Last month I had lunch with the Chief of Police of Colorado Springs. He was about a week away from retirement after a career of 33 years. He said he does not think that being a police officer is viewed as an honorable job anymore. In 1990 they had 2,200 applicants for a force of 800 officers. In 2019 it dropped to 800 applicants. He said that people don't want to be police officers and many families are telling their sons and daughters not to be police officers.

This is a tragedy that will have a negative impact on our country if not corrected. As a ministry we are doing everything we can to encourage police officers and encourage young people to consider law enforcement as a career. We are teaching Christians that God views law enforcement as a
