Joe recalled Ron Melusky, ODP, asking for feedback from licensing experiences with which provider agencies had disagreement/6500 regulation interpretation. Offering opportunity to provide input to be considered with development of the RCG. Comments can be forwarded to Jen/Alison who Chair/Co-Chair RCG workgroup (created from this years PATH). Tim asked to be copied on these comments when sent to Ron.</li> <li>Room and Board for Lifesharing with Relative. Tim noted Ch. 51 R &amp; B for Residential Services/Lifesharing is required. Provides a paper trail for Social Security. This was on the grid for PID (Policy Issues Discussion). Formal response from Ron pending discussion.</li> </ul>	
Everyday Lives Conference	A few persons were in attendance. Feedback: No workshops/break-out sessions (neg). Closing speaker was great. Tim responded ODP is taking comments into consideration. He will share.	
Rate Changes	Question re: rate change and if agencies have made rate adjustments. Joe reported increases; rate adjustments based on SIS Levels L1 70, L2 80, L3 100, L 4 130 for one-person homes. He noted when a second individual is in the home (lic. for 2) the rates reduced significantly. Question directed to Tim/ODP on how set rates for 1 vs 2-person homes. Tim could not speak to	

PA HCBS Residential Provider Self-Assessment	fiscal question – ODP Fiscal Director is Rick Smith. No one else offered rate adjustment information. There had been discussion at prior regional meeting re: how agencies come up with rates: based on LOC, set rate for Lic. & Unlic., SIS levels Methods varied.  • Question re: ODP's expectations of provider agencies and new rates. Tim - Provider agencies are expected to increase payments to LSP/DSP's.  • SIS discussion:  Ascend can respond to questions re: the assessor, the tool itself but questions re: The Score would be directed to ODP.  In a public forum it was shared by Rick, ODP, that there is an algorithm utilized to come up with the final SIS score. He was not able to share any additional information.  HRC reported when SIS re-assessments were granted and completed initially (CLA) they appeared more accurate, but moving forward when Lifesharing was re-assessed, they have become more skewed. Due to inaccurate scores, rates are not based on SIS scores at this time. Back to seeking clarification on how they are being scored?  Discussion re: SIS and initial communications that this assess. would never have anything to do with money. Provider agencies needing to reassess importance of accuracy of responders and assessors. Tim indicated Kenly Hoats is the ODP contact re: SIS.  Webinar 3/6, Public Comment ended 3/16, anticipated start 4/1 due 5/15. Alerted group to PA HCBS Selfassessment and anticipated release date. Webinar discussion stated the assessment was a one-time assessment. It was to be completed for Lifesharing sites, CPS, CLA, and Day Hab Services. One
