603 DARTERS OPEN 1984-1985 DDA SEASON

The DDA officially opened the 1984-1985 darting season September 13 with 72 teams in action. On Wednesday, September 19, an additional 43 teams toed the oche, making a total of 115 teams. Last year 96 teams participated in league play.

Membership totals 603 hailing from Troy, Tipp City, Springfield, Enon, Middletown, Hamilton, Springboro, Xenia, and the Dayton area.

Play throughout the various divisions is typical of early competition. There have been scattered indications of above par performances. GREG FORD fired T35, T40, T35 and T25 the first week of play; then, bang, he finally slipped three in the trip 20 bed for the T80.

DDA OFF TO FAST START

DDA president JIM RICHIE got his organization off to a fast start in mid-June. Frequent Board of Director meetings were held during July and August and groups were established to gather facts to be used for the 1984-1985 DDA program.

As an added attraction, the first attempt at a major fund raiser was originated and was completed within a period of a month. For our first attempt at a function of this type, the DDA can be proud of its contribution to the Muscular Dystrophy Association.

The plan for the opening of the fall darting season was a hustle-bustle affair to complete all the necessary preliminary work, scheduling and getting the league started on time. Well, the untiring efforts of Jim, DENNY HAWS, LYNN WOOLF, HANK DUFF, DENNY CROUSE, BRUCE BREIDENBACH, CHRIS SANDERS, BOB SHERRY and GARY ZAHN put us under full sails.

Concurrently the raffle, spearheaded by JENNY STEWART was discussed, planned, solicited and completed on October 4. Again, much work was involved by Jenny, HANK DUFF, GEORGE ESPOSITO, BOB SHERRY and GARY ZAHN. Participating bars were CHEERS, BRUNS and CACTUS JOHNS.

When in the past eight years have you witnessed or participated in so much activity in the first six months of DDA operation? And there is more to come!!!

LETTER FROM YOUR EDITOR:


'Ow'r ya doin todae, Matey,

You have read about the fast start of the DDA. This did not just happen. There was a lot of legwork and midnight oil burned to accomplish this work. There was some spinning of wheels. Regardless, this is the best start ever for the DDA, but I would like to comment on DDA operations.

We do not want to become involved in similar type organizational problems and embarrassing results that occurred in the past. Our leadership should be firm in the planning, organizing and direction of its program. The administrative group should be forceful and firm within the limitations outlined in the By-Laws. Jim Richie should be looking ahead to organizing and directing the programs and delegating explicit responsibilities rather than executing. This is a difficult task in a volunteer organization such as the DDA, but it can be done. And, it can be done without undue hardships on any one individual and the results can be beneficial to or enjoyed by our darters.

The Trustees, increased to nine, are expressing a little more guidance as to establishing policy and procedures. But the followup work should not be neglected or we will wind up in the same old rut. The Trustees should assume a larger role in the management of the program and monitoring the operations of the DDA.

A more impressive program can be had by a positive system of checks and balances between the nine trustees and the Association officers. The Board of Directors should thoroughly explore all the facets of any program implemented by the executive staff and be aware of all actions to ensure a more efficiently administered darting program.





DENNY HAWS, DDA vice president, has outlined the reporting of scores. Reports the first three weeks reveal the scores are not being reported properly and on time. Since no formal reporting procedures were issued, Denny has outlined the policy and procedure for the 1984-1985 season.

PROCEDURES FOR REPORTING MATCH SCORES:

- 1. The 3-page carbonless score sheets supplied at darting pubs will be used for each match.
- 2. Fill out the score sheet <u>completely and</u> <u>legibly</u>. <u>Please print</u>. (See Sample Score Sheet.)
 - a. Print players names correctly.
 - b. Be sure to "X" in winning teams or players.
 - c. Include outstanding shots -T80, high in and outshots (over T), exceptional shots, 10-dart and lower 301 games, 15-dart and lower 501 games, 10-dart and lower cricket games. If possible report the score per dart for each of these low score games.
 - d. Recognition and awards will be made only from high scores reported on the score sheets.








- e. Team captains must sign and date score sheet.
- f. The top two copies are for the home and visiting teams. The third copy (hard copy) is to be mailed to the DDA, P.O.

 Box 292828, Kettering, OH 45429 by the home team captain and received by the DDA by Tuesday following the scheduled night of play.
- g. <u>Failure to comply will result in a 2-point penalty.</u>
- h. Home team captain or representative should call in match scores to DDA at 293-0470 by 2:30 AM on night of play.
- i. A 3-point penalty will be assessed teams for failure to phone in scores.

Denny states it is important scores are called in and score sheets mailed. In order to have the standings published every Friday in the Dayton papers, Denny must prepare and deliver to the Sports desk copy of standings by 9:00 AM Monday morning. 115 teams need to cooperate to get this job done. So LET'S DO IT! Penalty points will be assessed effective October 19, 1984, for failure to report scores (see 2g and 2i Procedures for Reporting Match Scores).

Your cooperation will enable the weekly standings to be posted in your local "watering hole" when you arrive for next week's play. EDITOR'S NOTE: A review of final standings for the past three years reveal 5 to 7 penalty points can drop you from first place to third, fourth, or fifth. It seems to me that is a high price to pay for not taking 30 seconds to report your score. "Nuf said."

EDITORIAL by Carl Stravinski

CLOGS IN THE COGS - Do we need darters who fail to cooperate with the requests of the DDA? The DDA is constantly in the planning, organizing and directing of functions within its authorized structure. Registration and membership information, vital to the functioning of the organization is requested, required prior to the start of the darting season. This information is important to realizing the goals of the DDA.

When certain applicants disregard supplying the requested information in a clear, complete and legible manner, or portray a contemptible attitude by snide remarks about the information requested, I believe the DDA should be firm in dealing with individuals of this type.

Yes, a bit of preventative maintenance will eliminate future problems.
