Meeting Notes: Twelve were present for the meeting. First Beverly Kykendahl showed the cloth for the quilt she is presenting to be raffled at the CWRT Conference. The pattern sections represented symbols of the Underground Rail Road, meant to help guide escaping slaves to freedom in Canada. We are thankful for her work on this quilt and her donation. Her quilt last year raised \$600.

Our guest Speaker from South Bay CWRT, Alan Sissenwien, spoke on "The Two Worst Union Generals: McClellan & Pope." He opined that McClellan did more harm to the Union cause. He was too cautious and too egotistic to recognize his mistakes, over- estimated Confederate Army strength, and did not use wise economy of force assignments.

Pope performed well at Island #10 campaign, mostly because of greatly superior numbers. When transferred to command in Virginia, he boasted bombastically, that in the West, they were used to seeing the backs of the enemy.

This did not endear him to the Union troops in the Eastern Theater. He missed opportunity to defeat ANV by ignoring information on Longstreet's northward movements. His attack orders at 2nd Manassas were disjointed, and resulted in defeat.
