### Busy scholastic chess season now underway

School programs and other Roving ChessNuts classes are mostly filled for the winter sessions and new learning opportunities are being held this month and early March to prepare players for the Chess Faceoff at Rogers Place on Sunday afternoon, March 11.

The aim of Roving ChessNuts instructors and organizers is to get as many players as possible prepared to do their best at the Rogers Place event.

While first-time open tournament players, particularly those in early elementary school grades, are welcome to enter the competition, they should have experience in using a chess clock and playing against opponents they do not know - unlike in school programs and chess classes where the games are among friends and schoolmates.

Also because tournament officials and others can not give advice during games, a player can find him- or herself in trouble if they know they are winning a game but they do not know how to perform a simple checkmate or promote a pawn so they can go on to win.

Training tournaments, workshops and camps are being offered during February and early March so all players gain experience and knowledge to be more competitive on March 11.

These activities are being offered at both the Roving ChessNuts and Greenfield Community Hall.

Those in beginning chess classes in schools in Edmonton, St. Albert and Sherwood Park should check with their instructors about their ability to participate in the Chess Faceoff at Rogers Place.







### **Important information for parents** regarding Chess Faceoff at Rogers Place

This could be Edmonton's biggest chess event of the year and will allow thousands of people outside of the chess community to know that scholastic chess exists and has keen students playing competitively for individual and school team awards. It will be a thrill for the young players to be in Rogers Place, Edmonto'sn number one sports facility, as a a chess athlete, not just a spectator! And after proving themselves at the chess boards, the players and their families can enjoy an Edmonton Oil Kings Junior Hockey game against the Kootenay Ice.

To be involved, parents must enter their chess players as soon as possible and no later than March 3. See Page 4 for details and order form. Payment must accompany entry/order form as tickets for entering the Oil Kings Game have to be distributed. No entries or payments can be made on March 11.

- 1. Because this event is being held at Rogers Place and there could be thousands of people in the facility during the tournament and by game time at 4 p.m., 14,000 or more people in the facility, it is essential that our chess players be supervised at all times. While chess officials will be responsible for supervision in the tournament play area, we will need accompanying parents to help supervise in the informal play area between games and escorting children to bathrooms.
- 2. There will also be other youth activities happening outside the chess area. Parents will have to make sure their chess players do not go and join these activities and then be absent from their chess games! When they are done all their games, they will be told to be with their parent(s) but be ready to report back to the chess area by 3:20 p.m. for awards ceremonies and afterwards players, parents and others having hockey tickets will proceed to enter the arena and sit in Section 109. Once inside the arena, players will no longer be under the supervision of the chess organizers and officials, although they will also be seated in the chess Section 109 and can be approached by any player or chess family having a problem.
- 3. Regularly check for updates about the Faceoff at www.rovingchessnuts.com and the listing of registered players.
- 4. Chess families are welcome to have other relatives and friends join in purchasing Oil Kings game tickets through our package and they, too, can sit in Section 109. But we would ask that non-chess players and their families getting involved do not arrive until about 3:15 p.m. for the chess awards ceremony. Space may be limited during the tournament. Any proceeds from the Faceoff are going to be channelled to future chess activities in Edmonton and area.
- 5. Players and their families are responsible for getting themselves to and from this event. There is no parking associated with the entry/ticket package. Please plan ahead regarding this aspect so you are not late for the tournament start nor late for the awards/game if part of the family is coming later.
- 6. Parents wishing to join the crew involved in setting up/taking down & supervision should send an e-mail to rovingchessnuts@shaw.ca. Depending on duties assigned, credit towards future chess activities given.
