# **POSITION ROUND WIN SECURES VICTORY**

# MINER CAPTURES TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS IN THRILLER

Jayson Miner's tour career has always been about perseverance. After all, the hard-throwing right-hander waited until his 28th tour appearance to qualify for his first match play finals. And now – in his 52nd tour stop, he's broken through for his first GISBT championship. In the vast history of the GISBT, only Alex Denton waited longer to secure his first win, with that coming in the 66th event of his career.

This month, Miner led the 23-player field into the match play finals, qualifying on top at +36, and leading by just a single pin over 2-time tour champ Dakota Solonka. Once the finals began, Miner quickly stamped himself as the player to beat. He slowly opened a lead, although there seemed to always be a pack of 3 or 4 contenders within striking distance. The outcome came down to the decisive position round, and eventually, after Miner struck once in the 10th frame, finishing with a 199 – he forced Isaac Erickson to double in the 10th frame to grab the win. After Erickson failed to strike, Miner's 199-171 position round win preserved the win.

Miner's best performance on tour prior to this month's victory was – ironically – a runner-up finish at the 2018 Tournament of Champions – also held at Leisure Lanes. Miner's Tournament of Champions breakthrough brings out an interesting statistic. Unbelievably – in the 28 Tournament of Champions contested, there have been 14 players in the boys division who have earned their first career titles in the T of C. By comparison, just 4 girls have won the T of C for their first GISBT championship. (Please see a list of first-time T of C winners elsewhere in this newsletter.)

Miner becomes the 124th boy's champion in tour history. He averaged exactly 210 for his 16 games, and he was rewarded with a \$500 scholarship for the victory. Congratulations, Jayson!

# T OF C MOVED TO AUGUST FOR FIRST TIME EVER

With the worldwide pandemic causing havor to the GISBT's schedule over the past 2 seasons, last season's Tournament of Champions was pushed to August for the first time ever. It was held in conjunction with the 2021-2022 30th anniversary season opener, also being held in Davenport.

The event was contested on a very challenging 41-foot turnpike lane pattern.

# **ERICKSON ENJOYS RUNNER-UP FINISH, BEST ON TOUR**

Isaac Erickson, a versatile right-hander from Lititz, Pennsylvania was in the finest form of his tour career, and it resulted in a \$400 payday for his runner-up finish. This was the 3rd match play finals appearance for Erickson, who most are in agreement that it's only a matter of time before he rolls his way into the GISBT Winner's Circle.

### **ABOUD FINISHES 3rd**

Justin Aboud continued his role as a talented force on the GISBT scene. The San Jose, California native earned a \$300 scholarship as a result of his 3rd place finish. Aboud has now competed in 3 tour events, and he's qualified for the match play finals in all three.

# YAMADA & NOLAN MAKE MATCH PLAY DEBUTS, EARN 4th & 5th

There was a pair of players making their first GISBT match play appearance at this month's Tournament of Champions. Kai Yamada, a strong 2-hander from Kaneone, Hawaii took home a \$250 scholarship by virtue of his 4th place finish, while Alex Nolan, a lanky right-handed stroker from Mokena, Illinois enjoyed his best finish on tour – a 5th place showing that netted him a \$225 award

# **KRAFT GRABS 6th**

Jacob Kraft was in solid opener at the season finale. The right-hander from Casper, Wyoming finished 6th, earning a \$200 scholarship. Kraft was appearing in the 3rd match play finals of his career.

# **2-TIME TOUR CHAMP SOLONKA FINISHES 7th**

2-time tour winner Dakota Solonka was the 7th place finisher; the Indianapolis native earned a \$175 award for his efforts. This represented the 12th finals appearance his his career.

# **ZILK TAKES 8th**

Josh Zilk rounded out the boy's finals field at the season-ending Tournament of Champions. Appearing in his 4th match play finals, the Virginia Beach, Virginia resident took home a \$150 scholarship.

# MADISON ABSOLUTELY DOMINANT IN PICKING UP FIRST CAREER WIN

### MADISON'S HUGE QUALIFYING LEAD PROVIDES WINNING CUSHION

It was obvious early on that Brynna Madison brought her "A" game to Davenport. The slender right-hander came out firing, and after the 8-game qualifying round, Madison had posted a +57 block, and that enabled her to roar out to a 156-pin lead. Despite having that lead sliced significantly during match play, she fired games of 236 and 245 late in match play to give her an insurmountable lead; her eventual margin of victory was 122 pins.

Over the past 2 seasons, the talented right-hander from Lincoln, Nebraska had tossed clues that she was on the cusp of a tour victory. Those "clues" included a runner-up finish at the January 2020 tour stop in Muscatine. This time out, she left no doubt on the outcome, as she impressively dominated a field of finalists who had combined their talents for 13 tour championships and 73 match play finals during their careers.

Madison averaged 204.85 for her 14 games. She earned a \$400 scholarship for the win, and a permanent place on GISBT Champion's Row. Congratulations, Brynna!

# 5-TIME TOUR WINNER COUREY PLACES RUNNER-UP

Cassidy Courey, appearing in the 25th match play finals of her career, took home a \$300 scholarship by virtue of her runner-up showing. Courey, a 5-time tour winner, hails from Brooklyn Center, Minnesota. She gave chase all day, but couldn't close the gap on the eventual first-time champion.

# 3-TIME CHAMP NELSON FINISHES 3rd

3-time tour winner Addy Nelson finished 3rd at the Tournament of Champions. The Gregory, South Dakota native pocketed a \$200 scholarship for her finish; it marked her 11th match play finals appearance.

# **MOORE TAKES 4th**

Rachel Moore was this month's 4th place finisher. The right-hander from Keokuk, Iowa earned a \$175 scholarship for appearing in the 8th match play finals of her tour career.

### **EVANS EARNS 5th**

Gabi Evans finished 5th at the season finale. The talented right-hander from West Liberty, Iowa took home a \$150 scholarship for her performance. Evans was appearing in her 6th career match play finals.

# **BOWLER OF THE YEAR SWANK SECURES 6th**

Christin Swank rounded out this month's match play finals field. The 2-time GISBT Bowler of the Year and 5-time champion finished 6th, earning a \$125 scholarship. It was the 26th match play finals appearance of her career. This put an exclamation point of Swank's 2020-2021 season in which she was the tour's Bowler of the Year.
