As a non-profit organization, our primary function within the region boils down to three major things:

- 1) Offering recreational circus training programs to the public,
- Facilitating social circus workshops toward marginalized groups and community organizations,
- 3) Putting on integrated arts productions featuring circus talent.

It's been an exciting first year for me on this journey. Last August I obtained an Artistic Residency at the Market Hall Performing Arts Centre, and shortly thereafter put on the first PACA full-length Production, Circus Dreamland, with a talented group of people. The show sold out on November 14th. Following that, I was accepted into the esteemed and rigorous Circus Instructor program at the National Circus School of Montreal, and began developing many pro-

jects and partnering with other organizations. But this is where the Newsletter will come in handy, because there's a lot of work still to do, and It's too much for me to handle by myself. I need your help. And working together, I know there isn't anything we cannot achieve. So check out our upcoming projects and do not hesitate to contact me with any questions!

### P.A.C.A—Social Circus



I'm really excited to talk about Social Circus projects with you guys, because it's been one of my favourite classes at the National Circus School, and it is by far the subject that gets the most devotion in the entire curriculum. Social Circus is a way of approaching social problems through a combination of circus arts and social intervention, and it is one of the three focuses in PACA's mandate (The other two being recreational circus programs and production.) In collaboration with community organizations, the aim of a social circus project is to ensure the development and social inclusion of people at risk, especially youth. In this medium, participants are able to express themselves positively and creatively while honing perseverance, discipline, and self-esteem.

To this end, I am pleased to announce that PACA has solidified its first Social Circus Contract with The New Canadians Centre for this coming July, And we will be teaching two one-week long workshops in a variety of circus disciplines in a way that prioritizes social growth. Social Circus is different from recreational circus in this regard, in that more importance is placed on the experience rather than artistic result.

### P.A.C.A—Social Circus

The Social Circus Program from my curriculum is the same one in use by Cirque Du Monde, a subsidiary social non-profit of Cirque Du Soleil that has been implemented worldwide. Due to the massive undertaking in this project, it is my goal to train paid assistant circus instructors to work in a social setting, under an abridged version of the same program I studied. While my training would not accredit you in the eyes of The National Circus School or Cirque Du Monde, it would certainly make you eligible for work in social projects conducted by PACA.

Eligible disciplines that could typically be taught in a social circus setting include:

- Balancing Techniques—Handstands, Hand-to-Hand, Pyramids, Rola-Bola, Stilts, Tightwire/ Slackline, Unicycle
- Acrobatic Techniques—Acrobatics, Mini-trampoline, Cyr Wheel
- Aerial Techniques—Aerial Hoop, Fixed Trapeze, Rope and Silk
- Juggling/Manipulation Techniques—Diablo, Flower stick, Juggling, Hoop, Poi, Staff,
- Acting Techniques

Tuition for the training is \$100, and will take place over the course of three days: June 18th, 23rd, and 25th. If you have a mastery over one of the above disciplines, a passion for teaching and helping others, I strongly encourage you to enroll in the assistant teachers program. It will not only make you eligible for paid work as an assistant instructor in any of our social programs, but the work itself is very rewarding due to the social impact we will have on our community.

### P.A.C.A—Circus Dreamland REMOUNT!

Last November, we put on our very first full-length circus Production, Circus Dreamland. The project was culmination of lots of hardwork, years of practice, and tireless sacrifice from everybody involved, and the show sold out. Now it is sent to remount 7 months later, June 12-14th, and it'll be better than ever!


Circus Dreamland tells the story of an everyman, Jack. Unremarkable, overworked, underappreciated, and disillusioned with life, the poor man does not have all that much to look forward to. Jack comes home from a typical day of work, exhausted as usual, simply wanting to relax and let the day end. His constantly ringing cell phone is a hindrance, but he does eventually succeed, falling into a deep sleep in which he will have an existential crisis for your benefit.

The Show features Thomas Vaccaro in the lead role as Jack, who performs on Fire Poi, Aerial Silks, and Cyr Wheel. Tessa Nasca and Tegan Moss also perform on Aerial Silks, as well as innovating a very lovely hoop duet. Conrad Jane does an excellent breakdancing set, and Victoria Wood along with Lester Alfonso lead Tyler Dore and Erin Hanes in a psychedelic, Jellyfish UV visual delight. Opal is the Spider Monarch majestically dangling in an aerial thread of subconscious self-doubt, and Special Guest from Toronto, Mark Segal will perform a death-defying rope set that will leave you hanging on the edge of your seat. Rounding out the cast is Patricia Thorne as the ever present, beckoning manifestation of the inner child within Jack, leading him to his hopeful epiphany.
