"HEALING HEARTS"

by

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EXT. HOUSE - MORNING

Newspaper boy delivers the morning edition of $\underline{\text{The Daily}}$ $\underline{\text{News}}$ to an upper middle-class driveway.

SUPER: "Fall, 2014. The Midwest."

ECU: NEWS ARTICLE reads, "Ebola Outbreak in West Africa."

SUPER: "Inspired by true events."

ANNE, 40s, walks out to retrieve her newspaper. She's a rope-wearing active duty psychologist in the United States Public Health Service.

INT. HOUSE - LATER MORNING

The newspaper rests on the counter as Anne makes pancakes.

Her child PETER, 6, eats pancakes at the kitchen table.

TODD (O.S.)

Anne, have you seen my new blazer?!?

PETER

Dad does this every morning?

Anne smiles at Peter.

ANNE

Peter... Eat your pancakes.

Then, Anne sips coffee from her mug.

PETER

Well, he does.

Anne raises her forefinger and whispers.

ANNE

Shh. You love the smooth.

PETER

You love the rough.

ANNE

That's right.

Enters TODD, Anne's husband, 50s, absent-minded-professor type with anxiety issues.

TODD

My blazer?

ANNE

It's in your closet!

Anne uses a spatula and removes a pancake from the griddle.

TODD

I just checked.

ANNE

Check again. I hung it up there yesterday.

Todd disappears.

Anne heads to her kitchen table and unloads a fresh pancake onto Peter's plate.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Eat.

PETER

Mom?!?

ANNE

Ellie! Your pancakes are getting cold.

Enters ELLIE, 10, bookish girl in glasses.

ELLIE

Mom, I'm right here.

Anne gives Ellie a kiss.

ANNE

Of course, you are.

ELLIE

Why is Daddy in such a fuss?

ANNE

Because he's borderline OCD.

PETER

What?

ANNE

Ohh... Nothing.

Todd from upstairs screams down.

TODD (O.S.)

Found it!

Anne shakes her head and eyes her daughter who looks exactly like her.

ELLIE

Boys.

Anne moves closer to her daughter's face.

ANNE

How's my girl?

Anne brushes a stray curl from Ellie's face.

Ellie hurries by Anne.

ELLIE

Mom!

As Ellie passes Peter, she pinches him.

PETER

Hey!

Ellie draws closer to her younger brother.

ELLIE

What?

PETER

You're evil.

ELLIE

Nope... just your older sister.

PETER

Mom!

ANNE

Ahh, the certainties of sibling rivalries.

Peter gets up and leaves his plate.

Peter and Ellie move to another room.

Anne sees her reflection in the glass.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Good morning, Sis.

She raises her coffee mug in a mock salute.

Todd reappears.

TODD

How do I look?

Anne meets Todd at the sink and adjusts the knot in his tie.

ANNE

Better.

TODD

What would I do without you?

ANNE

You're going to be late.

Reappears Peter and Ellie loaded down with large backpacks.

Anne hands out their lunches.

Ellie hugs Anne.

ELLIE

Thanks, Mom.

Ellie leaves.

Anne is alone with Peter. She bends down to his level.

ANNE

Here you go, Son. PB on white with the edges cut off, as ordered.

PETER

Thanks, Mom.

Peter hugs Anne.

Todd wanders back in.

TODD

Bus is leaving. Do we need to pick up anyone?

ELLIE

Nope.

TODD

Let's do this.

Todd kisses Anne.

The kids rush out.

TODD (CONT'D)

Have a good day.

ANNE

You too.

Through a window, Anne sees her family leave.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Make it a great one.

Anne moves to...

THE LIVING ROOM

The TV is on...

ANNE

Ahh...

She stops.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Where's the remote?

Anne reaches for the remote as the ANCHOR shares.

NEWS ANCHOR

The World Health Organization said Thursday the West Africa Ebola outbreak has killed more than three-thousand people and infected more than sixty-five-hundred.

Anne clicks off the TV.

ANNE

That's not good.

EXT. MILITARY BASE'S HOSPITAL - PARKING LOT - DAY

ECU: car's bumper sticker: "Healing Hearts can make a difference."

Anne's legs blocks the sticker as she crosses. The CAMERA moves with her.

In uniform, Anne walks from her car to her office. She wears her Battle Dress Uniform (BDU).

HAWKE is stenciled over her left breast pocket, with the insignia of a Bald Eagle Clenching Arrows shows to everyone

her rank of Captain. She runs into a fellow active duty psychologist in the United States Public Health Service.

CALLIE, in uniform, early 30s, black, highly educated, and a newbie mother emerges from her minivan.

Anne rushes over to help her.

ANNE

Callie, it looks like you have your hands full.

CALLIE

Anne, tell me it gets easier.

ANNE

What?

CALLIE

Raising kids.

ANNE

I'm afraid it doesn't.

CALLIE

Lie then.

Callie struggles with her breast pump and briefcase.

CALLIE (CONT'D)

Maybe I should just stay home?

ANNE

Trust me, Callie. You would miss the adult interaction and the feeling your part of something bigger than yourself.

Callie stops and smiles at her friend.

CALLIE

Anne, you always know what to say.

ANNE

Occupational hazard.

CALLIE

Happy Friday.

ANNE

You too.

INT. HOSPITAL WARD - LATER DAY

Anne in her white coat makes rounds. She enters a room.

SOUND: KNOCK. KNOCK.

INT. HOSPITAL ROOM - SAME

Anne enters and sees Lieutenant WALL, a fit young solider recovering from losing both of his legs from an IED attack.

All smiles, Wall sits upright in his bed. His covers dip at the middle of the bed where his legs used to be.

WALL

Hey, Doc.

ANNE

How you feeling today, Lieutenant?

WALL

Good, Sir. They're making me some new bionic legs.

ANNE

I heard.

WALL

Yeah. I can't wait to stand up again... and run!

Wall moves his arms in slow motion.

WALL (CONT'D)

Dun-nuh-nuh-nuh.

Anne smiles as she sits on the edge of his hospital bed.

ANNE

Nuh-nuh-nuh.

WALL

Nuh-nuh-nuh. I'm fast, Doc. Woo!

ANNE

I believe it.

 \mathtt{WALL}

I can't imagine a world without running in it. I would go cra....

ANNE

Z-Y.

Anne looks over each shoulder. Then, she leans in and closer to Wall.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Me too. Two days without running and my family are pushing me out the door.

WALL

Yeah. Well, as soon as I get my new legs, I will challenge you to a race.

Anne pops up from the bed.

ANNE

Okay. The first one down the south corridor wins.

WALL

I will even give you a head start.

ANNE

I'm old. I'm going to need that head start.

Wall smiles back big and bold full of hope.

WALL

Thanks, Doc.

INT. ANNE'S OFFICE - LATER DAY

Anne sits opposite a COLONEL, 50s, a spit-and-polish Academy grad with a white buzz cut ten years her senior.

The Colonel looks out the window, not at Anne.

COLONEL

My wife left me.

ANNE

The two of you have been discussing that option for some time.

The Colonel's eyes meets Anne's as he takes his seat.

COLONEL

True. But I never imagined she would really leave me.

ANNE

Why is that?

The Colonel plays with his Academy ring.

COLONEL

I'm not a man that these things happen to.

ANNE

Well, there was broken trust.

COLONEL

True. So?

ANNE

Do you want to talk about this?

COLONEL

No.

Anne shakes her head as she changes the current subject.

ANNE

How's work?

The Colonel brightens and leans back in his chair.

COLONEL

Never better.

INT. ANNE'S OFFICE - LATER

A Marine CAPTAIN in his mid-30s sits and shares.

CAPTAIN

Only four of us came back that night. Four.

ANNE

It's been seven years since that night. You need to move beyond the ambush.

CAPTAIN

How? They trusted me.

ANNE

It wasn't your fault. You and your team were placed in an unwinnable situation. Against a force that greatly out numbered you.

The Captain kicks the table.

CAPTAIN

Shit intel.

You did nothing wrong, but to follow your orders.

CAPTAIN

Tell that to the dead.

ANNE

What you feel is common, especially in war. The counterfactual thoughts that you could have or should have done something differently.

CAPTAIN

But I should've died too.

Anne looks to a framed portrait of her identical sister. The two are embracing near a pond in Central Park.

ANNE

You survived a life-threatening situation... and your sister didn't.

CAPTAIN

Sister?

Anne's iPhone alarm goes off.

SOUND: BEEP 3xs.

ANNE

Captain, next week, we can deal with the demons of outliving those we loved.

The Captain looks at the portrait of Anne and her identical sister SARAH.

CAPTAIN

Your Sister?

ANNE

Yeah. She died in the North Tower of the World Trade Center.

CAPTAIN

Wow. What was her name?

ANNE

Sarah.

CAPTAIN

Yeah.

So Captain, I know the shame, the anxiety, and the...

CAPTAIN

Guilt.

The Captain stands.

So does Anne. She gives him a Motherly hug.

ANNE

We can get through this shit, right?

CAPTAIN

Oorah! to that.

The Captain heads to the door and turns back to Anne.

CAPTAIN (CONT'D)

Thanks, Doc.

ANNE

See you next week.

The Captain nods his appreciation and passes Callie as he goes.

Callie pokes her head into Anne's office.

CALLIE

Lunch?

ANNE

Sure. Ten minutes?

Callie smiles and hosts up her pump.

CALLIE

Make it, fifteen. Momma still needs to pump.

Anne laughs.

ANNE

I don't miss those days.

INT. HOSPITAL CAFETERIA - DAY

Anne and Callie stand before a salad bar.

Anne is loading up her plate with spinach.

Decisions, decisions, decisions.

Callie points at various options in the salad bar.

CALLIE

Yeah. Presidential Unit Citation.

ECU: Chopped Red Peppers.

CALLIE (CONT'D)

Senior Scientist of the Year.

ECU: Carrots.

CALLIE (CONT'D)

And let's us not forget... the Career Achievement Award.

ECU: Tiny Tomatoes.

ANNE

All I see is salad.

CALLIE

Quite a resume, Anne.

ANNE

I've been lucky.

CALLIE

Luck. More like good and driven. How do you find the time?

Anne uses tongs to grab some strawberries and drops them on Callie's plate.

ANNE

I have a great support system. Here. Try these.

CALLIE

Hmm.

Callie picks one off her plate. She looks over her shoulder. Then, she eats it.

As she licks her fingers...

CALLIE (CONT'D)

I heard the Surgeon General wants volunteers for West Africa.

ANNE

Interested?

CALLIE

West Africa? Ground zero of an Ebola epidemic? No.

ANNE

The caregivers there need care too.

Callie eyes Anne. Then, she raises and waves her forefinger.

CALLIE

No! Don't even think about it, Anne.

The two move from the salad bar to pay.

ANNE

What?

CALLIE

Overachieving.

Anne's phone rings. She answers it.

Callie steps back.

ANNE

Sir.

Anne presses her phone to her ear.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Yes, I have seen the news.

Callie eyes Anne as they reach the CASHIER.

ANNE (CONT'D)

I understand. Something needs to be done.

Callie shakes her head as she pays and walks away.

Cashier weighs Anne's salad.

CASHIER

Six dollars.

Anne still listens to the Surgeon General and she hands the cashier her debt card.

ANNE

When does this special task force leave?

(MORE)

ANNE (CONT'D)

(heavy pause)

Sunday? Okay. I'm in.

INT. ARMY HOSPITAL - WOMEN'S RESTROOM - LATER

Anne enters the restroom. She walks down the stalls to make sure no one else is in there.

ANNE

Okay.

Anne walks to the huge mirror that hangs above the sinks.

ANNE (CONT'D)

What do you think, Sis?

INTERCUT BETWEEN ANNE AND HER MIRROR IMAGE

MIRROR ANNE

About what?

ANNE

My mission to Africa.

MIRROR ANNE

Oh, that. Really, girl. What are you trying to prove?

ANNE

I can help people.

MIRROR ANNE

You help people here.

ANNE

True, but...

MIRROR ANNE

But what?

ANNE

I...

MIRROR ANNE

You can't hide from my death forever, Sis.

Anne leans closer to her reflection.

ANNE

Sarah, you know me too well.

MIRROR ANNE

Let me go.

Anne uses her breathe to fog up the mirror.

ANNE

I can't.

INT. MEGA GROCERY STORE - MEAT COUNTER - LATER DAY

Anne inspects the wide choices of meat for their cookout. Her image reflects off the polished glass of the meat counter's case.

Behind the counter, the BUTCHER asks.

BUTCHER

Anything else?

He hands Anne a wrapped package of brats.

Anne grabs them with both hands.

ANNE

What's good for a cookout?

BUTCHER

I know just the thing.

The butcher use a machine to shred beef into hamburger.

ECU: BEEF SHREDS.

BUTCHER (CONT'D)

It doesn't get fresher than this, Miss. Moo.

EXT. BACKYARD - EVENING

Todd's grills brats and burgers as other university PROFESSORS and FAULTY exchange stories.

TODD

I backpacked through Europe and met Burton Holmes, at his Austrian Abbey.

MIKE, 60s, a retiring professor laughs out.

MIKE

B-u-l-l-s-h-i-t.

TODD

I'm serious.

Anne arrives.

As Anne enters the party, the guests look as if she is a Martian from another planet.

Todd stands at the grill and waves.

HANK, 30s, a male chauvinist academic with big bushy beard.

Anne carries meat to grill on a big platter plate to Todd.

HANK

Cute uniform.

ANNE

Hi, guys. I'm a tad overdressed. But I heard you were hungry.

Mike moves closer to Anne.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Congrats, Mike. Where's Sally?

MIKE

Inside. How are you, Anne?

ANNE

Good.

Todd wanders over and retrieves the plate.

TODD

Thanks.

Todd gives Anne a peck on the cheek.

HANK

Anne, what exactly do you do?

ANNE

Help people.

HANK

I know that. What branch? Army? Navy?

MIKE

Anne's a Captain in U.S. Public Health Services.

HANK

The what?

It's a branch overseen by the Surgeon General.

TODD

Focuses on Health.

HANK

Ahh.

ANNE

My Captain status goes back to the service's Navy roots.

MIKE

A Captain in the Navy ranks up there like a Colonel in the other branches.

HANK

Wow. A Colonel. I didn't know women went that high.

TODD

Hank!

ANNE

I will be right back.

As she heads back to the house, she whispers to herself.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Poor Hank. Insecure. Narcissistic. Inferiority complex possible.

INT. HOUSE - MASTER BEDROOM - SAME

Anne changes out of her uniform into some comfy clothes. She passes the bedroom mirror and sees herself in it.

ANNE

Not now, Sis.

Anne plops down on the bed and puts on her shoes.

ANNE (CONT'D)

I still haven't thought how I'm going to tell Todd about Liberia.

Ellie walks by the bedroom door.

ELLIE

Mom's talking to herself again!

Ellie! If you love the smooth, you must...

Ellie pops into the doorway.

ANNE/ELLIE

Love the rough.

ELLIE

Seriously, Mom. I think it's you that needs a shrink.

ANNE

A Psychiatrist.

Anne passes Ellie and lovingly messes up her hair.

ANNE (CONT'D)

You're probably right.

ELLIE

Mom!

ANNE

Who's hungry?!?

EXT. HOUSE BACKYARD - FIRE PIT - LATER

Colorful Japanese lanterns hang overhead. As guests talk and huddle by the fire pit's ample flames.

KIDS with glow-sticks chase Ellie and Peter in the dark.

Todd sees Anne in a chair away from the fire. He sits as he sees shadowy images dance across her face.

Anne smiles back.

ANNE

I think everyone is having a good time.

TODD

What's on your mind, Anne?

ANNE

What?

TODD

You're pondering something.

ANNE

How did you know?

TODD

Your body is all tense. So... out with it.

ANNE

The Surgeon General contacted me today.

TODD

Oh no. Not Lipperman.

ANNE

Yes. He's the acting Surgeon General now.

ממסיד

Anne, our daughter's birthday is a month from now.

ANNE

I know.

TODD

You missed her first because of Hurricane Charley. Her sixth because of Joplin. Now this one because of...

ANNE

Ebola.

TODD

West Africa? Are you f'n kidding?

ANNE

No. I'm leaving Sunday. CDC's has a week-long Ebola Safety Course in Alabama.

TODD

Alabama?!?

ANNE

There I will learn how to properly suit up. Then, Africa. I will be in country until December.

TODD

In country? Anne, you're a psychiatrist. Not a green beret.

ANNE

The caregivers need, and deserve care too, Todd.

TODD

Well. This is great. What about the kids?

ANNE

They know I love them. And I wish to be an example to them. To fight for those in need.

TODD

Fight. Hmm. There must be others willing to go, Anne. You've had your run.

ANNE

Nope. Infectious diseases freaks people out.

TODD

I imagine so. This isn't about your Sis is it?

Todd pops up.

ANNE

No. Why would it be?

TODD

So... your mind's made up?

ANNE

I can make a difference.

Todd heads toward their brightly lit home.

TODD

Well, try making a difference here.

Callie, from the surrounding darkness, plops down in Todd's abandoned chair. She smiles big at Anne.

CALLIE

W-e-l-1? How did it go?

Anne eyes the fire's flames.

ANNE

As expected.

CALLIE

That bad?

ANNE

Yup.

INT. HOUSE - KITCHEN - NEXT MORNING

Todd and Anne sip from their coffees as they watch CNN.

NEWS ANNOUNCER

West Africa is experiencing the largest Ebola outbreak in history. Three-thousand confirmed dead. The virus, which doesn't have a cure, has for months been ravaging a region ill-equipped to fight it. The CDC is organizing an Humanitarian mission.

Todd grabs the remote and mutes the TV.

ANNE

It's my job.

TODD

It's more than that.

ENTERS Peter into the kitchen. His hair is a wreck. With eyes half open he grabs a box of cereal.

ANNE

Do you want to deal with the crisis there, or here?

Todd gets up, pulls a carton of milk from the fridge and places it on the table.

TODD

But Anne...

ANNE

It's three months.

TODD

Yes, at ground zero of an outbreak.

Peter pours milk into his bowl.

PETER

Why are you fighting?

TODD

We're not fighting, Son.

Anne smiles at Peter.

Peter takes a big bite of his cereal.

PETER

(mouth full)

Sounds like fighting.

ANNE

Mommy needs to go away again.

TODD

To help people in need... outside this house.

Peter walks out with his bowl.

PETER

Okay. Bye.

Peter passes a TV.

Anne grabs the remote and un-mutes it.

ANNE

I want to hear this.

Todd gets up.

President Obama speaks about the outbreak.

PRESIDENT OBAMA

Here's the bottom line. Patients can beat this disease. And we can beat this disease. But we have to stay vigilant. We have to work together at every level — federal, state and local. And we have to keep leading the global response, because the best way to stop this disease, the best way to keep Americans safe, is to stop it at its source — in West Africa.

TODD

Five thousand miles away.

Todd walks out of the kitchen.

TODD (CONT'D)

Good-bye.

EXT. ANNISTON, ALABAMA - OLD ARMY POST - DAY

Establishing: Old abandoned army post with World War Two wooden buildings surrounded by tall weeds. Deteriorating roads crisscross the area.

SUPER: "Near Anniston, Alabama, 2014."

A couple desert-camouflaged Humvees parked along with cars, SUVs near an old cinderblock building. A sign reads: "CDC Ebola Safety Course."

INT. BUILDING - TRAINING ROOM - SAME

Windowless room made of cinderblock.

DOCTOR in a white hood, goggles, and yellow hazmat suit.

DOCTOR

Good afternoon folks. You have two patients that we need bloods drawn from.

A suited-up Anne stands beside a BIG BLUE BUCKET on the cold concrete floor. The bio-hazard bucket is labeled 'VOMIT.' In the cot is a plastic mannequin child.

Anne adjusts her headgear.

DOCTOR (CONT'D)

We're all aware that there is a risk and that we must be extremely careful. However, we also know that if we wear the protective equipment properly and follow the protocols. We'll be okay.

EXT. REPUBLIC OF LIBERIA - AIRPORT - DAY

Anne's white U.N. aircraft lands on the runway, parks near a small terminal building.

SUPER: "Republic of Liberia - Roberts Airport - 30 miles from Monrovia."

Anne departs the plane.

On a tarmac a masked military NURSE #1 shouts.

NURSE #1

Form two lines. We need to take your temperature.

Anne gets in line and waits.

Nurse #1 finally waves her over.

Anne reaches her.

NURSE #1 (CONT'D)

You here for business or pleasure?

ANNE

Funny.

Nurse #1 points a device that looks like Sci-fi laser gun at Anne's head. Then, she reads it.

NURSE #1

Normal. You're cleared to get on the bus. Next!

Anne, with her gear, walks toward the awaiting U.N. bus.

INT. UNITED NATIONS BUS - LATER DAY

The bus approaches a makeshift Army barracks. As it travels through the main gate, Anne looks to her reflection in the nearby window.

ANNE

We're here.

MIRROR ANNE

Splendid.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - SAME

As Anne arrives, she sees a colleague she knows waiting for her in front of the camp.

SUPER: "Camp Eason - Monrovia Medical Unit."

Anne grabs her equipment. Then, she slowly gets off with other MEDICAL PERSONNEL.

TED awaits Anne. He's a Thirty-something doc who looks like a Marvel Superhero. He knows Anne from previous missions.

ANNE

Hey, Ted. When did you get here?

TED

Three weeks ago.

Ted helps her with her bags.

ANNE

Over achiever.

TED

How was your ride in?

My teeth are still rattling.

TED

They lack everything here, even decent roads.

Ted turns with Anne's gear and walks through the camp.

TED (CONT'D)

Welcome to M.M.U.

Anne follows.

In the background CREWS of Navy Seabees construct the twenty-five bed facility from the ground up.

TED (CONT'D)

I will show you your tent.

ANNE

Is it always this hot?

Ted looks back to Anne.

TED

Today is cooler than most.

ANNE

Great.

Anne sees a sign that reads, "Camp Eason."

ANNE (CONT'D)

Camp Eason?

TED

In honor of Captain John Eason.

ANNE

The first African American officer in the Public Health Service?

TED

Yup.

ANNE

Good choice.

They reach Anne's tent.

INT. ANNE'S TENT - SAME

The tent holds four cots with mosquito netting.

TED

Home sweet home.

Ted lays down Anne's gear.

ANNE

How many patients?

TED

Too many.

ANNE

I want to see them.

TED

Follow me.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - DAY

Ted gives Anne a tour.

TED

Here's the entrance to the high risk unit.

Anne eyes the red line.

ECU: Red tape barrier.

ANNE

The red tape?

TED

Red zone. Restricted to suspected Ebola patients.

ANNE

I see. The team has done a great deal in a few weeks' time.

TED

We need to do more. We're losing this battle.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - LATER DAY

Ted and Anne suit up. In their hazmat suit, Ted grabs a sharpie and writes in bold black letters, "Anne" on her helmet.

TED

There.

Ted hands the helmet to Anne.

TED (CONT'D)

A name makes us more human.

ANNE

What about you?

TED

They all know me now.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - NIGHT

Close-up of Ebola patient's bloody mouth. Teeth are missing and the gums are red and inflamed.

Ted touches the infected caregiver.

TED

All these people here are nurses and caregivers to the first wave inflicted with the virus.

Fifteen PATIENTS in various stages of the disease line the ward in hospital beds.

Anne walks down the long line of patients. The victims are in various stages of the disease.

Anne's foot hits a blue five gallon bucket.

She peers into it.

ECU: Bloody body fluid.

ANNE

Where are the others?

In awe, Anne looks around and sees the horrors of this epidemic firsthand.

Ted inspects the chart of one of the patients. His eyes glance up from the charts and shares.

TED

Dead.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - NEXT DAY

A suited up Anne carries an Eight-year-old girl with pony-tails, SOE.

Nurse #2 carries a skinny Ten-year old boy with big glasses, SAM.

NURSE #2

These are Dr. Liala's children.

ANNE

Where's the Doctor at?

NURSE #2

He passed this morning.

The four move through the staging area to the restricted Red Zone.

Anne hugs the little girl tighter.

A suited up Ted approaches.

TED

What do we have here?

ANNE

They both tested positive for the Ebola virus.

TED

Where's Dr. Liala?

ANNE

He's gone.

Ted nods.

Nurse #2 hands Sam over to Ted.

TED

I gotchu, dude.

The little boy looks terrified.

TED (CONT'D)

Hi, I'm Doctor Ted. Don't be
afraid. We're here to help. Okay?
You're going to beat this bug.

The boy coughs hard. Then, he melts into Ted's shoulder.

SAM

Okay.

Anne looks down at Soe.

ANNE

What's your name pretty girl?

SOE

Soe.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - NIGHT

Ted and Anne sits in folding cars underneath a canopy of millions of stars.

ANNE

How are Sam and Soe doing?

TED

Time will tell.

Anne looks up to the heavens.

ANNE

Why?

TED

Why, what?

ANNE

This.

TED

We should have been here three months ago.

ANNE

What took us so long?

TED

It takes time to confront an ugly truth.

ANNE

And what's that?

TED

We are all weaker than we think.

Anne examines the starry night and the clarity of Ted's statement.

ANNE

True.

Ted gets up and stretches.

TED

I need to get some rest.

Anne stays seated and watches Ted walk to his tent.

TED (CONT'D)

Tomorrow, Anne. I will show you the Board! Our motivation. It's why we are here.

ANNE

Board?

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - DAY

ECU: The Survivor's Board.

Ebola Survivor's Board in yellow letters on a blue background reads, "Today I Am Healed. Tomorrow I Return to Heal Another."

Ted taps the Board.

TED

This is why we are here. To save lives. To do, good!

Ted grabs Anne's hand and places it over a yellow handprint of a discharged Ebola Survivor.

ANNE

Today I am healed.

The sexual tension grows between them as their bodies lean into one another's.

TED

Tomorrow I return to heal another.

Ted eyes Anne deeply.

TED (CONT'D)

Let's heal those kids.

ANNE

That's why we're here.

TED

That's one of the reasons.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT RED WARD - DAY

Soe crawls out of her bed. Cautiously, she looks around. Then, she darts to her big brother's bed.

SOE

I'm scared.

Sam hugs his little sister as they lie side by side.

SAM

Shh. I'm here.

SOE

For how long?

SAM

Long enough.

SOE

Where's Mommy and Daddy?

SAM

Heaven.

SOE

I want to see them.

SAM

Not yet.

SOE

Why?

SAM

We have each other, right? They're gone now.

SOE

I miss them.

Sam looks around the strange room full of heavy plastic drapes and bright lights.

SAM

Me too.

INT. OFF-BASE LIBERIAN HOSPITAL - NIGHT

Down a long linoleum corridor is a room where Anne comforts a woman CAREGIVER on the brink of a nervous breakdown.

CAREGIVER

I watched everyone of them die. First the old. Then the young.

ANNE

How well did you know these people?

CAREGIVER

They were from my village. People I grew up with. Now they're all gone.

ANNE

You did all you could for them.

CAREGIVER

Did I?

ANNE

It's okay to grieve.

CAREGIVER

I have no tears left.

The woman reaches for a cup of coffee.

CAREGIVER (CONT'D)

Not even for my Sister.

Anne reflects on this.

ANNE

I lost my Sister too.

CAREGIVER

From Ebola?

ANNE

No. From hate.

Anne takes a big sip of her coffee.

EXT. COLLEGE CAMPUS - DAY

Students traverse the Quad on a picture perfect Fall day.

INT. FACULTY ROOM - SAME

Todd pours himself a cup of coffee. Then, he wanders over to a chair next to Hank.

TODD

Hank, I failed at what other's thought I should be until I found teaching.

HANK

Do you think we are really making a difference with these kids?

TODD

Sure.

Hank eyes Todd hard.

TODD (CONT'D)

I would say most. But not all.

HANK

I always wanted to teach. But anymore I can barely get through my lectures.

TODD

Why is that?

HANK

There is no engagement at all. It's like I'm not even there.

TODE

Well, the Russian Revolution is not for everyone.

HANK

How do you do it? Get them talking?

TODD

I treat them like equals. Some deserve it. Others don't. But the main thing, I never lecture them. I begin conversations. And see where that goes.

HANK

Any word from Anne?

TODD

No.

INT. TODD'S OFFICE - DAY

Crammed space full of books, papers, and film canisters. Todd gazes out a window at colorful trees.

After a moment, he looks down at a photo of Anne.

TODD

I miss you.

Then, Todd returns to grading papers.

One of his students, TABATHA, appears in the doorway.

TABATHA

Knock. Knock.

Todd looks up.

TODD

Oh. Hi, Tabatha. Office hours aren't until four.

Todd gets up and greets her.

Tabatha comes in.

TABATHA

I know.

She moves closer into Todd's personal space.

TABATHA (CONT'D)

Professor, you're so différent from everyone else.

TODD

I'm afraid I'm not. So, what's
this about?

She purrs and whispers into Todd's ear.

TABATHA

Extra credit.

EXT. HOUSE - DRIVEWAY - DAY

Ellie places her hand in the mailbox and pulls out a postcard from her Mother. She runs inside.

INT. HOUSE - KITCHEN - DAY

Todd catches Ellie as she caroms into him.

TODD

Hey. What's the hurry?

ELLIE

A note from Mother!

TODD

What does it say?!?

Ellie stares at the image of her Mother.

ELLIE

It's a picture of her room.

TODD

Read it to me, dear.

Ellie cups the postcard in her hands.

ELLIE

Okay... Dear Todd, Ellie...

CLOSE-UP: Postcard of Anne in her tent.

ANNE (V.O.)

And Peter. Here you can see me in my room in Liberia. I'm glad I have the mosquito bed net because there lots and lots of bugs here! Once I crawl inside I do not have to worry about mosquitoes, spiders, or giant beetles! I miss you all and cannot wait to see you in a few more weeks. I love you! Mom. P.S. Met a little Liberian girl and boy your ages. They're fighting for their lives. I know we can help them. Save them.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - DAY

Team of SCIENTISTS wear yellow hazmat suits. The group travels beyond a red line on the floor that marks the boundary between the high-risk zone and the low-risk zone.

They move through the...

CHEMICAL SHOWERS then to the ...

SECURE ROOM.

Anne removes her headgear and visor.

Ted does the same.

TED

I think the containment is working.

ANNE

Finally.

Ted washes his hands.

TED

What are you doing tomorrow?

I'm off. Nothing.

TED

Let's explore. The beaches here are spectacular.

ANNE

Why not?

EXT. COASTLINE ROAD - DAY

Ted drives an open top Humvee fast along the coastline road high above the Atlantic Ocean. He eyes Anne. Her image reflects off his Ray-Bans.

Anne smiles back.

Then, Ted shifts down to a lower gear, the Humvee's engine ROARS.

Anne HOWLS in delight.

EXT. SHORELINE BEACH - DAY

Vibrant blue water, white capes, and a long pristine sandy shoreline void of people except Ted and Anne. In the distance is their Humvee.

Ted and Anne, in a T shirts, shorts, and shades, walks along the sand.

TED

Shame we can't swim.

ANNE

Sharks?

Ted moves closer to Anne.

TED

More the undertow.

ANNE

Oh.

Anne turns her head at the last minute.

ANNE (CONT'D)

We should be getting back. I want to see how Sam and Soe are doing.

Ted walks back to the Humvee.

Okay. Next time.

INT. M.M.U BIO-CONTAINMENT RED WARD - LATER

A suited up Anne approaches Sam and Soe's beds.

The small children look so tired and weak.

ANNE

How's my favorite patients doing today?

SOE

Tired.

SAM

Hot.

Anne looks at the Nurse #3 covering the ward.

ANNE

How's their fevers?

Nurse #3 shakes her head.

SAM

I'm burning up.

Anne grabs a cold rag and towels Sam's face.

ANNE

Better?

SAM

Yes. Thank you.

Sam falls asleep.

Anne rubs his back with her gloved hand.

ANNE

Sleep well. Give the medicine time to work.

Anne moves to Soe's bed.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Hi, sweetie.

SOE

Why does God let good people die?

I don't know.

SOE

The medicine didn't help my parents.

Anne sits on the edge of the bed.

ANNE

We got to them too late, dear one. But your parents saved others... didn't they?

SOE

Yeah, but not themselves. Why is that?

ANNE

Heroes in real life, sometimes die.

SOE

But why?

ANNE

I wish I knew.

SOE

Miss Anne.

ANNE

Yes, Soe.

SOE

My tummy hurts...

Soe vomits blood all over Anne. She cries and gags on her vomit.

Anne takes a moist rag and wipes Soe's face clean.

ANNE

There, there, baby. Is okay. It's going to be okay.

Nurse #3 comes over and helps Anne clean up. She gives Anne a worried look through her visor.

SOE

Promise?

Anne smiles big at Soe.

Yes... I promise.

Nurse #3 uses a towel and wipes Soe's brow.

NURSE #3

Anne. You better wash up.

ANNE

I will.

Anne smiles down at Soe.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Get some rest, Soe. I will be back later.

Soe rolls over.

SOE

Okay.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - NIGHT

Anne sits in a folding chair opposite a NURSE #4 that is struggling to come to terms what she has experienced.

NURSE #4

They have so little. And this virus strips them of everything. Even their dignity.

ANNE

We're making a difference. Little Soe and Sam will beat this.

NURSE #4

I hope so. But there's only three handprints on our Survivor's Board.

ANNE

That's better than zero.

Nurse #4 starts to cry.

NURSE #4

There needs to be more.

ANNE

There will be.

INT. HOME - KITCHEN - DAY

Todd and Ellie sits at the kitchen table for lunch. They watch the news on CNN.

NEWS ANNOUNCER

Today, a health care worker from Dallas was transferred to Emory University Hospital in Georgia for treatment after contracting the Ebola virus while helping to treat Thomas Eric Duncan, the first patient to have the disease in the U.S.

Phone RINGS.

The number says, "Mommy."

ELLIE

Mommy!

TODD

Wait. Wait.

Todd holds off his daughter and answers it.

TODD (CONT'D)

Anne?

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - DAY

Anne walks around a tiny circle with her iPhone in hand attempts to get the best coverage.

INTERCUT BETWEEN TODD AND ANNE

ANNE

Hi, everybody!

TODD

Anne, you don't sound good.

ANNE

I'm fine. I just need sleep.

TODD

Well, I'm worried sick.

Anne sees Ted approach with a bottle of wine, holds up her hand, and he backs off.

I don't have much time, Todd. How are the kids?

TODD

Good. I'm not?

ANNE

What's wrong?

The call drops.

TODD

I miss you. And there's a student that... Anne, you there?

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - NIGHT

Ted approaches Anne.

ANNE

It cut off.

INT. HOUSE - KITCHEN - DAY

Todd hangs up.

TODD

Great talk, Anne.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - SAME

Ted approaches Anne with the wine hoisted high in the air.

TED

Anne, you need a break.

ANNE

Okay, but I feel so tired.

Ted reaches into his pocket and withdraws a prescription bottle of pills. He shakes the bottle.

TED

These might help?

Anne grabs the bottle of pills.

ANNE

Desoxyn?

Sleep is over-rated. There's work to be done.

Anne hands the bottle back to Ted.

ANNE

Ted?

Ted grabs them back.

TED

I'm a big boy, Anne.

ANNE

Be careful.

TED

I will.

EXT. COASTLINE BEACH - SUNSET

The Humvee parks in the tide as a huge orange sun sets into a vast the blue ocean.

Behind the wheel, Ted stares at the murky horizon.

TED

There it is. Going. Going.

ANNE

Gone.

TED

Ready to head back?

ANNE

I need a swim.

TED

A swim?!?

Anne heads into the water, takes off her top and pants.

TED (CONT'D)

What about the undertow.

ANNE

I will take my chances.

Anne, in her bra and panties, dives in.

Ted hurries into the water to join her.

Wow! This feels great.

ANNE

It does.

Ted sheepishly looks around.

TED

I hope there are no sharks.

ANNE

Besides you.

Ted swims closer to Anne.

TED

Duuuunnnn duun... Duuunnnnnnn dun.

Anne splashes Ted.

ANNE

Stop that.

EXT. BEACH - NIGHT

A campfire illuminates a still soaking Ted and Anne.

Ted looks beyond the fire, out to the dark ocean.

ANNE

Survived the undertow.

TED

I was more worried about the sharks.

ANNE

Yeah.

Anne looks at Ted and smiles.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Ted?

TED

<u>Yes</u>.

ANNE

Why did you volunteer for this?

TED

To drive my folks crazy.

Seriously?

TED

I am serious. Both my parents are doctors. They work eighty-hours a week, not for the good of it... just for the lifestyle.

ANNE

No other reason?

TED

Maybe.

(clears throat)
I'm sure you husband loves the idea of you being five thousand miles from home. Why are you here?

ANNE

Me... I'm here for the beaches.

TED

Seriously, Anne. You have been acting funny all week.

ANNE

Yeah, Nine-Eleven. I can never escape it.

TED

Did you know someone that was killed?

ANNE

My Sister. My twin.

TED

Wow. I didn't know?

ANNE

How could you. She died so young.

TED

What happen?

ANNE

Life happens. You go to work one day, and you just don't come back.

TED

Do you want to talk more about it?

ANNE

Yes.

EXT. BEACH - LATER NIGHT

Anne rests against Ted as the campfire embers burn low.

ANNE

Sarah died that morning. I didn't even get up to say good-bye.

TED

Don't.

ANNE

What?

TED

It wasn't your fault.

ANNE

No, I guess not. But... I married the man my Sister loved. Hmm, at the time, it seemed to be the right thing to do.

TED

Sarah and Todd?

ANNE

Yes. After she died, we leaned on one another to get through our days.

TED

Do you love him?

ANNE

Yes. As a woman loves the Father of her children.

 \mathtt{TED}

Anything more than that?

ANNE

I don't know. There are moments. We love our kids.

Anne gets up.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Hmm... Ted, Ted, Ted, Ted.

TED

What?

Trauma brings out the darnedest things.

Ted moves closer.

TED

Does it.

ANNE

Let's head back.

TED

You sure?

Anne gently pushes Ted back. Then, she looks up at the star-filled sky.

ANNE

Perfect setting. Hmm. Now... before I do something I will enjoy... but regret.

TED

Okay. We'll go.

Ted chases Anne a bit.

TED (CONT'D)

Duuuunnnn duun... Duuunnnnnnn dun.

ANNE

Grown man that acts like a child. Possible Peter Pan Syndrome.

Anne uses her towel to strike him.

TED

Hey!

ANNE

Sorry, occupational hazard.

TED

You must be a lot of fun at cocktail parties.

ANNE

Ted... we're all broken.

Anne eyes Ted.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Just some of us are better at hiding it.

TED

Yeah.

ANNE

To stay alert. You need to switch to coffee.

TED

I know.

EXT. COASTLINE ROAD - LATER

Ted drives the Humvee in silence with the high beams on.

TED

Anne? You okay?

Anne is by his side. She tears up.

ANNE

Am I a terrible person?

TED

No.

ANNE

You sure?

TED

Yes!

Anne leans on Ted.

ANNE

Thanks. Sometimes I worry...

TED

You running away from something, Anne?

ANNE

Yes... Myself.

INT. ANNE'S TENT - LATER

Anne calls home with Ted's satellite phone.

ANNE

Be home. Please, be home.

SOUND: RING 2xs.

INT. HOME - KITCHEN - NIGHT

Todd's phone RINGS on the kitchen table as he cooks dinner.

TODD

Anne?

INTERCUT BETWEEN TODD AND ANNE

ANNE

Todd.

STATIC starts.

TODD

Whose phone is this?

STATIC gets louder.

ANNE

Ted's. He has a satellite phone.

The call drops on Anne's end.

TODD

Ted's?!? I didn't know he was there.

The call drops on Todd's end.

TODD (CONT'D)

Great.

Peter comes into the kitchen. He wears soccer gear.

PETER

Hey Dad. I'm late for soccer.

TODD

Tonight?

Ellie strolls in.

ELLIE

Dad, can I go to Megan's house?

TODD

Tonight, we are having dinner together.

PETER

Dad, practice.

TODD

Just a second.

Todd searches for his car keys in the other room.

ELLIE

Dad! Dinner!

Food burns on the stove top, in the case iron skillet.

Todd re-enters the kitchen.

TODD

Wonderful.

Todd grabs the hot skillet bare-handed and SCREAMS.

TODD (CONT'D)

Hot! Damn it, Anne!

Todd tosses the skillet in the sink. BANG!

Peter and Ellie turn and look at another in silence.

TODD (CONT'D)

Ted.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - DAY

In the Red Zone, a suited up Anne visits Soe and Sam.

Soe's bed is empty. It is made up with fresh clean sheets.

Sam stands like a salute before it. He looks at the emptiness of it, not at Anne.

ANNE

Soe!?!

SAM

Gone.

Anne rushes to Sam.

ANNE

Gone?!?

No nurses are around for Anne to speak to.

Sam stares at the other patients, all fighting off death.

SAM

We're next.

Did her fever break?

SAM

No.

Nurse #3 enters the Red Zone. Sees Anne in a panic near Sam. She guides Anne away.

NURSE #3

Anne, I'm sorry. Soe...

Beyond her visor, tears run down Anne's cheeks.

ANNE

She was so young.

Nurse #3 nods.

NURSE #3

She passed this morning.

Anne's knees buckle.

ANNE

I promised...

NURSE #3

We did all we could.

SAM

They tired. But Soe wanted to see Mommy and Daddy more.

ANNE

Where is she now?

SAM

They took her away.

NURSE #3

Anne, you know the protocol.

Sam collapses a bit.

Nurse #3 returns him to his bed.

In a daze, Anne wanders off.

ANNE

I need to breathe.

Ted appears. He escorts Anne to safety.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Little Soe is...

TED

Okay. I have you.

ANNE

I need air.

Anne reaches for her head gear.

TED

No! You need to decontaminate, first.

ANNE

Can't breathe.

Ted escorts her to the exit.

INT. M.M.U CHEMICAL SHOWER - LATER

Anne stands still as the chlorine shower strays down over her. This is when she weeps.

Ted stands beside her.

TED

Let it all out.

Anne nods.

FADE TO BLACK:

INT. TODD'S CLASSROOM - DAY

Todd, in a dark room, stands before his students. White lights illuminate his face.

TODD

Class. Today, is Nine-Eleven.

Todd writes, "9/11/01" on the whiteboard.

TODD (CONT'D)

A time when most of your were only toddlers.

Todd steps closer to his class.

TODD (CONT'D)

Therefore, today's lecture shall come from you.

TABATHA

What?

Todd looks at Tabatha.

TODD

Explain the importance of this date to me as if I'm an alien from outer space. Some one with no emotional attachment. To get you in the proper frame of thought, I crafted a brief montage of that day. Lights! Action!

EXT. TWIN TOWERS - PRISTINE MORNING - 9/11 MONTAGE

Defiant and undamaged, the towers encompasses the sky.

Begins footage of videos from News Agencies and New Yorkers on the streets.

Then, the first plane strikes the North Tower.

EXT. STREET LEVEL - SAME

Amateur video: smoke pours out of the North Tower.

CAMERA WOMAN

Oh, my god. Oh, my god. Oh, my god.

BYSTANDERS scream "No, no, no."

SOUND: SIRENS.

EXT. STREET LEVEL - SAME

Races the first RESPONDERS: police cars, ambulances, fire trucks to The World Trade Center with their SIRENS on.

INT. BREAKING NEWS STUDIO - SAME

Appears a frazzled NEWS ANCHOR behind his desk. Live footage appears over his shoulder. News streams at the Bottom: "A plane has crashed into the World Trade Center."

NEWS ANCHOR

A plane has...

Over his shoulder, a plane flies into the South Tower.

NEWS ANCHOR (CONT'D)

Impossible.

EXT. STREET LEVEL - SAME

Amateur video: flame bellows out of the South Tower. Then, each tower collapses.

WALLA

No.

New Yorkers' shocked reactions. Disbelief covers the crowd's faces.

Then, a cloud of white smoke rushes down the street like an avalanche of ash.

WALLA (CONT'D)

Run!

The masses seeks shelter as they run towards the CAMERA.

A white clouds WHOOSH.

Recorded cellphone message starts as the entire screen is a gritty white ash.

FEMALE HOSTAGE (V.O)

Listen, honey. You've to listen.
I'm on a plane that has been
hi-jacked. I don't have much time.
Tell the girls I love them.
(tears)

Tell them, Mommy loves them.

EXT. SOMERSET COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA FIELD - DAY

Flight Ninety-Three crash site.

SOUND: WIPING WIND.

INT. OVAL OFFICE - NEWS FOOTAGE

President Bush addresses the nation.

PRESIDENT BUSH

Good evening. Today, our fellow citizens, our way of life, our very freedom came under attack in a series of deliberate and deadly terrorist acts.

(MORE)

PRESIDENT BUSH (CONT'D)
The victims were in airplanes or
in their offices: secretaries,
business men and women, military
and federal workers, moms and
dads, friends and neighbors.

EXT. 9/11 AFTERMATH - SAME

A twisted metal beam of the remains of the North Tower sticks up and out into the sky. At its base, is a memorial of sorts, with flowers, cards, and mementos of those who perished on that autumn day.

CUT TO CLASSROOM:

INT. TODD'S CLASSROOM - SAME

Todd's montage ends with a photo of Sarah with white text, "For Sarah."

His classroom is in utter silence, they have been moved. Todd flips on the lights.

DAVID, another student, sits next to Tabatha.

TODD

David, let's start with you. What can we learn from that?

Tabatha stands up and moves to the image of Sarah. She touches Sarah's face.

DAVID

Dr. H. Isn't this your wife?

TODD

Nope. Her Sister.

Tabatha turns.

TABATHA

Twins.

TODD

Identical.

PETER

Did Sarah die that day?

TODD

Yes. She did. When the North Tower collapsed.

Todd turns.

TODD (CONT'D)

Her remains like so many others that day, were never discovered.

Tabatha tears up.

TABATHA

Bastards.

TODD

David... share your thoughts with the class.

David sits in silence.

EXT. COLLEGE BAR PATIO - NIGHT

Todd sits alone at a outdoor table. A string of lights dangles in the background. As he stares up at the stars, he hears.

TABATHA

Is this seat taken?

TODD

Be my guest.

TABATHA

Your montage moved me.

TODD

Yeah. In a tribute to some one I cared about.

TABATHA

Sarah?

TODD

Yes.

TABATHA

What was Sarah like?

TODD

Very much like you.

TABATHA

You shouldn't compare people.

TODD

Why?

TABATHA

Nothing kills joy quicker than comparison.

TODD

Twain?

TABATHA

Yup, when you start comparing yourself to others. You think you are better or worse.

TODD

Hah. And both of those are ego issues.

Tabatha leans closer to Todd's face.

TABATHA

The reality is everyone has their strengths.

TODD

And weaknesses.

TABATHA

Walk me home.

Todd struggles for a moment.

TODD

Not tonight.

Todd laughs.

TODD (CONT'D)

You find your own way home.

She flirts.

TABATHA

Too bad.

TODD

Good night, Tabatha.

TABATHA

Good night, Dr. H.

INT. SCHOOL BUS - EARLY MORNING

Anne returns from a night shift at a local hospital.

The bus is half full of other medical PERSONNEL. Most are asleep. Not Anne. She stares out as daybreak comes.

Images: Rubble and Ruins.

Fellow Liberian PASSENGER leans over to Anne.

PASSENGER

Remainders of our civil war.

ANNE

WOW.

PASSENGER

Yes. Wow. It battles claimed over two-hundred-thousand lives.

Anne watches small children playing in the rumble. Then, she see a few carrying blue buckets on their head.

PASSENGER (CONT'D)

Water. Each day we need to walk miles to wells to fill them.

ANNE

I can't relate.

PASSENGER

I know.

ANNE

You have so little.

PASSENGER

Yes. It's hard to comprehend. But things will get better.

The passenger leans back and closes her eyes.

PASSENGER (CONT'D)

They always do.

Anne leans closer to the window, and sees her own reflection.

ANNE

Why am I here?

Her Sister does not appear. She rests her head against the glass window and falls asleep.

BEGINNING OF DREAM SEQUENCE:

EXT. WORLD TRADE CENTER - DAY - STOCK FOOTAGE

Against a clear blue sky, American Airlines Flight Eleven from Boston heads to its final destination, infamy.

The plane accelerates as it closes in on the North Tower of The World Trade Center.

SOUND: THE WHINE OF A JET ENGINE.

INT. AIRPLANE - AMERICAN FLIGHT ELEVEN - SAME

Tearful and sicked TRAVELERS hold their heads down as HIJACKERS walk the aisle.

EXT. WORLD TRADE CENTER - SAME

Closer and closer, the jet comes to the structures shiny sun reflecting windows.

SUPER: "September 11th, 2001. 8:44 a.m."

INT. WORLD TRADE CENTER - 95TH FLOOR - SAME

Anne, in business attire, walks down a long line of office cubes. She stops at the last one near the windows that reads, "Sarah Wagner."

ANNE

Sarah?!?

Appears a COWORKER #1.

COWORKER #1

Hi, Sarah!

Coworker #1 disappears into his cube.

Enters COWORKER #2.

COWORKER #2

Sarah?

Anne looks around for her Sister.

ANNE

Where?

COWORKER #2

How about lunch today? My treat. I finally closed the Anderson deal.

Anne looks out the window and sees an airplane approaching the tower. She grabs her coworker.

ANNE

Run!

COWORKER #2

What?!?

The plane draws closer.

ANNE

I said, run!!!

Anne does and races across the floor.

The coworker watches Anne then she turns to the window and sees the nose of an airplane where the sky is suppose to be. She looks puzzled.

COWORKER #2

What the f...

At high speed, it collides into the North Tower.

SOUND: CRASH OF BROKEN GLASS.

IMPACT!

INT. WORLD TRADE CENTER - 95TH FLOOR - SAME

The craft's fuselage plows through the North Tower intact. Then, the hull slows as it grins to a halt.

Overhead, within it's wreckage, strobes fluorescent tubes, on and off. Each snapshot captures a horrific imagine of twisted metal, blown out furniture, knocked over file cabinets, and bodies. Lots and lots of bodies.

Here, among them, a single coffee mug lays on its side. Its steamy contends circles the cup.

The cup reads, "I Love N.Y."

Beyond the cup, a pair of black designer stilettos stick out from an avalanche of white fallen ceiling tiles. The woman attached to the shoes appears dead.

Insert a steady AIR SUCKING SOUND, as if the tall building inhales a deep dying breathe.

Instantly, from the far corners of the room a storm cloud of white fine dust begins to obstruct our view as jet fuel GURGLES out from the destroyed plane's tanks.

SOUND: GLUG. GLUG. GLUG.

Slowly, Anne stirs. She struggles as she pushes aside the ceiling tiles.

ANNE

What happened?

Ominously, across the wide floor, an exposed wire BUZZES and SPARKS. Anne sees it.

ANNE (CONT'D)

No. No. No.

She backs away from it.

ANNE (CONT'D)

This can't be happening.

The long electric wire dances before her as the aviation fuel ripples closer and closer.

Anne tears up as she watches the wire.

ANNE (CONT'D)

S-a-r-a-h.

KA-BOOM!

END OF DREAM SEQUENCE:

INT. SCHOOL BUS - SAME

Anne awakes as the bus stops. She stares at her own reflection.

ANNE

Why am I here, Sis?

MIRROR ANNE

Only you know the answer to that.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - RED ZONE - NIGHT

Anne checks in on Sam. She sees a Nurse #3 approach.

Sam looks terrible.

ANNE

How is he doing?

Nurse #3 shakes her head.

NURSE #3

His vitals are bad. And he's still burning up.

ANNE

How's his blood pressure?

NURSE #3

Stable.

ANNE

That's good.

NURSE #3

It's a bad bug.

Anne sits and grabs a wet sponge to cool Sam.

ANNE

Yes, it is.

Anne wipes at Sam's face.

ANNE (CONT'D)

I hate that I can't touch him.

NURSE #3

He's highly contagious.

ANNE

I know. Still.

Anne sponges Sam's face more.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Keep fighting, Sam. Keep fighting.

EXT. HIKING TRAIL - DAY

Late fall leaves are down and their colorful remains litter the trail. Together Todd and his children enjoy a Sunday afternoon hike.

Peter carries two toy bows across his shoulders and large plastic dagger in one hand. He runs ahead of the others.

PETER

For Gondor!

TODD

Go get him Legolas.

ELLIE

More like Frodo.

Todd laughs and looks down as his child that reminds him so much of his wife, Anne.

ELLIE (CONT'D)

Dad.

TODD

Yes, cutie.

ELLIE

Why does Mom always have to leave?

TODD

Work, honey.

ELLIE

I know. But it was my birthday.

TODD

She bought you gifts.

ELLIE

Yes. Like last time. But I just want her here. That's the present I wanted.

TODD

I understand dear. But she is helping others.

ELLIE

I know. But she's never around when I want her to be.

Todd looks down at her and pats her on the head.

TODD

She will be back before you know it.

ELLIE

You think she misses us?

TODD

I hope so.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - RED ZONE - DAY

A suited up Ted watches over Sam. His body fights the disease.

Sam opens up his eyes.

Ted! He's awake.

Ted rushes over.

TED

Hi, Sam.

Sam stares up at the intravenous.

TED (CONT'D)

Medicine.

Sam nods and drifts back asleep.

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - RED ZONE - LATER DAY

Anne enters the Red Zone. She passes patients at various stages of the disease. Then, she reaches Sam's bed. It is unoccupied.

ECU: Sam's bed empty with crisp clean sheets.

Anne rushes to it.

ANNE

No. No. No!

Anne sees no nurses around. She stares at the other patients, all near death.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Not Sam too? Why, God? Why?

Anne weeps and she rests her head against Sam's bed.

Nurse #3 enters the Red Zone. She goes to Anne and gently touches her shoulder.

NURSE #3

Anne...

Anne looks up.

NURSE #3 (CONT'D)

We are going to have one more hand print for the Board!

ANNE

Sam?

Nurse #3 nods.

Anne SHRIEKS! as she pops up.

NURSE #3

His fever broke this afternoon.

ANNE

And the Ebola?

NURSE #3

Gone. The meds worked.

ANNE

Where is he?

INT. M.M.U. EBOLA FREE WARD - NIGHT

Sam looks much better.

Anne is by his side as his eyes open.

ANNE

Ted. He's awake.

Ted hurries over.

TED

Hi, there.

SAM

Where am I?

TED

With friends. Do you remember getting sick?

Sam looks away.

SAM

They're all dead aren't they?

Anne fights back tears.

SAM (CONT'D)

My Mother. My Father. Soe.

ANNE

Yes.. but you beat it.

EXT. M.M.U. HOSPITAL TENT - DAY

An exhausted Anne emerges from the hospital tent.

Ted approaches her.

Off duty?

ANNE

Just now.

TED

Tired?

ANNE

I'm beyond that.

Ted smiles hard as he reaches into his pocket.

ANNE (CONT'D)

I don't want...

Ted pulls out his keys and dangles them before Anne.

TED

One last trip to the beach?

ANNE

Why not?

EXT. COASTLINE BEACH - DAY

In a S-shape fashion, Ted drives at high speed his Humvee down a pristine beach. As sand kicks up, Anne sticks her head out and HOWLS.

MUSIC like Blind Pilot's We are the Tide plays.

A Ray-Ban wearing Ted looks up at Anne.

TED

Three-hundred and fifty miles of lush, white shoreline.

ANNE

This makes me feel alive!

Anne looks down.

ANNE (CONT'D)

(more to herself)

Surrounded by so much death, we tend to forget.

TED

What?!?

ANNE

About hope! The power of it.

We saved Sam!

ANNE

Drive faster!!!

Ted does.

EXT. BEACH - TWILIGHT

The Humvee parks in the tide as a huge orange sun sets into a vast the blue ocean.

Behind the wheel, Ted stares at the horizon.

TED

There it is. Going. Going.

ANNE

Gone.

EXT. BEACH - NIGHT

A campfire illuminates a still soaking Ted and Anne.

Ted looks beyond the fire, out to the dark ocean.

ANNE

Ted.

TED

Yeah.

ANNE

Is it odd that I still have conversations with my Sister?

TED

What do you mean?

ANNE

I mean. Sarah and I are... were, identical.

TED

Yes.

ANNE

So, more often they I would like to confess... I stand in front of a mirror and act like she's still alive.

What does she tell you?

ANNE

To let her go.

TED

Hmm.

Ted grabs a blanket and covers Anne.

TED (CONT'D)

Maybe that's a good idea.

ANNE

I know. I just can't imagine my life without her in it.

TED

Anne...

ANNE

I know... she's already gone.

Ted gets up.

TED

Time to get you home.

Ted puts his arm around her in a non-sexual way.

TED (CONT'D)

You okay?

ANNE

Thank you for listening to me.

TED

Anne, you listen, and care for everyone you meet. Relax... A wise woman once told me... Caregivers deserve good care too.

Anne perks up.

INT. TENT BARRACKS - DAY

Anne and Ted eats cold MREs.

SUPER: "Thanksgiving, 2014."

TED

Meals Ready to Eat. Yum.

Ted smacks his lips, reads the label.

TED (CONT'D)

Diced Turkey Breast with gravy?

ANNE

Well, the Army really outdid themselves with this meal.

Ted grabs a bottle of wine from a table. Then, he pours some into two cups.

TED

Here. Something to wash down the roast beast.

Anne laughs, grabs her cup and raises it up high.

ANNE

Happy Thanksgiving. Cheers.

TED

So why did you come?

ANNE

I wanted to make a difference.

Ted eyes Anne.

TED

Really?

ANNE

Well, guilt was part of it.

TED

Guilt? Why?

ANNE

I don't know. I just is.

TED

Maybe you should talk to someone.

Anne tosses her rolled-up napkin at Ted.

ANNE

Not ready yet.

TED

Hey... I forgot to tell you. They found Sam's Uncle.

Anne pops up and gives him a hug.

He still has family!

Ted holds her closer.

TED

Yeah.

Anne gently pushes him back.

ANNE

Ted. I know how you feel. But some day you will meet someone who can reciprocate your love.

Ted backs away, grim faced.

TED

Is that suppose to make me feel better?

ANNE

No.

Ted turns, EXITS.

TED

Thanks, Doc. I think.

INT. HOUSE - DINING ROOM - DAY

Glazed turkey on a platter. White table cloth, the works.

Todd sits at the table with two children. He looks hard at Anne's empty chair.

TODD

Hmm. Ellie. If you want. You can give thanks this year.

ELLIE

Okay Daddy. I'm thankful for my parents. I'm thankful for having a nice house to live in. I'm thankful for the wonderful backyard we get to play in.

Todd smiles.

ELLIE (CONT'D)

I'm thankful we have food. Because lots of kids don't have as many things as we have.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - DAY

Nurse #3 runs up to Anne.

NURSE #3

Anne. You have to see it.

EXT. M.M.U. EBOLA SURVIVOR'S BOARD - SAME

Sam places his hand in yellow paint and smacks it against the Board. A new Survivor has been added.

Anne smiles down at Sam.

Approaches Sam's UNCLE.

UNCLE

Sam would not be here today if it wasn't for all of you. Last month he had Ebola. Today, he does not. God Bless you all.

Anne hugs Sam, who hugs her back.

SAM

Thank you.

ANNE

No.

Anne picks him up.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Thank you.

EXT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - NIGHT

Anne with her iPhone in hand calls her family. For once the line appears clear.

ANNE

Hi everyone!

INT. HOUSE - KITCHEN - MORNING

Todd sees the call comes in from Anne.

TODD

Hey guys! It's Mom on the line.

He answers it.

INTERCUT BETWEEN TODD AND ANNE

TODD (CONT'D)

Anne?

ANNE

The second team arrives tomorrow.

TODD

That's fantastic.

ANNE

Yes, and finally Sam was released today.

TODD

You saved him. Well done... Now, get your ass on a plane home.

ANNE

Miss me?

TODD

Yes. The rough and the smooth of you.

ANNE

Good.

EXT. M.M.U. - TENT BARRACKS - DAY

NURSE #5 from Team Two unpacks her belongings, as Anne packs up.

Anne holds up a family photo taken before her deployment.

CLOSE-UP: family photograph in their backyard.

Anne places the picture in her sack and leaves. As she does, she nods to the Nurse #5.

ANNE

Good luck.

NURSE #5

Thanks.

Anne walks to the...

SURVIVOR'S BOARD

Anne sets down her bag.

Today I am healed, tomorrow I return to heal another.

Anne places her hand over Sam's yellow handprint.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Bye, Sam.

INT. AIRPLANE HANGAR - DAY

Anne waits patiently in a long line of medical professions being screened.

Nurse #1 uses the ray-gun-like gun to take Anne's temperature.

She looks at the reading.

NURSE #1

Captain, thank you for your service. You're clear to go.

Nurse #1 waves to the next person in line to step forward.

INT. U.N. PLANE - DAY

Anne boards and makes her way to her seat. When she reaches it, she looks out one last time at the foreign landscape.

INT. AIRPORT HANGAR - NIGHT

Massive, white lit hangar. Huge American flag drapes down from the rafters on the far wall overhead of Todd, Peter, and Ellie.

Other FAMILIES gather with 'Welcome Home' signs and await their loved ones.

A military band starts up, plays "My Country 'Tis Of Thee."

Peter holds up a, "Welcome Home Mom" sign.

APPEARS a GROUP of doctors, nurses, and one psychiatrist.

ELLIE

Mommy!

Anne EMERGES from the group and races toward her family.

Peter and Ellie run to Anne.

Anne scoops up her kids.

ANNE

I have missed you two, so much.

Tears roll down Anne's cheeks.

ELLIE

Don't cry, Mommy. Today is a happy day.

ANNE

It is.

She kisses Ellie.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Thanks.

ELLIE

I love you, Mommy.

PETER

Hey. What am I?

Anne places her hands on the sides of Peter's cheeks and stares into him.

ANNE

When was the last time you cut your hair?

Peter stands a little taller.

PETER

I was growing it long for you.

ANNE

My little surfer dude.

PETER

I missed you, Mommy.

Todd watches a few steps back.

ANNE

I missed you too, Peter.

Approaches Todd.

TODD

Group hug.

The four huddle together.

Thank you, Todd.

TODD

You were right to go.

PETER

Momma's home.

ANNE

Yes. Momma is.

EXT. MEGA GROCERY STORE - PARKING LOT - DAY

Anne walks with Peter and Ellie by her side.

Todd pushes the grocery cart behind them.

PETER

Can I get more Sugar Snaps?

ANNE

No.

PETER

But Dad let me.

Todd looks away.

ANNE

I'm sure he did. But Mommy is not.

TODD

Mom's back.

INT. MEGA GROCERY STORE - ENTRANCE - SAME
The scale of the store's offerings are tremendous.
Anne acts intimidated by it.

TODD

Anne, you okay?

ANNE

Yeah... Wow. I forgot how big this store was.

ELLIE

Let's divide and conquer!

Great, idea. You two fetch the the yogurt and milk.

PETER

Sugar Snaps?

ANNE

No.

PETER

Okay.

TODD

I'll grab the steaks.

ANNE

I will get the cake.

They split up.

Peter yells back to his Mom across the store.

PETER

We need more peanut butter!

ANNE

Okay! I will grab some.

INT. MEGA GROCERY STORE - PEANUT BUTTER AISLE - SAME

Anne stares at the fifty different options of peanut butter all in various sizing.

ANNE

Let's see. What brand does he like?

The magnitude of options combines with her recent trip to Africa where there were never any options. This causes an anxiety attack in Anne. She has trouble breathing. So, she looks around as her heart BEATS faster and faster.

SOUND: BOOM! BOOM! BOOM!

ANNE (CONT'D)

There's so many.

Anne falls to her knees and begins to cry. Everything she has held in during her trip to Africa, comes out now.

Todd passes the aisle.

TODD

Anne! You okay?

ANNE

We have so much.

TODD

What's going on?

ANNE

I don't know.

INT. HOME - BASEMENT - NIGHT

Anne lies on the floor in the darkness.

Todd comes down the stairs and flips on a light.

TODD

Anne?

Todd sees Anne in the middle of the floor.

Anne doesn't respond.

Todd rushes to her.

TODD (CONT'D)

You okay?

Todd plays with her hair.

ANNE

Todd, I feel broken.

Todd helps her up.

TODD

Come on. Let's have some tea.

INT. HOUSE - KITCHEN - NIGHT

A boiling pot on the kitchen stove BLOWS!

Todd removes the pot and pours Anne some green tea.

SOUND: GULG. GULG.

TODD

What happened?

Anne holds the warm cup in both hands.

I'm scared.

TODD

You really haven't told me what your deployment was like.

ANNE

I.... I'm not ready too, yet. This
mission was so different.

TODD

Okay. Do you think you should talk to someone?

Anne laughs.

ANNE

A psychiatrist?

Anne takes a sip of her tea.

TODD

What about Callie?

Anne thinks for a long moment as the steam from the tea hits her face.

ANNE

Yeah, Callie. She would understand.

TODD

I will call her in the morning.

ANNE

Okay.

Todd gives his wife a soft kiss on the forehead.

TODD

Let me run you a bath.

ANNE

Thank you.

Todd heads to start the bath. Then, he stops and turns back.

TODD

It's good to have you home, Anne.

ANNE

It's good to be home.

INT. HOME - ELLIE'S ROOM - NIGHT

Anne enters her daughter's room.

Ellie reads in bed, under the covers.

Anne tucks her in. Then, she sits on the edge of the bed.

ANNE

I missed this.

Anne plays with Ellie's hair.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Hmm. You have my Sister's eyes.

ELLIE

I have your eyes.

ANNE

Yes. That's what I meant. Good night, dear.

ELLIE

Good night, Mommy.

Anne switches off the light.

INT. HOUSE - MASTER BEDROOM - SAME

Anne, in a night gown, exits the bathroom.

NOTE: huge king-sized bed.

Todd with glasses on reads in bed.

TODD

How are you feeling?

ANNE

Better.

Anne slides into bed. She stays on her side.

Todd puts his book down and rolls to her.

TODD

You sure?

ANNE

Yes.

Anne kisses Todd on the cheek in the middle of the bed.

TODD

Good.

Todd rolls back to turn off his light.

TODD (CONT'D)

Luv 'ya.

Anne turns off her light.

ANNE

Love you too.

IMAGE: Todd and Anne's vast separation in bed.

BEGINS DREAM SEQUENCE:

INT. M.M.U. BIO-CONTAINMENT UNIT - WESTERN AFRICA - DAY

Anne in a yellow hazmat suit travels beyond a red line on the floor. She breaths in and out, heavy and laborious, like Darth Vader.

SOUND: HEAVY BREATHING 3xs.

Anne enters the high-risk zone. She wanders further down the corridor of blinding white. At its end, she finds a patient in a hospital bed. It is Sarah, her twin sister.

Anne hurries to her.

Sarah looks up. She appears infected with Ebola. Her eyes are puffy and red. He skin is blotchy.

SARAH

Hell of a bug.

Anne removes her headgear and visor. Then, her gloves.

SARAH (CONT'D)

What are you doing?

Anne gently touches her Sister's cheeks, as tears roll down her own.

ANNE

Missed ya.

SARAH

Same.

I don't know who I am in the world without you.

SARAH

How's Todd?

ANNE

He misses you too, but never shows it.

SARAH

Good. And your kiddos?

ANNE

We were too hard on Mother.

SARAH

I know.

ANNE

You don't realize it until you have your own.

SARAH

I will take your word for it, Sis. How are you?

Anne tears up more.

ANNE

Good.

Sarah smiles up.

SARAH

B-u-l-l-s-h-i-t!

ANNE

I...

SARAH

Shh. Give me your hand.

Anne gives Sarah her hand.

SARAH (CONT'D)

Get in.

Anne crawls into bed with Sarah.

ANNE

I love you.

SARAH

I know. So, tell me more about your boy and girl.

END OF DREAM SEQUENCE:

EXT. COFFEE SHOP - DAY

Two PEDESTRIANS pass an independent coffee shop and stop and peer in through the storefront's glass. They SEE Anne and Callie in mid-conversation.

INT. COFFEE SHOP - SAME

Anne and Callie both in workout gear sit and enjoy one another's company over coffee.

ANNE

That's how the dream ends.

CALLIE

Sarah's death created a void in you and Todd's life. You both attempted to fill it with one another.

ANNE

Yet, we still don't feel whole.

CALLIE

None of us fully understand the effects trauma and loss plays on the human psyche.

ANNE

I'm beginning too.

CALLIE

Your panic attacks.

ANNE

Moments of paralyzing fear.

CALLIE

You maybe suffering from short-term PTSD.

ANNE

Post Traumatic Stress Disorder?

CALLIE

Yup. When someone dies that you love. You are suppose to deal with the emotion... with the pain. You mind is attempting to avoid it. But you must confront it.

ANNE

I'm a hypocrite.

CALLIE

Why? Because, you are human.

ANNE

No. Because, I tell patients to do what I cannot do myself.

CALLIE

Then, do it.

ANNE

Yeah. I must try.

CALLIE

Why did you go to Africa?

ANNE

Because I thought I could help.

CALLIE

Anne. Why did you go to Africa?

ANNE

I told you. Its better to fight the outbreak there.

CALLIE

What was the <u>real</u> reason you went?

ANNE

My Sister and I faced life together for Twenty-Two years.

CALLIE

And?

ANNE

We never imagined life without the other.

CALLIE

So...

We had an unspoken pact to always care for one another.

CALLIE

When she died suddenly on Nine-Eleven, you...

ANNE

Questioned who I was in the world without her.

CALLIE

You're suffering from a catastrophic loss. It's time to properly grieve your Sister's passing.

ANNE

Survivor's guilt?

Callie offers Anne a hug.

The two embrace.

CALLIE

Survivor's guilt. Time for you to focus on the present. Celebrate it.

ANNE

Yeah.

EXT. CAMPUS - LATER DAY

Anne runs through campus. As she turns the corner. She sees Todd's building in the distance. She increases her pace.

The Campus' Tower chimes the hour.

SOUND: DONG! DONG! DONG!

Anne hurries across campus.

INT. TODD'S CLASSROOM - SAME

Todd hums Ode to Joy as he wanders into his classroom.

TODD

So what did everyone think of your assignment?

DAVID

Who doesn't love Star Wars?

TODD

George Lucas states it's a B-Movie at best, but why do we love watching it?

STUDENT #1

It's good vs. evil.

TODD

True. What else?

TABATHA

It's a mishmash of genres.

TODD

Like what?

TABATHA

A Fantasy Film. Based on myths and legends, a long, long time ago in a galaxy...

THE CLASS

Far, far away.

TODD

Yes! Exactly.

DAVID

It's a Faith Film. With the Force.

STUDENT #2

And the Old Man who leads the Chosen out of the desert.

Anne enters the room a little out of breathe.

TODD

Hi, Anne. Hmmm. Class. This is my globetrotting wife. Anne, this is my class.

Anne waves to the class.

ANNE

Hi.

TABATHA

She's beautiful.

DAVID

Congratulations, Dr. H.

Anne looks to Todd.

ANNE

Were we ever this young?

TODD

No.

Todd walks the room.

TODD (CONT'D)

Class, here's your shot. Ask Captain Hawke, a question. Before she <u>runs</u> off again to save the world.

Tabatha sits up.

TABATHA

What was it like?

Anne looks back at Todd.

TODD

Tabatha.

ANNE

Tabatha? Hmm. Pretty girl.

Tabatha shrinks down in her chair.

ANNE (CONT'D)

I'm still coming to grips with it... we have so much. They so little. Yet, there was a little boy I met there who taught me to appreciate our lives.

Anne turns to Todd.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Do you have the video I sent you?

TODD

Sure. Just give me a minute.

Todd goes to his computer and finds the video. Then, he plays it.

TODD (CONT'D)

Here you go. Roll it!

IMAGE: SAM.

This is Sam, one of my Ebola patients. I thought he was going to die like his Sister Soe. But the meds worked.

ON THE SCREEN:

Anne interviews Sam.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Sam. What do you like to do?

SAM

Eat.

Anne laughs.

ANNE

What else?

SAM

Play futbol with my Daddy.

Sam grows quiet.

ANNE

I know, Sam. I know.

Anne signals, "Cut" and the interview ends.

DISSOLVE TO CLASS:

Anne walks closer to the screen.

IMAGE: Sam by the Board.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Sam now stands before our Survivor's Board.

DAVID

Survivor's Board?

ANNE

When you're battling a virus as bad as Ebola, we lose so much of the time. When we win, and a patient is cured. Ebola free... We ask the survivors to leave their handprint on this board before returning home.

DISSOLVE TO: SURVIVOR'S BOARD Sam places his gloved hand into the paint, and imprints a yellow handprint on M.M.U's Survivor's Board.

DISSOLVE TO: CLASS

Anne's hand rests over the image of the Survivor's Board.

TODD

See class. Life's truth. The camera can reflect it. Exalt it.

ANNE

That Board shows us that we made a difference. We saved lives. We saved his. Just as my husband is attempting to enrich yours.

INT. HOUSE - MASTER BATHROOM - LATER DAY NIGHT

Anne, before the mirror, brushes her teeth. Then, she SPITS into the sink.

Anne stands in silence. She eyes herself hard, no shorter than twenty seconds. Dead air. She makes funny faces, laughs at herself. Then, she tears up.

MIRROR ANNE

Get your shit together, girl.

ANNE

I will.

MIRROR ANNE

It's time.

ANNE

I will always love you.

MIRROR ANNE

I know. Kiss those kiddos for me.

ANNE

I will. Good-bye, Sis.

Anne wipes away her tears.

ANNE (CONT'D)

I gotta go.

Anne walks out of the bathroom.

Her image still appears in the mirror.

MIRROR ANNE

Bye, Anne.

EXT. HOUSE BACKYARD - LATER SPRING DAY

Peter's Birthday Party in the backyard.

CHILDREN run about and play games.

In the forefront, in Spring wear, Anne speaks with Callie.

CALLIE

You okay?

ANNE

Yeah. Thank you for our talks.

CALLIE

You're welcome. How are you feeling?

ANNE

Better.

CALLIE

Good. Any Sarah sightings?

Anne makes a grim face.

ANNE

Sadly, no.

CALLIE

It's for the best.

ANNE

I know. I just miss...

Callie sees some KIDS circling the birthday cake.

CALLIE

Hey!

Callie SHOUTS to them.

CALLIE (CONT'D)

You scavengers! Get away from that cake!

Callie gets up and moves to the table with the cake on it. Then, she looks back to Anne.

CALLIE (CONT'D)

You good, Anne?

I'm good. Go, protect that cake.

Callie laughs.

CALLIE

Momma needs her sugar.

ANNE

Go.

Callie does.

Anne smiles as she looks around at her family and friends.

QUICK SNAPSHOTS: VARIOUS INTERACTIONS AT THE PARTY.

- 1. Hank impresses Tabatha with a magic trick.
- 2. Ellie gives Peter a card and a kiss.

PETER

Yuck.

Ellie runs off.

Peter chases her.

- 3. CHILDREN blow huge soap bubbles.
- 4. Other KIDS dip their hands into containers of various colored paints. Then, they press their palms against a big sliding door window.

Colorful handprints covers every inch of the glass.

ECU: THE HANDPRINTS.

RETURN TO ANNE:

Todd approaches Anne from behind.

TODD

You good?

Anne leans deeply into him.

ANNE

I am now.

APPEARS a standing Lieutenant Wall and his young WIFE.

Anne rushes to him.

Todd watches her go.

TODD

There she goes again... to save the world.

ANNE

Lieutenant?!?

Callie walks up with big piece of cake in hand.

CALLIE

He wanted to show off his new legs.

Anne gives him a big hug.

WALL

Doc...

ANNE

Anne.

WALL

This is my girl.

Mrs. Wall playfully shoves her husband. Then, she shows off her tiny diamond ring.

MRS. WALL

His wife!

Mrs. Wall hugs Anne. She tears up as she does.

MRS. WALL (CONT'D)

Thank you, Anne.

Anne steps out of the hug.

ANNE

For what?

MRS. WALL

I got my man back.

ANNE

Good.

MRS. WALL

Ohh! How rude of me. I'm Sarah. Sarah Wall.

ANNE

Hi, Sarah. Thank you for coming.

GUESTS gather around.

Kids blow more soap bubbles and play.

ANNE (CONT'D)

Lieutenant?

Wall looks to Anne.

WALL

Sir!

ANNE

You're truly are a lucky man.

WALL

That I know!

ANNE

But, are you still fast!!!

Wall eyes Anne.

WALL

Ready.

Anne eyes Wall.

ANNE

Set.

ANNE/WALL

Go!

Anne and Lieutenant Wall burst across the lush green yard.

The GUESTS cheer them on.

Children of various ages chase after them.

Soap bubbles float upwards. The bubbles pass a white long banner that reads, "Healing Hearts can make a difference!"

A big bubble that dwarfs the others drifts beyond the sign.

ECU: a single big bubble contrasts a picture perfect sky.

SOUND: POP!

FADE TO BLACK:

THE END
