Congratulations to Bingo's Newest Grand Champion

Rollowing retirement, Robin Cannon and her husband, Bob, wanted to take a vacation filled with interesting sights and experiences. The trick was finding one they were confident they would both enjoy.

"I had never been on a cruise before, and a friend of mine who had been on three Bingo cruises was putting a group together," Robin says. "I loved the idea; I play Bingo three times a week and it seemed like a lot of fun to combine a Bingo Tournament with a cruise to the Caribbean. But my husband had been in the navy, so a vacation on a ship wasn't quite the same for him as it would be for me."

In the end, Bob agreed to join Robin for the 30th Annual World Championship Bingo Tournament & Gaming Cruise after she sweetened the deal with one of the ship's drink packages. "I think it was something like 15 drinks a day, whatever and wherever he wanted," Robin laughs. "He liked it and the trip was a go."

Departing from New Orleans, the Tournament Cruise visited the Caribbean ports of Montego Bay, Grand Cayman and Cozumel, and the Cannons made sure to take advantage of every stop. "The tours were wonderful," Robin says. "We swam with dolphins, saw the reefs in a submarine and visited Mayan ruins. It was a great experience."



Bingo News

Play on Red Letter Days

Iceland's Ministry of Justice is drafting a bill to legalize Bingo and other forms of entertainment that are currently illegal on major Christian holidays. Iceland Review reports that according to current Icelandic law, it is illegal to organize public entertainment such as Bingo, raffles and even dances on high holy days like Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. While the law was put in place decades ago to ensure religious holidays could be celebrated without disturbance, few feel it is still necessary. The bill, which at press time was in consultation in the Ministry of Justice, is intended to better service those who would like to organize or partake in entertainment on "redletter" days. Should it be passed, the only clause that would remain would be that such activities not interfere with religious services or church activities.

Hallmark TV features Viewer Bingo

During the holiday season, the Hallmark Channel and its sister TV network, Hallmark Movies and Mysteries, premiered a record-breaking thirty-seven seasonal films. To make your viewing parties even more fun, Hallmark created a jolly Bingo game for viewers to play while they watched, with squares such as "female character wears a red coat," "Someone ice-skates backward," "Character returns to home town," and "Oh look, it's suddenly snowing." Hallmark films are known for their festive, sappy-as-a-pine-tree storylinesand promised viewers they would be shouting "Bingo!" after just one weekend of binge-watching.

Voters Change Bingo

Missouri voters made their voices heard on several state referendums, one of which pertained to Bingo gaming. The Bingo amendment asked voters if they wanted to amend the **Missouri Constitution to "Remove** language limiting Bingo game advertising that a court ruled unenforceable," and "Allow a member of a licensed organization conducting Bingo games to participate in the management of Bingo games after being a member of the organization for six months instead of the current two years." The amendment passed by a slim margin, with 52% of voters in favor and 47% against. Overall, 1,186,643 people voted for the amendment and 1,079,356 against. State and local governmental entities estimated no costs or savings from this proposal.

Electronic Bingo in Canada

International Game Technology (IGT) has announced the launch of first-of-its-kind electronic Bingo content for the Canadian market. The Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation (OLG) is the first lottery in Canada to feature a range of electronic Bingo games through a pilot at 12 of OLG's charitable gaming centers. IGT's electronic Bingo games such as Bengal Eyes, Golden Rooster and Pharaoh's Legacy are among a range of titles that players can enjoy at the locations. David Flinn, the firm's regional vice president Canada, said: "Launching electronic Bingo content in Canada represents a meaningful growth opportunity for IGT and our customers." Flinn added that in the wake of a successful launch with OLG, IGT is looking forward to extending its electronic Bingo installed base to additional provinces throughout Canada.

With Bingo I'm there to focus on the game and be entertained by the excitement of getting close to and/or winning money. Period. I don't need to wait five minutes between numbers while the caller makes fun of some guy's hat. That's stupid and a complete waste of my time.

I hope you will publish this letter as a reminder to those who run Bingo that not everyone is there for the workers' amusement and that lots of us would prefer that the Bingo is run in a normal fashion so that we can play the game, get our winnings and go home. – VC, via email

Hi VC,

Personally, I like it when Bingo halls have different types of personalities so that I can pick and choose the hall to head to, depending on my mood.

If I've had a good day and am feeling upbeat, I might head to a hall with a caller just like the one you describe, with a big personality who likes to joke around and have fun with his coworkers and players. In such a case, I'm getting my fill of Bingo plus a bit of a floorshow-at no added cost. And I might pick up a joke or two to take to work the next day.

(If you ever want a real show, I suggest you try out a drag Bingo, bar Bingo or other "alternative" venue. The callers and other workers can be hilarious, the games promise to be a little crazy, and you are guaranteed more than one hearty laugh at some unsuspecting patron's expenseand hopefully not your own.)

Other times I may be looking for a Bingo that is more sedate, all business, so that I can enjoy my Bingo in peace, get out at decent

hour, and move on with my life.

Not every player is going to enjoy every kind of Bingo hall. Some folks like casino gaming, while others prefer neighborhood church hall charity games. Some like big, roomy halls with lots of people and lots of activity, while others are more comfortable in a smaller facility with fewer players and more elbowroom. And of course, some players like a jovial, friendly, familiar caller running their games, while others will opt for a quiet, efficient no-nonsense person at the console who will keep things moving and wrap it all up ahead of schedule.

Fortunately, it's a great big world out there with plenty of room for everyone to have interests and activities that are offered in a way that best suits them.

New Boss for DC VA Medical Center

Those of you who get care at the Washington DC Veterans Affairs Medical Center (over 120.000 of you) probably can breathe a sigh of relief. A new director has taken the helm.

Michael Heimall comes with loads of experience: former Army officer, served as director at Walter Reed, 30 years in various capacities, a degree from the War College and a lot more. But the Washington DC VA Medical Center might be his biggest challenge yet. This was the facility that risked lives because of chronic shortages. Remember when surgery staff had to run to other hospitals to borrow equipment? Or the dirty storerooms for sterile supplies, expired material on the shelves, surgeries canceled for lack of equipment, half a million uninventoried items stored in unsecured areas, \$92 million in supplies ordered when there was no clue about what they already had, and confidential patient info stored in an unsecured area and found in the dumpster? The VA's Office of the Inspector General had plenty to say about it in its report. All that nonsense will hopefully come to a screeching halt. A to-

Avoid Medicare Mistakes While Still Working

Dear Savvy Senior.

Should I enroll in Medicare at age 65 if I'm still working and have coverage through my employer? — Almost 65

Dear Almost,

The rules for enrolling in Medicare can be very confusing with all the different choices available today. But when you postpone retirement past age 65, as many people are doing, it becomes even more complicated.

First. let's review the basics. **Remember that original Medicare** has two parts: Part A, which provides hospital coverage and is free for most people. And Part B, which covers doctor's bills, lab tests and outpatient care. Part B also has a monthly premium of \$104.90 in 2016 (though it's higher for individuals earning \$85,000 or more a year).

If you are receiving Social Security, you will be enrolled automatically in parts A and B when you turn 65. If you aren't yet receiving Social Security, you will have to apply, which you can do

online at <u>SSA.gov/medicare</u>, over the phone at 800-772-1213 or through your local Social Security office.

If you plan to continue working past the age of 65 and have health insurance from your job, your first step is to ask your benefits manager or human resources department how your employer insurance works with Medicare. In most cases, you should at least take Medicare Part A because it's free. But to decide whether to take Part B or not will depend on the size of your employer.

Small employer: If your current employer (or spouse's employer if it's providing your coverage) has fewer than 20 employees, Medicare will be your primary insurer and you should enroll in Medicare Part B during your initial enrollment period. This is a sevenmonth period that includes the three months before, the month of, and the three months after your 65th birthday.

If you miss the seven-month sign-up window, you'll have to wait until the next general enrollment period, which runs from Jan. 1 to March 31 with benefits beginning the following July 1. You'll also incur a 10 percent penalty for each year you wait beyond your initial enrollment period, which will be tacked on to your monthly Part B premium.

Large employer: If your employer has 20 or more employees, your employer's group health plan will be your primary insurer as long as you (or your spouse if the coverage is from his/ her employer) remain an active employee. If this is the case, you

don't need to enroll in Part B when you turn 65 if you're satisfied with the coverage you are getting through your job. But if you do decide to enroll in Medicare, it will supplement your employer insurance by paying secondary on all of your claims.

Once your employment (or group health coverage) ends, you will then have eight months to sign up for Part B without a penalty. This is known as the Special Enrollment Period.

Drug coverage: You also need to verify your prescription drug coverage. Call your benefits manager or insurance company to find out if your employer's prescription drug coverage is considered "creditable." (Creditable prescription drug coverage is one that is considered to be as good as or better than the Medicare prescription drug benefit.) If it is, you don't need to enroll in a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan. If it isn't, you should purchase a plan during your initial enrollment period or you'll incur a premium penalty (1 percent of the average national premium for every month you don't have coverage) if you enroll later.

Blackjack: How to Bet

I'm going to look at the different ways that recreational players bet when they play blackjack and offer you my opinion on which way is best.

Always Bet Same Amount

A player who always bets the same amount is known as a "flat bettor." Regardless of how much he wins and loses, he always bets the same amount of money (chips) on each hand.

This is a conservative way to bet at blackjack, but most players don't find it very exciting. However, if you have a limited bankroll and you want to get the maximum playtime, flat betting is the way to go. It's easy to calculate your theoretical hourly loss when you flat bet. You simply multiply the number of hands you will play per hour (let's assume 100 hands) times the amount wagered per hand (assume \$10) times the 0.5% house edge (assuming you are using the basic playing strategy accurately), yielding \$5. If you play a total of four hours, you theoretically should lose \$25.

The big advantage of flat betting is that you decrease the swings in your bankroll, meaning you won't win a lot nor will you lose a lot of money in each session. However, even though you will have winning and losing sessions when you flat bet, in the long run your losses will exceed your wins (that's because the house has the mathematical edge).

Betting Progressions

Many recreational players want a little more excitement when they play blackjack so they use a betting progression, meaning they will vary their bets based on the results of the previous hand. Most players use a "win progression" where they gradually increase their bets following a winning hand (say from \$10 to \$20 to a maximum of \$30). Anytime you lose a hand along the progression, you revert to the starting \$10 bet.

First let me unequivocally state that any betting progression will not change the 0.5% house edge one iota. Moreover, when a player uses, say, a \$10-\$20-\$30 win progression, his average bet is no longer \$10 per hand. Yes, sometimes he will be making a \$10 bet, but other times he might be betting \$20 or \$30 on a hand. His average bet will be higher (about \$15 in our example); therefore, compared to the flat bettor (who only averaged \$10 per hand), the progressive bettor will theoretically lose 1.5 times more money (about \$38 over a fourhour session compared to the flat bettor's \$25 theoretical loss).

I don't recommend that player's use a betting progression because they will simply lose more money in the long run compared to flat betting. However, if you are hell-bent on using a betting progression, I'd recommend a very conservative one (like a \$10-\$20 progression). (Better yet, keep reading for the best way to bet at blackjack.)


Only Increase Your Bet When You Have the Edge

This seems like the logical way to increase your bets when you play blackjack; namely, when you know that you have the mathematical edge on the next hand. The question, however, is this: how do you know when the edge swings in your favor during the play out of the shoe? The answer is this: You've got to watch the cards as they are played from one round to the next and only increase your bets when you've seen a lot of small cards (2 through 6) in previous rounds compared to big cards (10, picture cards, and aces). If this sounds like card counting, it is, but before you tune me out listen to what I have to say about it.

There is, and always has been since the 1960s, only one mathematically proven way to gain the edge at blackjack and that is by card counting. However, most recreational players don't have the time or energy to learn a fullblown card-counting system. What I'm proposing is a lot simpler and easier. Learn Speed Count or the Ace-Ten Front Count. You can learn either card counting system in about the same time it took you to learn the basic playing strategy. Moreover, get this: when you use them, you will completely wipe out your theoretical hourly loss by flat betting or using a progressive betting system and replace it with a modest theoretical win every hour you play blackjack. (Meaning, you will have the slight edge when you play blackjack.)

Note: You'll find the details on Speed Count in Frank Scoblete's book, Beat Blackjack Now, and the Ace-Ten Front Count in Fred Renzey's book, Blackjack Bluebook II.

Mega Mistake

A Mega Millions mistake by an office employee paid off for her and 20 of her Ottawa County, Michigan, coworkers. The Bus Busters lottery club won \$1 million in a Mega Millions drawing. David Lantzy, the club's representative, said they pooled their money for lottery tickets, with their boss matching the amount for a total of \$212. But, the woman who volunteered to buy the lottery tickets only purchased Mega Millions tickets, not a mix of Mega Millions and Powerball tickets as the group had planned. It turned out the last ticket she bought matched all five white balls drawn, winning a \$1 million prize. Each member of the group received \$47,600 before taxes. "Everyone's plans for the money is a little different, but I know a lot of folks are looking forward to sharing with family, paying for college tuition, and I wouldn't be surprised to see some new cars in the parking lot at work," Lantzy said.

a lottery ticket when he fell and broke his hip. He was taken to Jefferson Stratford Hospital, where he shared his story with staff members. A physician's assistant invited Livingston to join the hospital's lottery pool along with 141 others. That pool ended up including a winning \$1 million ticket.

Sports Lottery in New Mexico

The board that oversees the New Mexico Lottery voted unanimously to move forward with creation of a game tied to the outcome of sporting events. Details of the game are being worked out, but it will involve a parlay-like wager. A player will pick possible outcomes of at least three sporting events and will have to choose all correctly to win. The move is the first by state government to cash in on a ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court that struck down a federal law that largely prohibited sports betting outside of Nevada. It is estimated the New Mexico Lottery's sports game will generate \$30 million a year, with \$9 million of that going to a lottery-funded tuition assistance program for college students.

What's New in Nevada

IS VEGAS STILL A UFO HOTSPOT?

According to a long-time "UFO watcher" in Nevada, new figures show the Las Vegas area is number two in the nation in UFO sightings. Investigative reporter George Knapp teamed up with a group of reporters from a local television station in compiling the data. During a recent period, there were nearly 640 thought-tobe-credible sightings reported to authorities in the Las Vegas area. By the way, Phoenix was number one, with over 900 sightings.

ARENA ON TRACK

A check of the ongoing construction on the planned massive Raiders' Stadium in Las Vegas shows it's about one-quarter finished, but on schedule. To date, nearly half-a-billion dollars have been spent on Phase One of the construction. The state-of-the-art glass-domed stadium is being built across the Interstate from the Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino; it will also be close to McCarran International Airport. Country Club Hills subdivision of Summerlin, Nevada. The Wynns apparently forked over about \$22-million for the property. The estate was built in 2001 and has been remodeled twice over the years.

VEGAS HOSTS BIG THANKSGIVING PARTY




STEVE WYNN BACK IN THE NEWS

Pounce when **Opponents Telegraph their** Hands

You can take advantage of weak, straightforward players who telegraph the strength of their hands with their bet sizes, and this hand from a \$1-\$2 no-limit cash game is a good example of how to do it.

A player in middle position limped, as did the player in the cutoff seat. Our Hero raised to \$12 from the button with Js 10s.

I'm fine with raising from the button with suited connectors, but calling and raising larger, perhaps to \$16, are also reasonable options. Calling keeps the pot small, often amplifying your postflop advantage (assuming you play well), while raising larger allows you to frequently pick up pots preflop. A bet in the \$8-\$12 range will rarely win the pot preflop, so you often have to flop well to have a good chance to win.

Only the cutoff called Hero's raise, and two players saw a flop of As Qd 8s, which gave Hero a flush draw and double-gutshot straight draw. The cutoff bet \$10 into a pot of \$27.

This is where the player in the cutoff seat telegraphed his hand. When someone leads on a board that should be excellent for the preflop raiser's range, they usually have some sort of marginal made hand or junky draw. Hero's hand made it less likely that his opponent had a draw. More likely, the player in the cutoff seat had a weak ace and was betting to "find

If you think your opponent will fold an ace to a flop raise, then raising large, perhaps to \$50, has a lot of merit. If you think your opponent will never fold top pair, calling makes more sense. That said, when you have a premium draw, taking the aggressive route is rarely wrong, because even when your opponent calls, you'll still win the pot about half the

Hero called. The turn was the 10c, giving hero a pair. Both players checked.

With his opponent's check on the turn, Hero should assume his middle pair is not good (although it will be from time to time when he is up against a junky flush draw like 7s 6s). The real question is whether the opponent will fold an ace to turn and river bets. In my experience, he usually will, as long as you bet large enough. But if you think your opponent plans to call down once he checks the turn, semi-bluffing makes little sense.

The river was the Qd. The opponent bet \$15 into a pot of \$47.

At this point, it was highly unlikely that Hero had the best hand, but could he fool his foe? The opponent almost certainly had an ace or queen. Later on, Hero mentioned that he'd seen his opponent bet small on the river twice with marginal value hands and large on the river once with the nuts. This made Hero think his opponent was much more likely to have an ace than a queen. Hero raised to \$60.

I definitely like raising the river more than calling. When you lose to all the marginal made hands in your opponent's range, calling makes no sense. Hero's only option is to raise or fold. I like Hero's bet of \$60, a substantial amount that had a reasonable chance to induce a fold if the opponent didn't have a queen.

The opponent grumbled for a minute about how lucky Hero was to catch a queen on the river before folding A-2 face-up.



Spaghetti Pie Surprise

I have a crazy request. Have you ever heard of a spaghetti pie? My 10-year-old son, Jimmy, was served a spaghetti pie at a friend's house. Do you have a recipe for this? I want to surprise him with it on his birthday. Thanks. — Georgie from Macon, Georgia

It took a little research, but I found a recipe that looks delicious. It is in a cookbook that has superb recipes. I hope Jimmy likes his spaghetti pie birthday surprise. If I were you, I would make two pies (double the recipe) and freeze one for next time. According to the recipe, the spaghetti pie freezes well. — Annie

SPAGHETTI PIE 6 ounces spaghetti

2 eggs, beaten ¹/₄ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese 2 tablespoons butter 1/3 cup chopped onion 1 cup sour cream

- 1 pound Italian sausage
- 1 6-ounce can tomato paste
- 1 cup water

6 ounces Mozzarella cheese, sliced

Break the spaghetti in half. Cook in a pot of boiling water until done. Drain. While warm combine the spaghetti with the eggs and Parmesan cheese. Pour into a well greased 10 inch pie plate and pat the mixture and around the sides with a spoon. In a small fry plan, melt the butter and sauté until limp. Stir in the sour cream and spoon over the spaghetti. Remove the sausage from the casing, crumble and cook in a skillet until done. Drain. Add the tomato paste and water. Simmer 10 minutes. Spoon the sausage on top of the sour cream mixture. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Arrange the mozzarella cheese on top and return to the oven the cheese melts. Serves 4-6.

Vinegar and Arthritis

Dear Dr. Roach,

I heard that letting vinegar touch your skin causes arthritis. Is there any danger in using vinegar as a cleaning agent? ---- N.J.A.

Dear N.J.A.,

I often get asked whether apple cider vinegar cures arthritis (it doesn't) or can help relieve symptoms (it might, but there is no good evidence that it does), but I have never heard anyone ask about vinegar touching the skin causing internal problems. Vinegar is a mild acid (most are


