

House Rules

- **Zero tolerance** for possession or consumption of alcohol or narcotics, on or off the property.
- Be willing to find and maintain employment for duration of residency.
- Must be clean and sober for a minimum of 30 days.
- Remain clean and sober through participation in a 12 step program. Residents are expected to find and work with a sponsor and attend a minimum of 3 weekly 12 step meetings.
- Have a 12 step sponsor, if applicable, as part of recovery program.
- Residents must attend mandatory house meeting one time per week, _____ @ _____ pm
- Be willing to abide by the rules of the Cedar and Sage House.
- Pay rent and bills on time
- Residents must be willing to submit a drug/alcohol urine screen upon request of house manager, owner or counselor. Failure to abide will result in immediate eviction.
- Commit to a minimum of 90 days residency
- Have no history of sex crimes
- Aggressive behavior, violence or threats of violence toward self or others will not be tolerated.
- No weapons of any kind.

- Theft of any kind will not be tolerated.
- No sexual activity or possession of pornography.
- Discriminatory remarks of any kind (racial, sexual, religious or other) will not be tolerated.
- Disrespectful, foul or socially unacceptable behavior is not allowed
- Smoking is allowed in designated areas outside the house.
- Participate in assigned household chores.
- All areas are to be kept clean and orderly. Residents are responsible for common as well as personal areas.
- Be respectful to manager and all roommates.
- No visitors for the first 30 days, thereafter with house manager approval.
- All visitors must comply with rules.
- Participants must abide by federal, state and local laws.
- Residents must provide their own food and meals.
Residents are responsible for complete clean up after cooking or eating food. Taking food from others without permission is considered stealing.
- Be in by curfew.
- All prescription medications must be locked up. Opiates, benzodiazepines and barbituates are not approved medications, even if prescribed.
