"There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him"

Pastor Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

2nd Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C

'On the third day' (John 2:1) Great things happen on that day! Of course, the 'third day' is the Day of our Lord's Resurrection (Lk 24:7 & Lk9:22, 44; 17:25; 18:32–33) But our gospel today begins giving us the details of the first miracle of Jesus (Gospel of John uses a different name 'signs', instead of 'miracles') It reveals to us that it happened on the 'third day. The Cana sign occurs the third day following Jesus' calling of his first initial apostles (Andrew, Peter, Philip, Nathaniel). Andrew's call happens immediately after John Baptist pointed Jesus out to Andrew as the Lamb of God 'who takes away the sins of the world' (John 1:35-39). Recall that John said he only used 'water', but that Jesus-Lamb is who would 'take away' sin (like really wash it). In the midst of all this action, Jesus tells his newly called apostle Nathaniel, "You will see greater things than this" (Jn 1:50) So, at this point, the gospel has teed us up to hear the great miracle sign of Cana – Jesus transforms water to wine. He takes something simple like water & infuses it with such Spirit that it is transformed into the finest of wines.

In the background keep in mind also that it was earthen clay vessels that held this divine wine of Jesus. Consider that Jesus not only fills common water with his Spirit to make the finest wine, but that Jesus then goes on to use that special wine to bless simple clay jars with extraordinary 'life-giving' drink. Similar to how God breathed life-spirit into clay dust at our creation, so also the water-wine-blood of Jesus that enters us through Jesus' death (Mass), not only washes us, and not only nourishes us, but brings us to new life in Him (It is His blood coursing through us now as we imbibe that spiritual drink-our 3rd day of resurrected life in Him).

So let's examine this sign of John 2:1-11. I find a connection running through the whole 2nd chapter of John's gospel related to the 'Third day' talk. Jesus brings up (yes) a third day phenomena in John 2:19, when He announces, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." I find a parallel between the Stone Temple and the Ceremonial Jars. The jars were *empty*, and Jesus filled them again. But not again with only water. He rejuvenated their use, enlivening them with 'spirit'. He filled them with new meaning (new covenant). He takes the empty rituals (washing & other temple routines) of the Old Covenant, reconstituting them with new significance. The Temple has also been emptied of spiritual value. Later in John 2:15, Jesus will drive out the religious profiteers who hijacked the Temple's use, having filled it with their schemes and markets. After the Temple is emptied out of such merchant exploiters, Jesus will re-fill it with the proper, genuine 'prayer and worship' of the Father. Jesus is imbuing the Temple and its practices again with their original sense of 'pure relationship and purpose' – Honor and Adoration of God. Jesus often warned His followers to avoid complacently putting faith in 'externals' (buildings, rituals & things), instead of keeping the 'interior intention' of all religious observances. Once in Matthew 24:1-2, when the disciples fell over each other adoring the Temple Structure, Jesus let them know "You see all these things, do you not? Amen, I say to you, there will not be left here a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." And to prevent them from putting faith in empty rituals, He warned them not to be like the Pharisees for whom "All their works are performed to be seen" (Matt 23:5) and who hypocritically 'show out' their practices to impress and gain favors (Matt 6:1, 5, 16). Jesus is emphasizing the heart of the matter and keeping the spirit pure in prayer. The inside is more important than outside.

One last note: Some people are troubled by the dialogue exchanged between Mary and Jesus. Some people say Jesus sounds 'short' or 'rude' with her by saying, "What concern is that to me? My hour has not come" (John 2:4) there are problems at the wedding - they've run out of wine. Don't we all have experiences with weddings and timing (and changes in plans)? They have so many details and pieces needing to fit into place, and their timing is critical - what wedding starts on time? So this Cana Wedding is no different! Please do not think Jesus' short response back is reflective of anything like a snappy, 'Bride-God-Zilla' motivated crisis. No, Jesus is just simply 'tempering expectations' about 'saving the day'. Jesus had told Nathaniel that 'greater things will happen' with Him, but I suspect that Jesus wanted to be clear that it was not His own will and schedule that counted but God's, for whenever 'great signs' would occur. Repeatedly in John's gospel, Jesus will speak about the right timing for God's will to be accomplished. Jesus refers to it as 'my hour' (4:21, 5:25, 7:6, 7:30, 8:20). It is not until John 12:23 & Jn 13:1 that Jesus will finally say "My hour has come", and things quickly progress to His death and resurrection. But humble Jesus ensures that any wonder-working will glorify the Father, not Himself. In fact, I love how John's gospel informs us that only Jesus, the Blessed Mother and the servants (of course) are aware of the great miracle-sign.
