Happy New Year!

The January newsletter is always a bit of a challenge for me due to its timing: all of the content is due at the same time as all of the preparations for Christmas at church (and home) are at their most chaotic. I want to be in the moment for Christmas, not worrying and writing about January and the work that is waiting for us. However, as I reflect on this challenge, I know this work is important and carries over into my ministry way beyond the completion of our monthly newsletter.

As a community of faith, we must continue to consider how God is calling us to live and serve as God's people. So, this means finding space to embrace the challenges of being intentional in prayer, reflection, and listening to God. Finding the time (and energy) to step away from daily tasks in order to offer God our attention helps us to notice the holy in our lives. What if, in the midst of the activity and busyness of each day, we can pause just for a few minutes and look up and around and offer God our thanks for the day and God's presence in it? How might that change the patterns of our days? How will that spiritual practice lead to stronger prayer muscles? For me, these intentional pauses in my daily activities prove challenging, but I have found that when I'm consistent about taking these spiritual prayer pauses, I am actually more productive and honestly, happier, as I continue my work following the pauses. I finally realized that setting the alarm on my phone as a reminder to pause is very helpful. We all find our own paths forward – finding our own spiritual rhythms in prayer and meditation - but I hope that our time together in worship on Sundays helps to anchor your spiritual practices as you begin a new week.

As you are receiving this newsletter following the 1st of January, you now know why it's late. I hope and pray that your Christmas celebrations were joyful and filled with light and that your new year brings peace and physical and spiritual health. I hope as we begin this new year, that new patterns of prayer emerge for you and that within it all you feel God holding you close.


Stewardship 2023 - Thank You!

Star Words are a spiritual tool to help guide us through the year. Star Words are available for everyone – young and old. Keep the star close all year and use it as a spiritual practice to let the word guide your prayers and bring you into a new conversation with God. Trust that your word will have something to offer, some new understanding or insight for you this year. Watch and see how the word appears and makes itself known to you in different ways. Perhaps keep a journal to hold your reflections and the epiphanies that come from this spiritual practice. We will receive our Star Words during worship on January 8th.

We will mail out Star Words to anyone who would like to receive one but will not be in worship on January 8th. Simply notify the church office via email, phone, call, Facebook Messenger, or let Pastor Santina know you would like to have one mailed to you – please provide an address so we can get it to you.
