Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace,
- 2 Peter 3:14

For nothing will be impossible with God." - Luke 1:37

They say, "A watched pot never boils." After several minutes of field tests, I can confirm that a watched pot does boil.

They say, "It's as boring as watching paint dry." After several minutes of watching paint dry, I understand why someone might be bored if that's the only option (which doesn't have to be the case).

I enjoy the advent season most years. I find the process of waiting to be a refreshing break from constantly stimulating my every moment with "stuff" – worries, thoughts, tasks, images, words, activity, and the list goes on...I am exhausted just writing about it. The day after Halloween our neighbors decorated for Christmas, and I still have a whole tree full of leaves ... Waiting... what a glorious concept and profound at Advent time.

Advent means "coming." Jesus is adventing first as an innocent baby and now as a triumphant King. And here's the thing, we cannot go to Him, so we must wait. However, we are not good at waiting and getting worse as time goes on. You know what I mean. Maybe we should take another look at what waiting is and means through the season of Advent?

We know that something or someone is coming which will make a huge difference in our life together. We know that we cannot hasten it's (his) coming or go to meet halfway. What a terrible feeling almost powerless with no control, and yet what about the peace? The peace of not "needing or having to or being able to do anything" but just being in the moment(s) imagining and celebrating the possibilities of what might be when arrival happens! As we wait on the Lord, we are free to embrace this peace amid our daily "stuffing". Maybe you rest in this peace and consider what's important and what's not, or you reflect on priorities to let go of somethings while holding other's a bit closer. Try it.

This year we will focus on the candles of the advent wreath. Take a few moments each Sunday and focus on the burning candles – sense their steady light and calming glow. Each week, the light grows until it arrives at Christmas day and still it remains steady and calm. Maybe we can learn something from that small flame this holiday and what it means to wait.

Let us pray. Come, O Come, Emmanuel and grow the peace within us. Let your light grow and your love flow into our being, so that we might find rest and awaken to life as you give it day by day and moment by moment. Amen.

Devotions by (Larson): (Leonard Larson gave the following speech 56 years ago)

This is a perfect time of year to worry about our own level of giving. There are a multitude of ways to give thanks: pray for friends, church, etc. Costs nothing to say we're thankful. Do little acts of kindness,

great ways to give back. Smiling at a stranger. It's amazing the value those acts can have. Might be the best part of that person's day. Look for those reasons to give back, be the bright spot in someone's day.

General Fund Balance: \$12,359.70

Total Checking: \$12,094.08Motion to approve: Shelton

Issues +/-: Fixed issue with youth fund, adding into other assets category. Should not reflect in the actual checkbook. Saw something that was miscoded. The Parsonage fund is negative because it exceeded the initial amount, but the loan covers overage. Rock fund is higher than reflected. Beef dinner brought in \$1878 as reported by Leonard. Is there a way to add venmo/code to scan for fundraising? People don't have cash for fundraising events. It's convenient to have it for fundraising events. Maland fund is not showing the full amount.

Pastor's Report: Pastor gave report.

New Business:

- Insurance Break up
 - Richter reported that Palestine Lutheran Church has officially changed the insurance to Auto Owners.
 Apparently they are picking up tons of churches.
 Several major church insurance companies are leaving lowa. Policy is equal to or better in some ways (deductible is lower). Palestine Lutheran Church is in a good spot going forward.

Utilities update

 Larson reported that things are getting done. Refuse to give easement because we cannot get back if we give it up now. Work being done to find out where lines/sewer is. Utility Company has been amicable to work with.

Sound system:

- Richter provided scope of work to Council to review. Scope includes improvements outlined previously for a basic level of improvement, including hiding visible cables. Part of the project scope will be to organize the upstairs balcony and add a "command station". Project will include organizing the choir loft. May be able to add a row of seating. Mindy Devries has been consulted. By December will have Nelson Electric add additional scope needed to implement improvements. After Nelson Electric bid is received the whole plan will be presented to council and then to the Congregation for approval. Goal is for this to occur in January. The project scope is basic but it allows for a phase two later should the church decide to add functionality in the future.
- News Letter: in church mailbox and email, no snail mail
 - Mailing the newsletter costs an estimated \$1200 per year. Would be a source of cost reduction. A printed copy will be provided to anyone who requests it.

Overall communication is always a critical factor at a church. There were concerns voiced that if a newsletter is not looked at until later in the month it leads to communication problems. A big chunk of the church secretary's job is creating the newsletter. Putting the newsletter online limits what information can be published due to confidentiality. Emailing the letter is an option.

Should we do a survey to find out people's preferences on how to receive info?

- 72 Degrees plumbing company has plumbers available. They
 recently completed \$1400 in work at the church for work that
 Mark Pote could not fix himself.
- Mark Pote asked the Council who have we used for pest control in the past?
- Active Shooter Training with Huxley Chief of Police Nate Albaugh was held at the church Thursday Nov 9 at 6:30pm. The Chief went through expected response time of an active shooter event, where it is likely the event will be over by the time police can respond. The training provided was based on a "modified" ALICE training which is the training that was recently deployed at Ballard Community School District. The church training discussed hiding vs fleeing vs confronting a shooter given the specifics of the situation. Pastor and Huxley Chief plan to schedule a walk through to evaluate the church property. Richter agreed to create a layout to provide to Huxley Police.
- Council considered the matter of a special offering for Advent/Christmas. Larson made a motion to approve using the funds to buy a farm for recipients in Peru or Uganda. Saveraid seconded the motion. The motion passed with all in favor except one vote against.




COLLEGE/MILITARY UPDATES:

The Next Person You Meet in Heaven by Mitch Albom

You may have heard of some of this author's other books including "Tuesdays with Morrie" and "The Five People You Meet in Heaven" because they were best sellers. This fictional book is a seguel to "The Five People..." and tells the story of Annie who, as a child was hurt in an amusement park accident that she can't remember much about. Annie grows up in a broken home with a mother who just doesn't understand her and school mates that bully her. She reconnects as an adult with a friend from her early school years and ends up marrying him. Her happiness is cut short, however, when she convinces her husband to go on a hot air balloon ride where another freak accident, just after her wedding, results in tragedy. Throughout the book, Annie meets people in heaven that help her understand that despite the difficulties in her short life, her life had meaning and affected the lives of many others. The next person she meets in heaven is her new husband, causing her incredible guilt about the accident. She learns that on earth and in heaven, things may not always be what you expect, but the narrative of your life is never accidental. I would recommend this book to anyone questioning the importance of their life in relation to the big picture and as an example of how God weaves our lives together.
