PARENT PERMISSION LETTER FOR ROAD TEST

If the parent (or legal guardian) of a minor (under 18 years old) cannot bring the minor to their road test, the parent can designate a family member or someone else to bring their child to the road test. The following is required in this situation.

- The person accompanying the minor to the road test must have a current driver's license and be at least 21 years old.
- They must bring a letter from the parent (or legal guardian) who signed for the minor's Level I Learner's License. The following are the requirements for the letter:
 - The letter must give permission for the person to bring the minor to the road test.
 - The letter must include the names (first and last) of the minor, the parent, and the person accompanying the minor.
 - The letter must attest that the minor has driven at least 50 hours on their permit, and at least 10 hours of that must be night hours.
 - The letter must be signed and dated by the parent (or legal guardian) of the minor.
