Drought Resources

As of November 9, 2016

11 Counties are currently approved for ECP:

York, Oxford, Franklin, Androscoggin, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, Sagadahoc, Waldo, and Penobscot

11 Counties are eligible for DAP:

York, Cumberland, Oxford, Androscoggin, Kennebec, Lincoln, Knox, Sagadahoc, Waldo (contiguous), Franklin (contiguous), and Somerset (contiguous)

Members of the agricultural community should contact their local FSA office to determine if they should apply for assistance.

7 Counties

(Androscoggin, Knox, Lincoln, Oxford, Sagadahoc, Cumberland, & York) are in Primary Disaster Counties and 4 (Franklin, Knox, Somerset, & Waldo) are contiguous.

No assistance through MSHA is available at this time.

United States Department of Agriculture

Farm Service Agency (FSA)

_

Emergency Conservation Program (ECP)

- Provides emergency funding and technical assistance to farmers and ranchers to rehabilitate farmland damaged by natural disasters and to implement emergency water conservation measures in periods of drought.
- Participants may receive cost share up to 75 percent of the cost to implement emergency conservation practices. Qualified producers may receive up to 90 percent of the cost to implement approved emergency practices.
- Eligible practiced include providing water for livestock during periods of severe drought.

Disaster Assistance Programs (DAP)

- Secretary of Agriculture is authorized to designate counties as disaster areas to make Emergency Loans (EM) available to producers suffering losses in those counties and in counties that are contiguous to a designated county.
- Fast Track Secretarial Designations if any portion of a County has experienced Severe Drought (D2) for 8 consecutive weeks.
- DAP's include Livestock Forage Program, Livestock Indemnity Program, Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm Raised Fish, and Tree Assistance Program

Rural Development

Water and Environmental Grant and Loan Funding

- Rural communities can obtain technical assistance and financing necessary to develop drinking water and waste disposal systems.
 - *Emergency Community Water Assistance Grants* Rural towns with 10,000 or fewer residents are eligible
 - Household Water Well System Grants Non-profit organizations may apply for grants on behalf of residents in rural areas to help construct, refurbish, or service individually owned household water well systems.

United States Small Business Administration

Disaster Loans

SBA provides low-interest disaster loans to businesses, private non-profit organizations, homeowners, and renters. Loans can be used to repair or replace the following items damaged or destroyed in a declared disaster: real estate, personal property, machinery and equipment, and business assets.

Maine State Housing Authority

Home Repair & Improvement Services

- MSHA may offer grants, low cost, or no cost loans to help with home improvement needs.
