Teacher updates:

Safety Month, two drills set for October. Disaster and Run, Hide, Defend drills. October 17 will be the Disaster Drill. See Baldwin Secretary for specifics or if any parent wishes to supply support and be there that day.

Run, Hide, Defend drill to be on October 28. Parents are encouraged to engage the Principal if they want details on how this is carried out. It is a multi-agency initiative and treated with all the professionalism that is expected.

Principal updates: District Office (DO) has communicated that school will be open despite potential loss of power. District has introduced a new communication tool meant to replace Ed Connect. It's called Parent Square. The App is more powerful than the former App. There is debate on whether or not any signing up is required. Some parents did create logins but Ms. Barlesi is being told it's a seamless transition.

The District has communicated to the greater community, their intent on putting a Parcel Tax on the March 2020 ballot. We are asking for more transactional support so we can help to get the message out. Budget implications from the DO are not for the 2019-2020 school year. Further closures or drastic measures will potentially hit the 2020-2021 school year. The last Ballot measure barely failed with minimal publicity. We are looking for additional talking points, guidance on how we can best communicate to our families in the community with a vote.

Fundraisers: Charleston Wrap completed in September and while not reaching our goal it was still a success. We raised slightly over \$22,000. Final net profit to Julia Baldwin is forthcoming. 80 families participated and submitted order forms. Many of our internal teams helped to make this a success. From our School Secretary to our Associated Student Body, parent volunteers, Staff and Parents we all had a hand in our events success.

Book Fair is planned for 10/23-10/31 but we are in dire need of volunteers to pull this off. If we can't get the bare minimum head count we will need to cancel at this time. October 23 1pm cashier training if you have never done this. Online refresher for previously worked cashiers
