

108th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 'Building for the Future with Migrants and Refugees

The Readings this Sunday confront us with inequality and divisions in the world. Then- and now- those who are rich and powerful are reminded that God will 'raise up', protect, and uphold the poor and excluded, bringing about an unexpected reversal of fortunes. We are called to reach out in solidarity, respecting, including and caring for our neighbours.

Amos paints a picture of wealthy and uncaring citizens. They live in luxury oblivious to a world that is suffering and crumbling around them. Amos warns that their disregard for the poor and marginalized will have consequences.

The Psalm assures those who are disadvantaged or marginalized of God's love and protection.

Timothy encourages us to be filled with faith and love, to be patient and gentle and to stand up boldly for the truth in front of others.

Today's gospel parable presents to us an aloof unnamed rich character who uses his wealth to support a totally self-centred life-style. He feasts and lives extravagantly on a daily basis with no concern for the destitute, wounded man Lazarus who sits at his gate who longs for a share in the scraps that have fallen from the banquet table to be snapped up by dogs. If the rich are too devoid of conscience, at least the dogs allow Lazarus to share the scraps and even comfort him by licking his wounds. Eventually the rich man will come to the realization- too late- that all honour and status that riches and power bring are worthless in the final analysis. This world's resources after all are for the whole earth community to share.

Lazarus represents 'the poor' whose cry the Lord hears – the common people displaced by poverty, disability, climatic and political disaster and violence. With the model of today's parable and other Scripture references in mind of Jesus' experiences of being born homeless in Bethlehem, the family flight as refugees from genocide to Egypt and His mission as a wandering healer and teacher to all, we are urged to reflect, discuss and act, mindful of our basic Christian tenet "What you did for one of these the least of my brothers and sisters, you did to me!"

The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year's World Day of Migrants and Refugees, is "Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees". As we come together this day let us consider the difficult journeys that people have made and how hard it can be to begin again in a totally different country and cultural insights. Let us welcome them into our lives, listen and learn from their stories and appreciate the faith, gifts and wisdom they bring.

The Pope's message for us today is this:

"If we want to co-operate with our heavenly Father in building the future, let us go together with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees." 2022 Season of Creation Theme: Listen to the Voice of Creation

The Psalmist (19: 1-4) acknowledges that hearing the voice of creation requires a kind of listening that is increasingly rare. Within the ecumenical Christian family, there is a diverse range of traditions to help us recover our capacity to hear the voice of creation. Some of the earliest Christian writings refer to the concept of creation as a book from which knowledge of God can be read.

Like the Psalmist, St. Maximus reminds us that the entire cosmos praises and glorifies God 'with silent voices', and that praise is not heard until we give it a voice, until we praise God in and with creation. St. Augustine writes, "[Creation] is the divine page that you must listen to; it is the book of the universe that you must observe. The pages of Scripture can only be read by those who know how to read and write, while everyone, even the illiterate, can read the book of the universe." Martin Luther wrote, "God has written [the gospel] not only in books, but also in trees and other creatures."


2022 Season of Creation Prayer: Let us pray

Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony.
