I wish all of the exhibitors at the North East Friesian Horse Club show luck and I look forward to greeting many of you at center ring at the IFSHA World and Grand National Show.

## EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

**ENTRIES CLOSE** August 14, 2018. Entries postmarked later than August 14th will be charged a post entry fee of \$20.00, per horse. Post entries must be in the show office by the close of the previous session. See page for fee schedule. \$20.00 Office fee per Horse, academy horse's will not be charged an office fee.

**Refunds:** All entries and stall fees will be refunded on request prior to the closing date for entries (August 14, 2018). After this date, refunds will be made upon verification of a bona fide injury to horse, exhibitor or exhibitor's family, received or postmarked no later than August 14, 2018. Stall fees are not refundable.

Management reserves the right to refuse a Post entry in classes where additional entry would make it necessary to split the class.

Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide any class where it is deemed advisable and to reschedule any divided class. Entries must be made before the close of the previous session. A class may be cancelled at the beginning of session due to insufficient entries at the time.

Management reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any entry fees before or during a show without being liable for compensation.

Management requests exhibitors to comply with GR1211 regarding "SHARPS." Failure to do so will result in a fine.

An agent may make entries for more than one owner, but each owner must be on a separate signed entry blank.

Entries payable in U.S. funds only. A \$25 fee will be charged for returned checks and for exhibitors who fail to pay their fees before leaving the show.

**Stallions** may not be entered in classes specifying ladies or junior exhibitors to ride or drive. Junior Exhibitors are those who have not reach their 18th birthday as of December 1, 2018.

**Adult Riders** and drivers in amateur classes must have a current amateur card in their possession or make application for one at the Horse Show Office at least on hour prior to the class.

**Novice Classes** are open to exhibitors or horse who have not won three first place ribbons at a Regular, NEHC member show or shows sanctioned by UPHA. The status of any Novice is as of the closing date of entries for any particular recognized competition. Ribbons won within one breed do not count in reckoning novice status to another (e.g. Saddlebred to Morgan). Within a breed, ribbons won in driving do not count in reckoning novice status in riding classes and vice versa (e.g. Morgan Pleasure Driving to Pleasure Saddle).

Amateur Classes are not restricted to exhibitors 18 and over unless indicated in the Prize List.

If a Division has a Junior Exhibitor section it is expected that they will show in the section.

**Legal Notice:** The Dept. of Public Health requires that all horses provide a copy of a 2018 negative Coggins test for E.I.A. for out-of state horses: 24 months for Mass. horses and a certificate to prove the Eastern and Western Equine Encephalitis vaccination has been administered.

**Arrival time for horses and campers is Wednesday, August 22 after 8:00 am. There is no setting up before 8am on Wednesday.**

The **Coliseum** will be available on Friday , August 23 after 8:00 am until 10:00 pm.

**Stabling:** Entries wishing to be stabled together must indicate so on each individual's stabling list and entry blank by using farm or individual's name on the entry blank.

**Stalls with doors** are available at \$120.00. **NO INITIAL BEDDING.** Exhibitors will be held responsible for the condition of the stalls. Eastern States conducts inspections to insure that the stalls remain in the condition in which they were found. Stall doors may not be removed for any reason.

**Fire & Safety Regulations:** The following must be adhered to in accordance with the Town of West Springfield Fire Regulations and Public Safety Codes. NO SMOKING in the barns or in the coliseum. All fabrics used as backdrops and/or table coverings must be flame retardant. Use of spray flame retardants is acceptable. Burlap material is not allowed as back drop or table covering. Fine bark mulch and corn stalks are not allowed for display materials. Large wood chips or coarse bark mulch may be used in barns but shall be kept damp at all times. Flammable liquids and gases (Propane cylinders) are not allowed in buildings. Non-flammable gas cylinders, like helium, shall be supported by metal stands. Devices utilizing open flames are not allowed. No motorized gasoline/diesel vehicles allowed: scooters/golf carts. No large round or square bales of hay or straw and/or open piles of silage or haylage are allowed. Feed and bedding material is not allowed on the floor or any aisle for display purposes, including wood shavings, sawdust, peat moss, loose straw. No excessive accumulation of litter or rubbish allowed. Coverings are not allowed over aisles- banners, farm signs, pop-up tents. All exits shall remain free and clear at all times. All fire lanes shall remain free and clear at all times. All fire alarm pull stations and any other fire protection equipment shall be free and clear of obstructions and readily visible. All aisles shall be a minimum 10 feet in width and shall remain free and clear at all times. Aisle display width are not to exceed 30" from each side in main aisle and 24" from each side in side aisles. All fire extinguishers shall be accessible at all times. No signs, decorations or products shall be attached to any part of any sprinkler system.

**Mulch** Large wood chips or coarse bark mulch may be used **IN BARN**s but must be kept damp at all times.

**Footing:** The Coliseum ring is 100' x 200' with dirt footing. Warm-up rings are 40' x 100' and 40' x 120' with all weather surfaces composed of limestone and sand.

**Dogs** are not permitted on the show grounds unless restrained with a leash. A \$50 fine will be charged for the return of any dog found loose on the show grounds. Exhibitors are expected to clean up after their dogs, particularly in areas adjacent to campers and food service facilities.

**Motor Vehicles:** Only Golf Carts and Mopeds are allowed on the ESE grounds and driver must have a valid driver's license to operate these vehicles. Children 12 and under must wear a helmet when riding a bicycle on the grounds.

The show committee, its agents and employees assume no responsibility for accidents occurring to any exhibitor, groom, attendant, animal or equipment at the show. The Show Committee assumes no responsibility for loss or destruction or any property, equipment or damages to or by animals exhibiting at the show while on the grounds or stabling area.

**POLICY FOR REQUESTING HOLDS:** Holds will be granted at the discretion of the Director of Operations. They must be requested before the start of each session. Management will try to cooperate with an exhibitor requesting a hold, but will not be responsible if a hold is not honored. If a hold is granted, the in-gate will be held for two minutes, then open for two minutes before the class is closed.

**Prize Money will be mailed out to exhibitors within 30 days following the show. Six ribbons will be awarded in all classes.**

### FRIESIAN DIVISION

All Friesian classes will accept only purebred FPS/FHANA, FHS/FPZV Friesians. or IFSHA certified/registered Friesians. Each animal must show proof of registry. Friesian owners should refer to and follow Friesian rules posted on [www.usef.org](http://www.usef.org).

### **FRIESIAN IN HAND CLASSES**

Entries are to be judged individually, standing then at a walk and trot on the line. Entries will be judged 40% on conformation (presence, quality, type) and 60% on natural movement of the horse. No more than two handlers shall be allowed in the ring. One ~~Whisper~~ Friesian Mare is allowed.

**135. Friesian Dressage Suitability Championship\*\* +(27)** To be eligible, horse may NOT have shown in recognized Dressage competitions/Tests at 2nd level or above. Horses to enter at a working trot, rising. To be shown at a working trot, working canter, working walk, and lengthened trot. Free walk and working walk on a long rein. Trot work to be ridden rising. To be judged 70% on performance of gaits and transitions,

with attention to impulsion and submission; 30% on riders position, seat and effective use of aids.

**50. Junior Exhibitor Friesian Pleasure (All Seats)\*\***

**139 Junior Exhibitor Friesian Pleasure (All Seats) Championship (50)\*\***

**57. Friesian Hunt Seat Pleasure**

**155. \$100 added Friesian Hunt Seat Pleasure Championship (57).** To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop. Horses may be asked to extend any gait at the judge's discretion. To be judged on performance, manners, type, quality, and conformation

**38. Friesian Green Horse Pleasure Walk-Trot-Canter\*\* +**

**155. Friesian Green Horse Walt-Trot-Canter Championship \*\* +(38)** Open to horses that have not won three first place ribbons at a rated show. May be shown Hunt seat, Saddleseat or Western. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog, (No extended trot may be called for) canter or lope. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, conformation and manners

**75. Friesian Western Pleasure**

**130. \$100 Friesian Western Pleasure Championship (75)** To be shown at the walk, jog and lope. To be judged on performance, manners, type, quality and conformation.

**83. Friesian English Show Hack \*\* +**

**127. Friesian English Show Hack Championship \*\* +(83)** To be shown at a collected walk, extended walk, normal walk; collected trot, extended trot, normal trot; collected canter, extended canter, normal canter and hand gallop. At the discretion of the judge, horses while on the rail may be asked to halt and rein back. To be judged on vitality, energy, presence and quality.

**45. Friesian Saddle Seat Pleasure**

**99. \$100 added Friesian Saddle Seat Pleasure Championship (45)** To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot and canter. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, manners and conformation.

**81. Friesian Green Horse Pleasure - Walk Trot \*\* +**

**129. Friesian Green Horse Pleasure - Walk Trot Championship\*\* +(81)** Open to horses that have never been shown in a class requiring a canter or lope in any recognized show. Horse may not have won three first place ribbons at a rated show. May be shown Saddle Seat, Hunt Seat or Western. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, conformation and manners.

**36. Friesian Walk Trot Amateur \*\***

**124 Friesian Walk Trot Amateur Championship (36)**May be shown English or Western. Open to amateur riders of any age. Horse may not have cantered or loped



at a rated show OR rider may not have cantered or loped at a rated show. To be shown at a walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality.

**113. Friesian Walk Trot Pleasure\*\*+**

**144. Friesian Walk Trot Pleasure Championship\*\* + (113)** May be shown English or Western. Open to riders of any age. Horse may not have cantered or loped at a rated show OR rider may not have cantered or loped at a rated show. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog, and canter or lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, manners, presence and quality.

**26. Friesian Pleasure Amateur (Open to all seats) \*\* +**

**147. Friesian Pleasure Amateur Championship \*\* + (26)** May be shown English or Western. Open to amateur riders of any age. To be shown at a walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality.

**115. Friesian Liberty:\*\* +**This class demonstrates the beauty and elegance of the style and movement that is natural to the particular Friesian Horse. Horses to be judged on movement ,style, type, and quality. Consideration is to be given to how the horse performed during his exhibition. Horses willing to “show off” and keep moving with moderate encouragement from the exhibitor and helper are preferred over those that need constant pushing from the exhibitor and helper. The horse should give the impression that he/she is enjoying their Liberty class time, not so much that he/she is being forced to perform. Competitors will provide a CD with music selection to the show secretary upon check-in, labeled with horse’s name. Music runs for 90 seconds and handler has 2 minutes after music stops to ‘in-hand’ the horse. **Only horses 3 years of age and older are permitted in the Liberty class.**

**39. Friesian Dressage Hack\*\* +**

**121. Friesian Dressage Hack Championship\*\* + (39)** To be shown at a working walk, working trot, (rising upon entering ring) working canter, lengthened trot and lengthened canter both ways of the arena. Free walk and working trot on long rein with horse stretching forward and down to be performed in at least one direction. A rein back may be asked for. Transitions into and out of the canter will be asked for through the working trot. Horses will be asked to reverse direction at the working trot. Trot work to be ridden sitting or rising at the judge’s discretion. To be judged 70% on performance of gaits and transitions, with attention to impulsion and submission; 30% on the riders position, seat, and use effective use of aids

**42. \$100 Friesian Fantasy Costume**

To be shown at a walk and trot. Excessive speed is to be penalized. Exhibitors may be asked to halt & stand quietly on the rail. Light hand contact must be maintained. Exhibitors may show individually or in groups up to 5. Must be shown in a bridle or

bosal. All saddles, sidesaddles, girths are permissible. Entry should display the horse & rider in any creative costume of choice. Exhibitors should dress in a manner consistent with their turnout. It will be at the Judges discretion to decide if a Costume is unsafe & cause for elimination. No walkers are allowed. To be judged on creativity, suitability of costume to horse and rider and manner.

#### **96. \$100 Friesian Period Costume**

To be shown at a walk and trot. Excessive speed is to be penalized. Exhibitors may be asked to halt & stand quietly on the rail. Light hand contact must be maintained. Exhibitors may show individually or in groups up to 5. Must be shown in a bridle or bosal. All saddles, sidesaddles, girths are permissible. Entry should display the horse & rider in an authentic costume within time period of choice. Exhibitors should dress in a manner consistent with their turnout. It will be at the Judge's discretion to decide if a Costume is unsafe & cause for elimination. No walkers are allowed. Flags, bards and banners are permitted. To be judged on authenticity to period, creativity, suitability of costume to horse and rider and manners

#### **80. Friesian Combination (Ride & Drive) \*\* +**

To be shown first in harness to an appropriate vehicle at a walk, normal trot and strong trot both ways of the ring, then under saddle at walk, trot, extended trot, and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, manners and conformation.

#### **84. Friesian Carriage Driving Open Singles/Pairs\*\* +**

#### **125. Friesian Carriage Driving Open Singles/Pairs Championship \*\* +(84**

Exhibitors shall enter the ring at an animated trot. To be shown at the walk, working trot and strong trot. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Junior drivers under 14 years of age must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult. When there are passengers the driver should sit to the right hand side of the carriage. An appropriate driving whip shall be carried at all times. Failure to carry a whip in hand incurs elimination. One groom is required for a pair or tandem to assist in the event of difficulty. A groom is optional for a single horse turnout. Drivers should strive to present an appropriate turnout. "Appropriate" indicates the balance and pleasing appearance of the combination of horse and vehicle. Wooden wheeled vehicle is traditional. Drivers should be dressed conservatively and should conform to the type of turnout. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire

#### **72. Friesian Show Pleasure Driving Open**

**113. \$100 Friesian Show Pleasure Driving Open Championship (72).** To be shown at a walk, normal trot and strong trot both ways of the ring. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Headers are required. 2 and 4-wheeled vehicles are allowed and should be determined by the presentation of an appropriate turnout based on the combination of horse and vehicle. One or 2 people per vehicle, as appropriate, is allowed. A whip In-Hand suitable to the vehicle is required. A knowledgeable adult driver must accompany junior drivers under fourteen years of age.

**Driving Attire:** Drivers should dress according to the style of the present day. Dress for the driver should conform to the type of turnout. Dutch attire is permissible if suitable to the vehicle. Informal Saddle Seat Suit with matching tie, gloves and derby is appropriate for men and women. A suit & tie, sport coat & slacks with tie are acceptable for men. Coordinating hat is required. A tailored suit, blouse and skirt, dress, or slack and pants suit is acceptable for women. Coordinating hat is required. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going of condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire.

In order to compete, all horses must be registered with the American Saddle Horse Association or the Canadian American Saddlebred Horse Registry. They must be entered in their fully registered names with registration numbers and under the names of the owner(s) of record with the ASHA or the CASHR.

A copy of the registration papers showing proof of ownership, or a copy of the registration papers with a Certificate of Eligibility to Show issued by the American Saddlebred Horse Association must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry or presented to competition office before competition number will be released; competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement.

To be show at a flat walk, trot, extended trot and canter both ways of the ring. Special emphasis is on a true, flat walk. Entries must be asked both ways of the ring to halt and stand quietly on the rail. Horses must stand quietly and back readily in the line up.

To be judged 75% on manners, performance, presence and quality; 25% on conformation

**71. American Saddlebred Three Gaited Hunter Country Pleasure (All Ages)  
132. \$100 American Saddlebred Three Gaited Hunter Country Pleasure  
Championship (Open to All Ages) (71)**

To be show at a flat walk, trot, extended trot, canter and hand gallop both ways of the ring. Horses are required to stop and back on the rail. For safety reasons, the judge may limit the number of horses to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on manners, performance, suitability as a hunter, quality and conformation. In the line, horses must stand quietly with all four legs perpendicular to the ground. Horses shall be required to back readily in the line up.

To be judged 75% on manners, performance, presence and quality; 25% on total conformation.

**34. American Saddlebred Jr Exhibitor/ Amateur 3 Gaited Horse

**94. Open Color Breed Pleasure Championship (77)** *To be shown under English or Western tack. To be judged on performance and best color example of that breed. To be shown at a walk, trot/jog or alternative gait, and canter or lope.*

## GYPSY HORSE DIVISION

The show is open to any Gypsy type horse registered in a purebred studbook of any one of the registries: GVHS, GCDHA, GHA, GHRA. A copy of the registration must be submitted with entry.

### Division NOT NEHC rated / Rated GVHS

**1. Gypsy Horse in Hand** A. Halter classes are designed to evaluate the quality of breeding animals to encourage improvement of the breed.

B. Horses will be viewed from the front, rear, and side and judged on Type, Conformation, Way of Going, Quality and Presence

C. Horses are to be shown square The front legs should be on a vertical line directly under the shoulder. The back of the hocks should be in a vertical line with the animal's buttocks. At no time should the horse be stretched or parked.

D. Horses will enter the ring at a walk to the judge. When passing the judge, engage a trot for approximately 50', turn at a 90 degree angle and continue trotting for approximately 50' to allow judge the opportunity to see the trot from inline and the side angle. Line up as indicated by the ringmaster. Entries will be examined by the judge in the line up after all horses have been worked.

E. Gaits

1. The walk should be a natural flat-footed, four beat gait. The walk will be alert, with a stride of reasonable length for the size of the horse.

2. The trot should be a smooth, ground covering, two beat diagonal gait, with a slight flick of feather at the point of extension. The trot should be square and balanced with straight forward movement of the feet.

F. A horse may be shown clipped or unclipped, neither being penalized. Horses may be body clipped or shown in full coat. A small bridle path is also acceptable.

G. Horses must be serviceably sound, in good condition and well groomed. Judges may check teeth.

H. Appropriate dress does not include shorts, t shirts, sandals, slip on or open toed shoes. Attire for Halter classes is varied, but must be clean, neat and professional. Hats and gloves are optional.

I. Exhibitors may use any type of halter that compliments the horse. It should be well fitting safe halter, and can be of any type material. No knotted rope type training halters are allowed. A flat chain lead with the chain across or under the nose is permissible. A bridle with a bit is also acceptable.

### **22. Gypsy Open Walk Trot Pleasure**

All under saddle classes are to be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. The breed can vary in movement. Special show tack not required as long as the tack being used is clean and serviceable and appropriate for the discipline. Leather and synthetic are both acceptable materials for tack.

It will be at the Judges discretion to decide if a Costume is unsafe & cause for elimination. No walkers are allowed. Flags, bards and banners are permitted. To be judged on authenticity to period, creativity, suitability of costume to horse and rider and manners.
- 44. Open Liberty:** \*\* + Horses to be judged on movement ,style, type, and quality. Consideration is to be given to how the horse performed during his exhibition. Horses willing to “show off” and keep moving with moderate encouragement from the exhibitor and helper are preferred over those that need constant pushing from the exhibitor and helper. The horse should give the impression that he/she is enjoying

their Liberty class time, not so much that he/she is being forced to perform. Competitors will provide a CD with music selection to the show secretary upon check-in, labeled with horse's name. Music runs for 90 seconds and handler has 2 minutes after music stops to 'in-hand' the horse. **Only horses 3 years of age and older are permitted in the Liberty class. This class is limited to the first 10 exhibitors who enter. NO FRIESIANS ARE ALLOWED IN OPEN LIBERTY.**

Headers for Lead Line riders must be at least 18 years of age. Horses that are used are to be LESSON HORSES. Horses are not to be judged (See Horse Eligibility). Class splits will be made at the manager's discretion. There will be minimum holds allowed, please be prepared to enter the ring when the class is called. There will be a 2 minute gate call per class

**Ride Eligibility:** A rider MAY NOT enter in any other division at the show. A rider who has shown in a regular division class or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from participating further in the Academy Division, with the exception of the Show Rider Classes. Once a rider has competed at ANY level wearing a full suit, they are ineligible to compete in Academy classes at any point thereafter. The rider can however compete in Show Rider Classes in the season(s) following the season in which the rider showed wearing a full suit.

**Horse Eligibility:** Academy mounts must be Lesson Horses. A Lesson Horse is a horse or pony that is REGULARLY used in a lesson program to teach a number of different riders in any given week. Braiding is optional. There are no shoeing restrictions. Protective boots are permissible. Horses may cross-enter from the regular horse show to Academy classes, provided these horses are School Horses as defined above. Academy mounts may be shown in a snaffle bridle (martingales allowed), Pelham, or full bridle. This division is open to all breeds of horses and ponies.

**Attire:** Helmets approved for horseback riding (not bicycle helmets) are MANDATORY for all exhibitors. Riders must wear appropriate boots.

**Saddle Seat:** Kentucky Jodhpurs, boots, shirt, and tie. Vest and gloves are optional. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

**Hunt Seat:** Hunter style jodhpurs, jodhpur boots or paddock boots, shirt and tie or choker, and helmets. Adults may wear breeches and boots. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

**Western Seat:** Western jeans or slim-fitting pants, long-sleeve shirt. Ties

and chaps are optional. NO western hats are allowed. Will split classes if sufficient entries.
