LSU WINS THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Joe Burrow capped off #1 LSU's undefeated 15-0 season with a 42-25 win over #3 Clemson. Burrow threw for 463 yards and five touchdowns and ran for another score, as LSU overcame its first double-digit deficit of the season.

Clemson opened the scoring with a 67-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run. However, LSU would answer just over four minutes later, when Burrow found Ja'Marr Chase for a 52-yard TD strike.

Clemson WR Tee Higgins took a 36-yard reverse to the end zone, scoring on his first-career rushing attempt to stretch his team's lead to 17-7.

Burrow ran for a touchdown just over five minutes into the second quarter. Then, with 5:19 to go in the half, he hit Chase for the WR's second touchdown of the half. The Tigers would extend their lead with 10 seconds left in the half when Burrow found TE

Thaddeus Moss wide open in the end zone for a 6-yard score, the QB's fourth total touchdown of the half.

Travis Etienne ran through the LSU defense for his first TD to pull Clemson to within 3 points, 28-25.

Burrow then hit Moss for the TE's second score of the night, breaking the single-season TD record in doing so. He would find WR Terrace Marshall for a 24-yard score less than three minutes into the fourth quarter, stretching LSU's lead to 17, 42-25.

Burrow ended his Heisman Trophy winning senior season throwing for almost twice as many yards as he did last year and 65 total touchdowns (60 passing and 5 rushing) compared to only 23 last season.

This was LSU's fourth National Championship and the first for coach Ed Orgeron.

FOOTBALL TIDBITS

Prior to #1 LSU facing #3 Clemson for the National Championship, here are some interesting stats from the first six years of the playoffs:

- #1 SEEDS: 4-5 & 0 National Champions
- #2 SEEDS: 7-2 & 3 National Champions (2015 Alabama, 2016 Clemson, 2018 Clemson)
- #3 SEEDS: 2-5 & 0 National Champions
- #4 SEEDS: 4-3 & 2 National Champions (2014 Ohio State, 2017 Alabama)

The team wearing the white jersey has won the last 4 consecutive National Championship Games. For the 2014 National Championship Game, Oregon was the #3 Seed and Ohio State was the #4 Seed, but Oregon chose to wear their white jerseys in the Title Game, so Ohio State wore their scarlet jerseys when they won the National Championship and are still the only schools to win it all in their dark jerseys. LSU is wearing white vs Clemson in the Title Game because that was they choose to wear.

Tennessee overcame a 13-point deficit in the final 5 minutes to stun Indiana in the Tax-Slayer Gator Bowl. Entering that game, FBS teams were 0-471 when trailing by at least 13 points in the final 5 minutes of the 4th quarter this past season.

Oregon wins the Rose Bowl Game Presented by Northwestern Mutual, 28-27, over Wisconsin. The Pac-12 finished 4-3 in bowl games this season; that matches the conference's win total from the previous two seasons combined (4-12 in 2017-18).

Justin Herbert is the first QB with 3 Rush TD in the Rose Bowl since Vince Young in the 2006 Rose Bowl against USC. He is the first Oregon QB with 3 rush TD in a game since Marcus Mariota on Dec. 5, 2014 against Arizona.

Wisconsin had a 95-yard kickoff return TD by Aron Cruickshank, the longest kickoff return in a bowl game in school history.

Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor joined Iowa State's Troy Davis as the only running backs with two 2,000 yard rushing seasons.

Alabama and Auburn played a bowl game on the same day for the 10th time ever. Alabama won and Auburn lost. It was the 7th time the two schools split the pair of bowl games (on the field results). They have never both won a bowl game on the same day.

Tom Herman is the first Texas coach to win a bowl game in each of his first three seasons at the school. All three times, his team was an underdog in the bowl game.

In the win over Utah, Longhorn QB, Sam Ehlinger became the second player in Texas program history to throw 30 touchdown passes in a single season. He joins Colt McCoy, who threw 34 in 2008.

Lynn Bowden Jr. of Kentucky ran for 233 yards in the Belk Bowl win over Virginia Tech. That set the all-time record for most rushing yards by a QB in a bowl game. It was previously held by Johnny Manziel, who ran for 229 yards in the 2013 Cotton Bowl.

Arizona State defeated Florida State 20-14 in the Tony The Tiger Sun Bowl. Herm Edwards is the third Sun Devils coach in program history, joining Todd Graham and John Cooper, to lead his team to a bowl game in each of his first two seasons as head coach.

This past year, Virginia Tech appeared in a bowl for the 27th straight season, the longest active streak with a bowl appearance in the FBS.

Florida's Dan Mullen became the first coach to win a BCS or a New Year's Six bowl in each of his first two seasons at a school. The Gators also improved to 4-0 all-time in the Orange Bowl. Florida finished with 549 yards, its most in a bowl game since the 2010 Sugar Bowl (2009 season) against Cincinnati.
