

The Kent J. Riley Charitable Fund Scholarship Program

PURPOSE: The Kent J. Riley Charitable Fund was established in 2014. Kent J. Riley was a scientist who volunteered his time to community youth sports organizations so that all children would have a spot on a team if they desired. The mission of the scholarship is to provide financial assistance to individuals who participated in youth sports and are enrolled in undergraduate study in **STEM, medical or allied health professions**.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE is based on academic performance, participation in youth sports (whether they be town recreation, club or school based) and desired field of study.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS: The Kent J. Riley Charitable Fund awards scholarships on the basis of a comprehensive process. Areas that are reviewed by the committee include, but are not limited to the following: academic accomplishments, participation in sports, personal essay, community service and references. The Kent J. Riley Charitable Fund pays scholarship funds directly to the recipient's school. This is a blind scholarship process and scholarships are awarded without regard to race, color, ethnicity, gender or sexual orientation. Please list your name ONLY on the first page and last four digits of your phone number on subsequent pages. Scholarships awarded are based upon the availability of funds and additional qualifying criteria.

CRITERIA:

- Applicants must have residence status in Lexington, MA or Bedford, MA.
- Applicants must be completing or have completed high school or the previous year in college successfully with a minimum un-weighted GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Applicants must be accepted as a full-time student at a college or university for the upcoming
 academic semester. If scholarship money is awarded, this is the only program that will receive the
 funds on behalf of the applicant.
- Applicants must be a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States.
- Applicants must complete and submit a Scholarship Application by April 12, 2018.

TIMELINE:

- Applications are due April 12, 2018. Applications received after this date will not be considered.
- Applicants are notified if awarded a scholarship by May 15, 2018.

Application Process

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS MUST PROVIDE:

- A completed application form. Illegible forms will not be considered.
- One reference written by the applicant's current or former coach.
- A transcript for consideration. Students may provide a transcript printed from an online school record
 through the prior semester or an official transcript. Awards will be made provisionally pending receipt
 of final grades from spring semester of this year.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS:

- Award notification will be given by May 15, 2018.
- Applicant must provide a copy of their prospective college invoice so that we may mail the check and have applied to the correct account.
