History of the American Flag

The Mother of Invention By Thomas Palchak Fourth in a series

Why the founding Founding Fathers chose stars, stripes, and the red, white, and blue colors for the American flag remains shrouded in history, so too, does the question of who made the first American flag. Most American school children universally assume that Betsy Ross stitched together the first Stars and Stripes in her seamstress shop in Philadelphia. She is credited with sewing thirteen five-pointed stars, aligned in a circle, in the canton along with thirteen stripes. Betsy Ross was indeed, a Philadelphia seamstress who made flags, but a thorough historical review reveals that Elizabeth (Betsy) Griscom Ross sewed the first flag, is a myth.

In 1775 John and Elizabeth Ross opened a small shop on Arch Street in the Commercial District not far from Independence Hall. They repaired furniture and as a seamstress, Betsy Ross performed the upholstery work, and she produced many types of flags. Virtually every historian who has studied the issue believes that she did not sew the first American flag. In fact, the name Betsy Ross was unknown to history until 1870 when her last surviving grandson, William J. Canby published a paper, "The History of the Flag of the United States," and read it before the Historical Society of Pennsylvania in March of that year. He announced that his maternal grandmother made the first Stars and Stripes at the behest of George Washington. The family version of this story was made public when the nation was recovering from the Civil War.

This "tradition" was started when Canby reported his grandmother passed on stories to her children, her nieces, and her sisters. The June 14, 1777 Flag Resolution could find nothing indicating the origin of the Stars and Stripes. The matter was put to rest in 1908, when William J. Campbell, chairman of the Philadelphia's Historic Sites Committee, published a report titled, "The Betsy Ross House: Where Betsy Ross Did Not Design the American Flag," in which he called Canby's Betsy Ross story "a fake of the first water."

Today the consensus among historians is that Betsy Ross undoubtedly made flags, but the earliest evidence she did so was in May 1777, when she was paid fourteen pounds, twelve shillings by a merchant for "ship's colours, &c," which, most likely, was the Continental Colors. In fact, the very first Betsy Ross flags ever made were in the 1870's and sold by the Ross family as small hand-held flags. The question remains, then: Who did sew the first American Flag?

The first design of the flag was done by Francis Hopkinson. He also designed the "Great Seal of the United States", which remains today. The credit of the first flag maker goes to Margaret Manny, who began making jacks and ensigns in December of 1774. She made the Continental Colors, not the Stars and Stripes, for the Alfred and it was raised on the fighting vessel by John Paul Jones on December 3, 1775. Her family still retains the original receipt and date.

Final Notes: On Flag Day, June 14, 1916, when asked his thoughts on the Betsy Ross story, President Woodrow Wilson replied, "Would that it were true."

The U. S. government and organizations such as the National Flag Foundation and American Vexillology Association recognize the Betsy Ross flag as an official American flag, due all the respect and forms of etiquette therein.

Flag Facts

Q: Are flags placed near graves real American flags? What about hand-held flags? What defines an actual flag?

A: To be considered an American flag, the emblem can be no smaller than 2 feet by 3 feet. It must be able to fly from a mast or flag pole. The hand-held flags we wave or place upon the grave sites of our veterans are not American flags. They are classified as "flag decals." Therefore, they need not be retired in the traditional manner and can be thrown away when worn out, soiled, or no longer recognized as our national ensign.
