For as often as we eat of this bread and drink of this cup let us pray the prayer our Lord taught us.


THE LORD'S PRAYER

Keep watching your email inbox and our website home page for the exact date for the sanctuary move. Right now it looks like the latter part of this upcoming week or even sometime the week of May 18.


With a building that is 121 years old we have encountered a few unexpected problems that have increased our costs. Funds are needed now for us to continue this project.
