

During this class each of us will discover our own natural evangelism style that fits with how God has made and shaped us for His glory. We will also learn an approach to direct conversations toward matters of faith which will help us with those we are sharing Christ with for the first time and also with our relationships with believers as we encourage each other in our spiritual walk. We all need fellow believers to help us grow in our understanding of the gospel. We need others who spur us on in our compassion for the lost and our ability to share the good news of Jesus. ### **Words from Our Pastor**

ou may not know that prior to retiring in July 2015, while serving as Pastor of Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church in Los Alamitos, I and eight other guys were in a band known as "The Crow's Feet." I played the bass guitar and others played guitars, drums, keyboard, banjo, harmonica, and sang. We actually gained some popularity (or at least familiarity) in the community

and were invited to play for fundraising events, corporate golf tournaments, political groups, and church programs. By the way, "Crow's Feet" has to do with those wrinkle lines running from the side of our eyes toward our temples.

### "The Crow's Feet" and Church

I realized a lot about the church from playing in "The Crow's Feet." First, I saw how we all have different parts to play and we seem to play them better when we are connected together. I see this on Sunday mornings now that we have the combined worship services. I see it on Wednesday evenings (there are other times and places this happens too)

when we gather to build relationships and study together.

#### We Grew

Second, I saw how a church can grow. One-by-one the original three founding members grew to be nine. We grew by extending personal invitations to others — some who were part of the church and some who had no church involvement.



### **We Sounded Pretty Good**

Third, we actually sounded pretty good, and those for whom we performed actually enjoyed the music (at least they acted like it). Our church has a great opportunity

to bless our community with the glorious "music" of the grace of God revealed in Jesus Christ. Let's commit to deliberate "gigs"

of serving and blessing our community – schools, sheriff's department, firefighters, neighbors, and friends – by singing the song of God's great love through our words and actions.

### Regroup and Reaffirm

Fourth, when membership of the band changed – two moved away, one developed serious health problems – we had to

regroup (literally) and reaffirm our purpose. Trinity Church continues to be in transition. The Pastor Nominating (Search) Committee is in place and starting its work. The Lord is leading us into the future. Let's reaffirm our commitment to this church and pray for the person God is raising up to serve as pastor in the future.

### We Had to Practice

Finally, to perform well, each member of "The Crow's Feet" had to practice his instrument. The same is true for us here at Trinity. On February 14th, we enter the season known as Lent that leads us to Holy Week and Resurrection Sunday on April 1st. It is a time of special focus on Jesus and his self-giving love, his sacrificial death that reconciles us to God, and his amazing, world-transforming resurrection from the dead. Let's practice the disciplines of scripture reading, reflection, prayer, and serving others through this season.

May the Holy Spirit fill you and tune your heart to know God more fully.

### **Exotic Plant Society**



### **New Direction and Responsibilities**

od is good! He knows what we need, what will bring us to Him, and how He wants to use us as a community of believers and as individuals. January saw a number of changes in direction for me.

## New Direction for Outreach to our Community

First, we will not be sending a team to Greece this year. In this season in the life of Trinity Church, Pastor Jim and I decided it was prudent to postpone this trip. We felt it was important for everyone to be able to focus on the goal of bringing a new permanent pastor to lead and serve our congregation.

This does not mean we will not have a missions outreach in 2018. We are planning an outreach scenario (probably two weeks) later this year to the Muslim community in the Rancho San Diego/El Cajon area. The majority of Muslims are recent immigrants, new to our country and city.

We are looking at various options for training and outreach to grow a group from Trinity Church to reach a needy part of our community for Jesus. Most of these people have never heard what Jesus has done for them. Some have only had negative experiences with the "outside" world. Many are longing for "American" friends missing the close communities they had in their countries of origin. We have an incredible opportunity to serve these needy ones as Jesus would have done. Much of what they need costs nothing in terms of dollars and cents, but what they need is our time and friendship.

The training that will likely be provided will include cultural understanding that creates a better environment for communication, some simple Arabic phrases, comparison of the Quran and the Bible, and ways we can be help and not be a hindrance.

### **Please Pray**

Please pray as we begin to pull together ideas, resources, and organizations that can help us learn how we can best serve and bless this community. Pray also about becoming a part of this new outreach of Trinity Church. Pray about doing something new – getting out of the boat of security and walk on water with Jesus as the focus.

### **New Responsibility**
