NCJW Florida 2018 Ballot Initiatives Voting Guide

Ballot Amendment	NCJW Position
Amendment #1 Increases the Homestead Tax Exemption which could lead to cuts to local services	NO
Amendment #4 Restores voting rights to 1.4 million Florida Citizens	YES
Amendment #5 Requires a supermajority to pass laws on taxes or fees making it nearly impossible to close corporate tax loopholes	NO
Amendment #6 Upsets the constitutional balance between the rights of victims and people accused of crimes	NO
Amendment #9 Prohibits oil drilling beneath waters controlled by Florida and vaping (e- cigarettes) in indoor workplaces.	YES
Amendment #10 Limits home-rule	NO
Amendment #11 Deletes an unconstitutional, anti- immigrant provision and may reduce mass incarceration by allowing criminal justice reforms to apply retroactively.	YES

VOTE YES ON AMENDMENT 4

Currently, 1.4 million Florida citizens are denied the right to vote. This includes more than 10,000 military veterans and 1 in 5 African Americans. Florida is one of only 4 states in the nation with such a lifetime ban on voting.

Amendment 4 would restore the eligibility to vote to Floridians who have completed all terms of their sentences, including probation and parole. This would not apply to those convicted of murder or sexual offenses.

As Jews, we recognize the importance of a second chance, that a person's whole life should not be judged by one mistake. It is only fair that those who paid their full debt to society be allowed to return as full citizens to participate in our democracy.

There are 3 ways to vote in Florida

- Vote-by-Mail: You can request a Vote-by-Mail ballot online, by phone, or by mail from your county Supervisor of Elections Office (SOE) or at http://dos.elections.myflorida.com/supervisors
- Early Voting: Early voting starts between October 22 and October 27.
- Vote on Election Day at your Polling Station: Election day is Tuesday, November 6th, 2018. Polls are open 7 am-7pm.

Do We Need A Miracle?

The Federal Courts and the Second Amendment

December 5, 2018, 5-7 pm Featuring Hannah Shearer from Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence

On January 8, 2011, a gunman attempted to assassinate Congresswoman Gabby Giffords while she was meeting with her constituents at a Safeway supermarket near Tucson, Arizona. Rep. Giffords survived a critical head injury, but six other people were killed that day. Two years later, she started a political action committee to promote gun safety legislation. Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence has become the nation's leading policy organization dedicated to researching, writing, enacting and defending laws and programs proven to save lives from gun violence.

We are excited to welcome Hannah Shearer, Staff Attorney and Second Amendment Litigation Director for Giffords Law Center to speak to us about the role of the federal courts and the Second Amendment. If we manage to get legislation in Florida that puts restrictions

on semi-automatic weapons or public carry of weapons, or requires more background checks,

will these pass muster with the courts? Do we need a "miracle" to make our country safe from gun violence?
