Orville Oswald Yackle, 84, of Pigeon passed away suddenly on Friday, Nov. 30, 2001, at Scheurer Hospital in Pigeon. He was born on Nov. 21, 1917, in Pigeon, son of the late Gottlieb and Helena (Kurzer) Yackle. He graduated from Pigeon High School in 1936. On Aug. 3, 1946, he was united in marriage to Hannah Jane Rogers at the Elkton E.U.B. Church. She survives him. In addition to farming the family farm, Mr. Yackle was a drainage contractor.
