Our year in review by the numbers!! NWSISD continues to have an impact on students, families, and staff in our member districts.

- ✓ We served more than 21,000 students through our magnet school placements, programs, and events.
- Our Multicultural Resource Center impacted more than **39,000 students** who were able to view, experience, and learn about other cultures through artifacts, curriculum, and art.
- We provided **four** magnet schools with Reflection and Review which showcases the positive impact in programing magnet schools have on their students.

## **Leadership Opens Doors to Opportunity**

Northwest Suburban Integration School District hosted their 7th annual Student Leadership Conference on Tuesday, April 25, 2017 at the Crowne Plaza Minneapolis Hotel in Plymouth. This annual conference unites a diverse group of high school students from across the NWSISD collaborative.

Well renowned comedian, actor, and radio personality, Shed G, was again, this year's keynote speaker. Known for his clean, faith-based comedy, Shed brought his

inspiration, wit, and comedy to the conference and also shared his life story with the students. He told students to "clear your mind and have a good mindset on what you want to achieve. Believe in yourself and do NOT let yourself down!"

Students had the opportunity to participate in workshops, competitions, and a college and career fair. Workshops included everything from yoga and power posing, overcoming pressure, understanding your personal leadership type, hands on with police equipment, leveraging diversity and inclusion, as well as how to maximize your opportunities. Students competed against their classmates as well as students from across district borders in competitions such as AVID jeopardy, educational games, college exploration, conference theme development, creative storybook writing, employability skills as well as a NWSISD "Shark Tank!"

Through these interactive events and competitions, the Student Leadership Conference supports efforts to help close opportunity gaps by providing a culminating experience to practice college and career readiness skills with professionals from all over the Twin Cities and beyond.

#### Summer Summit Enjoys 7th Year at University of St. Thomas

NWSISD along with University of St. Thomas Minneapolis Campus (UST) hosted the 7<sup>h</sup> Annual Summer Summit. Over 70 young men from the NWSISD collaborative spent a week at the Minneapolis Campus of UST June 12-16, 2017. This intense educational experience helps prepare just graduated 8<sup>th</sup> graders for high school by focusing on four key educational constructs: Aspirations, Expectations, Opportunities, and Achievement.





Each day started with students gathering in the auditorium discussing the main themes of the day, viewing motivational videos, and then listening to keynote speakers stress the importance of education as a way of maintaining control over one's future. Students then spent the morning participating in classroom activities focused on introspection, learning how culture

shapes expectations, setting goals for their high school careers and creating plans that will assist them in accomplishing those goals.

On the first day of the Summit, students were divided into teams which consisted of students from the varying schools/districts attending. The purpose of placing students together this way was to get them out of their comfort zones, examine commonalities they have with each





other,
and to capture some leadership qualities that
each possess. The teams participated in
competitions throughout the week - including an
"Amazing Race" style event and "Fear Factor"
competition. Students joined in outdoor sports
activities at Loring Park and ended the week with
team presentations and trophy presentation to
the "winning team."

Step-Up students receive additional guidance throughout the year and are involved in mentorship activities during their high school careers.
