### **Green Space**

We are happy to have a community area we can all use. Please be a good neighbor and pick up any trash you see. We would like to keep the area clean and while our lawn crew does clean when they are there, we would like to see it clean all of the time. Contact Graham Management if you are planning any events at the clubhouse, playground, or pool. Graham keeps a community calendar so our common spaces are not booked at the same time for private events.

#### **Architectural Control Committee**

Remember to always obtain ACC approval before making changes to the exterior of your home, including any exterior painting, roofing, fence, or driveway replacement. The instructions and Exterior Modification Request application can be found on the Crest website noted above.

#### **Deed Restrictions**

Please remember we are a Deed Restricted community. The restrictions are posted on our website.

#### Trash & Recycling Services

Trash service is Monday and Thursday. Recycling service is Wednesday.

"Backdoor" trash pickup is provided for standard residential trash and grass clippings, which means trash can(s) or bags can be placed near the back or gate but outside of any fenced area. A maximum of 6 bags not exceeding 40 pounds per bag per pickup. Tree trimmings and branches, cut in length not to exceed four (4) feet, securely tied in bundles weighing less than 40 pounds, heavy trash and recycling must be placed curbside. Generally, paper, cardboard, plastic, and metal are accepted for recycling. Glass is not currently accepted for recycling.

Holiday Collection days falling on Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years will occur the following day and service for the subsequent day in the same week will also be completed one day later. Collection days falling on Good Friday, Memorial Day, July 4th and Labor Day will continue as normal.

# **Strawberry Pineapple Salsa**

pineapple (peeled)
pound of strawberries
roma tomatoes (diced)
1/2 red onion (minced)

1/2 jalapeno (minced)1/3 cup fresh cilantro (chopped)1 lime (juiced)1/2 teaspoon salt

Remove the peel and core from the pineapple and dice the fruit into a small, 1/4-inch dice. Place into a large mixing bowl. Hull the strawberries, and dice into a small, 1/4-inch dice. Add to bowl with pineapple. Dice the tomatoes into a 1/4 inch dice as well and toss with pineapple and strawberries. Add minced onion and jalapeno to bowl along with cilantro, lime juice, and salt. Stir to combine. Allow to sit at room temperature for 30 minutes before serving. Keeps in the refrigerator 24 hours!

## How to Organize Your Travel Plans

Traveling soon? Don't just rely on Post-it notes and your email inbox. Thanks to all the travel apps and websites that have popped up in recent years, organizing your travel plans has never been easier. Here are a few of the most popular:

**For finding airfare:** Google Flights, Kayak and SkyScanner help you draw a quick baseline for cost of flights. They also suggest alternative days to travel if you can be flexible on your travel dates to save a little money.

**For researching hotels:** TripAdvisor offers thousands of consumer reviews along with photos that have been uploaded by travelers rather than advertising professionals. If you do arrive at a hotel and don't like it, apps HotelTonight and Roomer can help you find a suitable (and likely discounted) alternative there on the spot.

**For keeping track of your details:** Flight times, your hotel's address, rental car info, confirmation numbers — so many numbers you want at your fingertips when traveling. TripIt and TripCase are two apps that strip out unnecessary information and put what you need to know from confirmation emails into a well-ordered itinerary. They're both free, but you can pay \$49 annually for a more robust TripIt Pro with extra features like notifications of gate changes and alerts when a better seat becomes available.

**For road trips:** iExit tells you what services are where at various U.S. highway exits so you can decide whether to wait or turn off now. Roadtrippers finds all the great American roadside attractions as well as restaurants and other services that are close. And GasBuddy compares gas prices of all the nearest stations.

## **Dog Leash Rules**

Country Village is fortunate to have a large green space behind the tennis courts, allowing for very flexible use by all of us. Residents have used it for community gardening, strolling, playing games, playing with their dogs on and off the leash, and more. The area is a common use space for all our residents; it is not a dog park/run. Unfortunately we've become aware that there is confusion about the dog leash rules in this area and that criterion for allowing dogs off their leash is not being followed by some residents. Consequently, unleashed dogs will no longer be permitted. All dogs within our Community common areas, tennis courts, basketball court and patio shall always be leashed.

We encourage all our dog owners to pick up after them and properly dispose of their waste. Of course, absolutely no pets are allowed in the playground or pool areas.





### CALL BEFORE YOU DIG

Building a deck? Planting a tree? 811 is the new number you should call before you begin any digging project.

A federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811 was created to help protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects. People digging often make risky assumptions about whether or not they should get their utility lines marked due to concerns about project delays, costs and previous calls about other projects. These assumptions can be life-threatening.

Make a call for every digging job – even small projects like planting trees or shrubs. If you hit an underground utility line while digging, you can harm yourself or those around you, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially be responsible for fines and repair costs.

A recent study revealed that nearly half of homeowners who plan to dig this year won't call 811 to learn the approximate locations of buried gas, electric, communications, water and sewer lines before digging, putting their safety and the safety of others at risk. According to data collected by CGA, when an individual makes a call to 811 before digging, damage occurs less than 1 percent of the time.

If you are planning on traveling this season and would like to have the Constable put a vacation watch on your house, please go to the Precinct 5 constable website (*www.Constablepct5.com*) and download the form.

While you are on the website you can look over the other programs that the Constable offers. I took the "Citizens Police Academy". It was extremely informative and enjoyable. Sadly, crime continues and our lawn and garden contractors and homeowners are easy prey for theft of equipment. Please remind them to watch their equipment.

During the year we have many residents enjoying the outdoors and walking the streets of CV, please be observant of your surroundings...if something does not appear right, please call the Constable. The Constable can typically respond in 5-10 minutes, so please call. If you are the victim of a crime, call the Constables, they will respond faster and inform the neighborhood of the crime in a timely manner. HPD does not send out crime alerts, so if you are the victim and HPD responds the only way we would know about it would be for the victim to pass along the information.
