The Bad Path of Passwords

Choose a new password.

Password must:

- Have at least one lower case character
- Have at least one capital letter
- Have at least one number
- Not contain multiple identical consecutive characters
- Not be the same as the account name
- Be at least 8 characters
- Not be a common password
- Not be used in past year

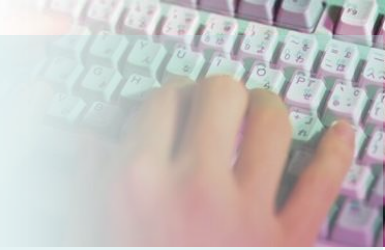
