# CHAPTER 13 OPEN SPACE ZONE

#### **10-13-1: O (OPEN SPACE ZONE)**

The Open Space Zone is specifically intended to encourage the preservation of a natural environment in an otherwise urban setting; to hold for future generations open space in which plants and animals can be protected and studied; to inhibit erection of unnecessary buildings on a flood plain, on areas of severe slope, areas of fault line and rock slides; to provide suitable areas for recreation and relaxation.

Minimum Lot Area	5 acres
Minimum Lot Width	300 ft
Minimum Front Yard Setbacks	30 ft
Minimum Side Yard Setbacks	20 ft each side
Minimum Rear Yard Setback	30 ft
Minimum Building Height	1 Story
Maximum Building Height	35 ft

#### 10-13-2: DESIGNATION OF OPEN SPACE PERMITTED AND NON PERMITTED USES

Table 10-13B sets the designation of permitted and non-permitted uses for the Open Space Zone. If a use does not show up in the table it is considered to be not be permitted in the zones.
