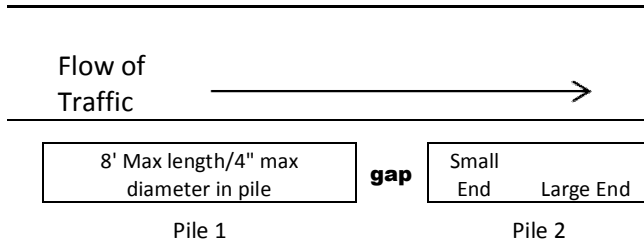
Brush Pick-up

Brush pick-up is scheduled for the following weeks:

Aug. 13 Oct. 8

- Pile brush at the curb pointing the cut/heavy end with the flow of traffic.
- Brush piles must run parallel with the road
- Small brush must be in an open container or CLEAR bag.
- Trim limbs per the Village Ordinance. Limbs larger than 4" in diameter or 8' in length **will not be picked up**.
- Brush must be set out at the curb by Monday at 7 a.m. of the scheduled pick-up week.
- Do not set out brush more than 5 days before the scheduled Monday.
- Brush generated by tree removal contractors will not be picked up.
- Please call with questions; brush not properly stacked will be red tagged and your responsibility to dispose of.

Per ordinance 9-3-2 (c) no person shall deposit any refuse, leaves or grass clippings in any gutter along any public street, road, alley or highway. Please protect our storm sewers and sweep up if you must blow into the street.

Permits, Ordinances, Setbacks

There have been numerous violations concerning the following Village Ordinances:

- Failure to obtain a building permit
- Violation of property lines and front and rear setbacks
- Parking on unimproved surfaces
- Junk appliances, unlicensed and inoperable vehicles
- Fences
- Pools

The Village Ordinance Book is posted on our website. When in doubt, call the Village office.

Residents are reminded that ***permits must be obtained for most property improvements.***

When planning your construction project, please allow a two-week time frame for appropriate permits, estimates, locates, etc.

Regulation of Length of Lawn and Grasses

Village Ord. 6-1-8

Lawns, grasses and noxious weeds on lots or parcels of land which exceed eight (8) inches in length adversely affects the public health and safety of the public in that they tend to emit pollen, and constitute a fire hazard and a safety hazard in that debris can be hidden in the grass. For that reason, any lawn, grass or weed on a parcel of land which exceeds eight (8) inches in length is hereby declared to be a public nuisance. ****In any case where the owner or occupant fails to cut the lawn, grass or weeds, the Village may elect to cut the lawn, grass or weeds and shall charge the expense of doing so to the property owner.**

Elections & Voter Registration

Partisan Primary - August 14

General Election - November 6

The polls are open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM. If you need to vote by absentee ballot or register, you may apply at the Village Office or by visiting myvote.wi.gov. You must have proof of residence: driver's license, utility bill, bank statement, government document etc. that has your current street address on it to register and a photo id to vote.

If your address has changed you must re-register with the correct address! Any questions please contact the office!

Historic Preservation Committee

The Pardeeville Historic Preservation Committee is seeking new members to fill vacancies on the board.

The primary purpose of the Commission is to preserve the Village's historic or prehistoric sights and cultural heritage.

There are currently three structures within the Village that are registered as "Historic." They are the Angie Williams Cox Library, the Myrtle Lintner-Spear Museum, and the First Presbyterian Church. Undoubtedly, other buildings or landmarks are eligible for this designation.
