NEWS AND NOTES

Main Office Water Break

Friday, December 23, a broken connection between the main water line and the water line at the Main Office in Amana, home to the Amana Society offices and US Bank, spilled thousands of gallons of water into the basement of the building.

The temperature on Friday, December 23 was a bone-chilling, - 10 F with winds gusting to 30 – 40 mph. Between Thursday, December 22 and Friday, the temperature dropped more than 30 degrees as the blizzard swept into lowa from the west.

When employees arrived early Friday there was about four inches of water in the entire basement of the Main Office. The Amana Society Service Co. quickly shut off the water line and made repairs – meaning they had to dig up a section of the sidewalk and parking area to get at and fix the break.

Carpeting and the lower sections of dry wall and wainscotting were sodden and damaged. Records stored in the basement storage areas were on shelves and were not damaged.

Greg Luerkens, Amana Society President and CEO, shared this from this week's Amana Society employee newsletter, "As many of you may be aware, a water connection underneath the Main Office failed last Friday, December 23rd. A great deal of water surged into the basement of the Main Office, causing significant damage. The Service Company crew, led by William Wolter, rushed to locate the issue and shut the water off. We were very fortunate staff was in the office that morning and Amana Service Company employees were able to get to it right away. William Wolter, Gary Wolter, Mark Struzynski, and Joe Herrmann worked over the weekend in freezing temperatures, then returned on Tuesday to run a temporary water line and make repairs. A permanent fix is scheduled for next week. In the meantime, Dennis Hahn, AJ Benesh and Adam Krotz have been working hard to tear out shag carpets, drywall, and 1970's era wooden paneling damaged by the water. A big thanks to all the employees who helped - and continue to help – with the clean-up and repairs!"



- b. 2022-118. Justin Cohanim Millstream Brewery / 835 48th Ave Amana / HP-I / Install a 32' 2" tall by 10' diameter malt storage bin sitting on a 12' x 12' concrete slab on the north side of the building.
- c. 2022-119. Rosemarie Geiger (PoA Stuart Geiger), Harold Pitz (PoA Lauren Pitz-Fortune), Lauren Pitz-Fortune / 715 13th Ave High Amana / HP-R. Owners issued a Change of Use application.
