Pastor's Corner

It's *January?!* How do you feel about that? January is that month of weird tension — you're holding on to certain things from the year before (I'm not talking about Christmas expenses on the credit card, but other things we don't want to let go of), along with the desire to open our hand to the new possibilities in the coming year. The Baptism of the Lord (first Sunday after Epiphany) is a good way to handle that tension. At his baptism, Jesus was publicly declaring the start of his formal ministry. I'm sure he wanted to hold onto some things he had grown to love (e.g., maybe traditions or habits he'd grown accustomed to in his home and with his mother ... maybe times when he could relish being with his Father, without the expectations, the train rolling toward his saving the world). At the same time, like he says in the Gospels, he loved to do the Father's will, so his hands were open to the work the Father was calling him to in the 3 years ahead of him (hands open ... see what I did there?)... He said near the start of his ministry (John 4:34) - "My

food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work."

Don't you think that's a good perspective at the start of the year? I believe it's way better than, "This year, I'm going to lose 25 pounds and look good" ... or "this year, I'm going to make more money" ... Many of our resolutions are good, and we should have them as goals. But those baptismal waters remind us not to settle for the good if it means sacrificing the best. The picture of Jesus being baptized (remember, it wasn't for his sins – he had none – instead, he was fully consecrating himself to the redemptive work of God, for us, as the 2nd Adam) – his baptism gives us better incentive than the kind we have for short-lived resolutions. Instead of thinking of the New Year "ball dropping" on the year behind us, think of the Holy Spirit dove falling on the Leader in front of us. Instead of listening to the voices of self-doubt and longing within, listen to the Voice saying to Jesus (and us): "This is my Son, whom I love; listen to him."

That's how you start the year, my friends, that's how you start the year – *all in*. May we Honor God, Grow in Faith, and Improve our Community & World, because, with our identity in Christ, we are now children of the Father, consecrated to redeeming work in the world. *Soli Deo Gloria*. ~ *Pastor Brian*

From the Hearts & Hands of Session

Coming Campaign – It has become clear to the Session and Upkeep Committee that several major projects now need acted on – particularly:

*the need for the *parking lot* to be repaved, with particular urgency to the pad by the dumpster (parking lot and the dumpster pad may turn out to be two separate operational projects)

*the need for a *new/updated sign* in front of the Church on Puckety Rd.

*the need for a *new roof* for the Church building (it has been patched/shingled multiple times to repair) – *may* be able to be patched for about 3 more years.

One might ask, "Which is the priority?" Our answer is: all of them are, but the *parking lot* needs addressed first. We have thought and prayed about the imminent needs, with special consideration of the helpful information supplied by the Upkeep Team from previous bids, etc. Since the needed amount will likely be *over* \$100,000, the Session of Puckety Church believes a church & community capital campaign is needed. Please be watching for updates and information. For now, the timeframe of the campaign will likely be 6 months to a year, and involve multiple parts:

- a) Multi-form solicitation, mass communication, and personal appeal.
- b) Likely the application for a loan (in full knowledge and approval to the congregation and Redstone Presbytery)
- c) Some manner of fundraising events (if approved e.g., dinners, etc.)

Puckety has a long and encouraging history of "rising to the challenge" when it has come to caring for or enhancing our facilities, so they may continue to serve the Lord and be useful in the mission he has given us. Though a daunting reality, we have an even bigger God, and we know his faithfulness – from both the past and in the present. So, we are greatly encouraged. We ask every single member, and every friend of Puckety, to join us in our hope, and in our commitment to this endeavor. Let's start with prayer, and reliance upon the Lord.

What is the *First Fruits Offering* all about?

Puckety Church is one of the 67 churches in the Redstone Presbytery, of the Synod of the Trinity, of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Both the Synod and the General Assembly carry out significant ministry and mission programs beyond the scope and geographic boundaries of each Presbytery. The financial support for the work of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly, comes from contributions from each local church within the presbytery. Redstone Presbytery uses the *First Fruits Offering*, to fund this important work of the "larger" church. The total projected cost for Redstone Presbytery's share of these programs is divided by the total membership of the 67 churches of Redstone Presbytery, in order to determine our *per-member cost*. This results in a suggested *First Fruits Offering* of \$45/member for 2024. For many years, the Puckety Session has designated a *tithe* (ten percent) of our budgeted expenses, to be focused *beyond* our own work here at Puckety. The *First Fruits Offering* has been the cornerstone of this tithe. A special envelope is included in the yearly offering envelopes box for the *First Fruits Offering*.
