The NFWI is pleased to announce that the Lady Denman Cup Competition 2021 will be held in partnership with the National Gallery. Using no more than 500 words, WI members are invited to submit a piece of writing, fact or fiction, in any style (story, poem etc.) based on the painting below by Artemisia Gentileschi.

Entrants must submit 4 copies of their entry, typed if possible, on A4 paper. Any entries sent directly NFWI without being approved by the Federation, cannot be entered and will be returned to the entrant. An Entry Form needs to be completed by all entrants and can be obtained by contacting the Federation Secretary by email or by downloading from the My WI/Make, create & do websites. Entrants will be charged £10 (incl. VAT) per entry. **Please do not send your entry fee with your entry.**

Postal Entries: Please complete an Entry Form and submit 4 copies of your entry to Kirsty Bowser, Federation Secretary, Hall Cross Cottage, 5 Albion Place, South Parade, Doncaster DN1 2EG, typed if possible on A4 paper. Your name, WI and Federation must be clearly written in the top left hand corner of the **first copy**. The remaining 3 copies must be kept anonymous.

Electronic Entries: Please email your entry to the Federation office, southyorksfed@gmail.com. A completed copy of the entry form must be attached to the email.

Your entry must reach our Federation Office by **30 July 2021** for judging at Federation level. Federations may only send 3 entries so you will be notified if your entry has been selected to be judged at National level and you will then be contacted for the entry fee of £10. The competition is open to WI Members and WI Associates only. One entry per member.

Book tokens will be given as prizes: 1st prize, book tokens to the value of £75; 2nd prize book tokens to the value of £50 and 3rd prize book tokens to the value of £30. The winner/winning Federation will be presented with the Lady Denman Cup.



RECIPE CORNER

5 A Day Rostí

Ingredients per person:

80g finely grated onion

80g finely grated carrot

80g finely grated parsnip

80g cooked lentils or other pulse


1.5 tbsp tomato puree

1 beaten egg

Whatever seasoning you'd like. I used some stock powder, garlic granules, celery salt and mixed herbs.

Method:

Mix everything together. Lightly oil a hot griddle or frying pan. Just enough to stop them sticking, you don't want to fry them in
