her work, Peggy first paints in the cast shadows, using ivory black and ultramarine blue with the same value for all cast shadows.

She then paints the figures, using venetian red and white for the flesh tone. She leaves an edge of white paper to allow for highlights which she paints in white gouache. Shadows on the flesh are painted in a mixture of venetian red, burnt umber and green.

She keeps her values close. After the figure is complete, she paints the background: sand, ocean, beach chairs, umbrellas - then finishes details - whatever completes the painting.

Last, she checks her painting by looking at it backwards through a mirror. This, she says, allows her to see her mistakes clearly.

Peggy's rules for a good painting:

- Follow the path of light always
- Separate light from shadow to get form
- Become well grounded in the fundamentals of your art
- In using gouache, keep your white pure - do not allow it to become contaminated. Peggy uses three piles of white gouache to keep it clean
