### **AGRICULTURAL EXHIBITS**

Agricultural exhibits will be entered and displayed in the Elementary School gym. Exhibits must be registered between 4 p.m. and 8 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair week with judging on Wednesday morning. All products shown must have been grown by exhibitor during the current year.

Amounts in displays must conform to amounts stated in catalog to be judged. Vegetables displayed should be uniform size, not the largest, except in "Largest" classes. Exhibitors should label exhibit as to variety.

The gym will be closed for viewing during exhibit entry and judging. Judge's decisions are final. Entries may be sliced at judge's discretion. All exhibits must be left in place until 9:00 p.m. Saturday when prize money will be distributed.
