On April 2, 1792 - Congress established the first U.S. mint in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

On April 2, 1805 - Fairy Tale Author Hans Christian Anderson was born.

On April 3, 1860 - The Pony Express Service began in the American West.

On April 3, 1865 - The Confederate Capital of Richmond, Virginia surrendered to Union Forces after the withdrawal of General Lee's troops.

On April 3, 1995 - Sandra Day O'Connor became the first woman to serve on the Supreme Court.

On April 4, 1949 - 12 Nations signed the treaty creating the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

On April 4, 1968 - Civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King was killed in Memphis, Tennessee.

On April 5, 1856 - Booker T. Washington was born.

On April 9, 1865 - After over 500,000 American deaths, the Civil War effectively ended.

On April 12, 1945 - President Franklin D. Roosevelt died suddenly at Warm Springs, Georgia.

On April 12, 1961 - Russian Cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin became the first human in space.

On April 13, 1743 - Thomas Jefferson was born.

On April 14, 1828 - The first American-style English dictionary was published by Noah Webster.

On April 14, 1865 - President Abraham Lincoln was shot and mortally wounded at Ford's Theater.

On April 15, 1912 - In the icy waters off Newfoundland, the luxury liner *Titanic* with 2,224 persons on board, sank after hitting an iceberg.

On April 16, 1867 - American aviator and pioneer Wilbur Wright was born.

On April 16, 1889 - Film comedian Charlie Chaplin was born.

On April 19, 1995 – A car bomb in Oklahoma City killed 168 persons, including 17 children.

On April 20, 1889 - Adolph Hitler was born.
