This month's "Artifact from our Museum" is made of 100% "itchy" wool. It measures 3"x6" and weighs 3.2 pounds. It is green in color and has the letters US stenciled on it. It is a military blanket.

We all have very special and unique memories of this time of year. (Religious and Non) This Season reminds me of: candy canes, large glass light bulb lights on everyone's house, hot chocolate, the smells of foods that were only made at this time of year, family coming together and put aside any problems they had during the year, singing Carols, snow, Toys (at first for me as a child, then for our children and grandchildren) Charlie Brown's hopeless tree and Bob Hope overseas specials on T.V.

Now, back to the song. I also remember my parents donating to the Red Cross, Salvation Army and our Catholic Parish during this time of year. There weren't "homeless" then. They were "down on their luck folks," "street people," "Bums." But, my parents ingrained in us a respect for ALL peoples, no matter their plight. 


