

The Impossible Made Possible

"And Jesus said, The things which are impossible with men are possible with God." Luke 18:27.

When Jesus spoke these words He was speaking of those who could enter the kingdom of God. God has a kingdom. At the present it is spiritual and inward. "For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink, but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost." Rom. 14:17. It is entirely the result of being filled with the Spirit and is not dependent on material things. Beloved, the kingdom of God is not earthly things but eternal and will last forever.

There is coming the time when this kingdom will not only be experienced within, but will take on an outward, material aspect. This will be realized and brought about through the personal return of our Lord Jesus Christ, when He comes to set up His earthly kingdom right here upon this earth, to reign for 1000 years with His people. We read in Rev. 11: The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign forever and ever." He was filled with the Spirit and power of God, and became a mighty man of God under the dynamic power of the Holy Spirit. He preaches a sermon wherein three thousand souls were saved.

Sometimes young Christians feel that nothing to them is impossible. They suppose that they can now live a Godly, active and spiritual life. They are not aware that they too often rely on self rather than on God. Then comes temptation. Self-reliance has not been sufficient. They stumble and fall. Some immediately see their need and seek God, depending on God to fill them with His Spirit and power. Others conclude that a Christian cannot live the standard God requires of them in His Word. Many of these decide they must sin daily, and teach this, then go into a formal profession of religion. To these, Christian advancement and the development of Christian character is at an end. This Christian hinders rather than advances, the kingdom of God. Young Christian, remember you must rely on the grace of God, and trust in Him, to fill you with His Spirit and power. God's grace is sufficient for every test and trial. He will never leave you nor forsake you. There is victory in the grace of God. "For the things which are impossible with men are possible with God." God is greater than human weakness, He understands our every need. He has given us His Spirit and endued us with His power to meet every trial. What made Job have such a

power with God? It was his obedience and faith in God. 'Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him." He trusted God in spite of what he could see or feel. Read of Saul of Tarsus who was changed to Paul, that great apostle, in the book of Acts. After Saul was converted and filled with the Spirit of God, and endued with the power of God, he became a great worker and many souls were saved through his life. We read in Rom. "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit." Thank God, we can be more than conquerors through Him that loved us and gave Himself for us.

The purpose of God in His great plan of salvation, which is a perfect plan, is to give power to that weak one; to infill him with His love and power; to lift that

Psalms 147-5

There are thousands in the world today that know the power of God to heal our bodies. To us that do, it is not only a wonderful privilege to trust God for healing, but it is our duty to do so. If we fail to trust God, there is unbelief "springing up" within us and our hearts are departing from the Lord.

Nevertheless there are many, sincere, devoted Christians who know the Lord as their personal Saviour, yet have never learned to know Him, as their healer. It is to these primarily, that this exhortation is intended.

There is an "all sufficient" remedy that has been available some 2000 years. Jesus made a double atonement for both soul and body. His blood was shed for the salvation of our soul. He bore the stripes on His body for the healing of our bodies. The prophesies made concerning Him, hundreds of years before He came into the world, spoke of the double atone-Surely He hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: vet we did esteem Him stricken. smitten of God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we were healed." Isa. 53:

The message of divine healing is a part of the gospel that is to be preached during this church age. The Bible tells us that we "are built upon the foundation of the

apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief corner stone." Eph. 2:20. Then again in Heb. 2:3-4 speaking of this great plan of salvation, "which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard Him; God is also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders and with divers miracles,—"



During Jesus' ministry while here on earth, the outstanding feature of His work was the healing of the sick. Why did He heal the sick? Was it to prove His divini-ty? If it was the apostles were divine also. Because they had the power to heal the sick in the name of Jesus. Was this power granted to the followers of the Lord only, while He was here on earth? Did the miracles of healing end when He ascended to the Father? On one occasion Jesus told His disciples, "Verily, verily I say unto you, he that believeth on me; the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.—If ye shall ask anything in my name, I will do it." John 14:12-14. In the last commission which Jesus gave just before His ascension He said unto them, 'go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptised shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned. And these signs shall follow them that believe-" then in enumerating the things which we have the power

and authority to do in His name. -"they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover.' Many have failed to understand and discern the broken body of the Lord, and we are told in I Cor. 11:29-30-" not discerning the Lord's body, for this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep." This portion of the gospel has often been omitted by a majority of the modern ministry. But Jesus said, "Teaching them to observe ALL things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, Lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world." Matt. 28:20. "So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, He was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God. And they went forth, and preached everwhere, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following." Mark 16: 19-20. There are no divine healers, although there are people in the world who claim to be. The Bible says "the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up" James 5:15. 'The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." Elias was a man subject to like passions as we are, and we're told how he prayed earnestly that it might not rain and it rained not for the space of three years and six months, then he prayed again and the heaven gave rain." James 5:17-18. "He that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him. "But without faith it is impossible to please Him. Heb. 11:6.

Most people who believe that there is a God, believe that God has the power to heal, "but with God all things are possible." Matt. 19:26. But they just do not believe that he does it in our present day. True there is much unbelief in the world today, but there also was unbelief while Christ was on the earth. "And He did not many great works there because of their unbelief." Matt. 13:58. Nevertheless. Jesus healed all that would come unto Him believing, and He does the same today, all because of His great love and compassion

ATOMIC BOMB HELD PROPHETIC

The Sunday School Times, in September 1 issue, makes the following comment on the atomic bomb:

"With the advent of the atomic bomb, Luke 21:25-28 and other kindred passages come before the children of God with new significance. Again the newspapers bring testimony to the truth of God's Word. The accounts describe this atomic energy as 'the greatest force in the universe.' It seems to me that this force is what the Lord Jesus was speaking of in Luke 21: 28: 'The power (lit. explosive forces) of the heavens shall be shaken' (R.V.).

Surely it is no coincidence that the only element found to be suitable for the experiment is uranium. The Holy Spirit made no mistake in the inspiration of the Scriptures. The Greek of the above verse means 'the dynamite of uranium.'

"We are told that when the experiment with the bomb was made in the desert of New Mexico, the steeel tower in which it was exploded by remote control was vaporized. The tower did not become a mass of molten metal, but went up in gas, literally passing 'away with a great noise.' Unbelievers laugh at the prophecy of (R.V.) 2 Peter 3:10 (as indeed they do about everything else supernatural or miraculous) - 'the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall be dissolved with fervent heat,' yet we have seen a preview of the very thing before our eyes.

" 'Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the Inside of two or three weeks we have read in the papers of (1) the crashing of the bomber into the world's tallest building: (2) the cracking up of the world's

largest flying boat in Chesapeake Bay; (3) the flying of the world's fastest plane from Ohio to New York—544 miles in 62 minutes: (4) the dropping of two of the world's most powerful bombs on Japenese cities. In the last few months all the great world leaders of the war, except Stalin-Roosevelt, Mussolini, Hitler, Tojo, Churchill-have either died or passed from power. (It is not for me to say whether there is any special significance in the facts that only Stalin of Russia remains. We do know, however, that Russia

plays an important role in the prophetical Scriptures.)

'When these things begin to come to pass, then look up and lift up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh!'—A Virginia

'The whole text of Luke 21: 25-28 reads as follows: 'And there shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, with perplexity; the sea and the waves roaring; men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth: for the powers of heaven shall be shaken. And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. And when these things begin to come to pass, then look up, and life up your heads; for your redemption draweth nigh.'

Thanksgiving



UST a little more than 300 years ago a band of pilgrims from the Old Country moored their bark on a wild New England shore." Nine weeks previous this brave band, one hundred in number, fleeing religious persecution, had left Plymouth, England, in their little ship, the Mayflower, and started west across the broad, stormy ocean to the land of freedom.

This was the coming of our "Pilgrim Fathers," and the place of their landing in Massachusetts was known as Plymouth Rock. Scarcely had these brave pioneers become settled in their new colony when the terrible New Eng-The suffering which they endured is evidenced by the land winter was upon them. fact that before the following summer one-half of the party had died.

Nothing daunted, those who were spared, happy in their new-found freedom, stayed on, planted their crops and prepared for the following winter. In 1621, the year following their landing, after a good harvest, the colonists determined on a period of recreation combined with thanksgiving for their many mercies. The governor sent out four huntsmen, who in one day secured enough game to supply the colony for nearly a week.

This was the original American Thanksgiving. For two hundred years it continued to be an Eastern holiday, taking place after every fall harvest. Today it is a national custom, the day being observed throughout the United States. In commemorating this birth of our nation let us remember that it was founded and raised on the Bible: that religion came first and business was a secondary consideration; that the laws of men were based upon the laws of God; and that the church was the first and most important organization of every community.

The best that is in us we owe to these sober, uncompromising, God-fearing New Englanders. And the farther we drift from their stern teachings and tenets, the greater is our danger of shipwreck as a nation and as individuals.

BIBLE IN EUROPE

Throughout the war in Europe news trickled from the occupied continent of such hunger for the Bible that the demand far exceeded the supply. Although Christians in America and Britain were glad to hear these things, many wondered if this were not just a passing interest which would disappear after the first shock of tragedy and loss were over. Dr. W. A. Visser 't Hooft of Holland, speaking before the 129th annual meeting of the American Bible Society, answered this question in the minds of many. He is convinced that the widespread demand for Scriptures on the part of displaced persons, allied prisoners of war, German prisoners of war, youth of all nationalities, and awakened Protestant groups is the result of deep conviction of spiritual need which can be satisfied only by God's Word. He believes that now is the time for aggressive action in spreading the Word of God far and wide over Europe. In his own words, "If you take that job seriously, you are going to touch European life at the central point, and it will have its repercussions in all parts of life, not least in the political life of Eu-What a challenge to our prayers!

A SOLDIER WITH THE AMERICAN ARMY IN ITALY

"Having actually seen the deplorable conditions which prevail here in this part of the country and having viewed the poverty and destruction caused by this terrible war, my heart goes out more and more to these people her in spiritual darkness. Oh, if the Christian people in America could only see the conditions as they really are. I am sure they would be more concerned and they would try to understand and to help them more.

I Cor. 3:9 "For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building." I hope in this and the following statements our vision will be cleared in respect to our brothers call to the ministry. If you will read the preceding eight verses of this chapter, you will find Paul was doing his best to get people off dead center, and to realize that the individual that is working for the Lord is only an instrument in the hands of God to win the Lost and promote the way of life. So many people these days never seem to see beyond the sphere of their own lives and influence. Many a hard battle is fought and won (or sometimes lost) and no one ever realizes anything unusual has taken place. Only eternity will reveal the battle won by men and women that felt the call to some battle field, and with scarcely an encouraging word from friends; many fought to a finish with the foe. I wonder sometimes if God won't highly exalt such people that have crossed those lonely valleys and scaled a rugged mountain, bearing a cross that no one knew its weight but the Son of And yet friend, that very drama is going on in the world every day. Some times a remark is dropped (not intentionally I hope) that could so easily discourage those that feel the call to certain duties.
