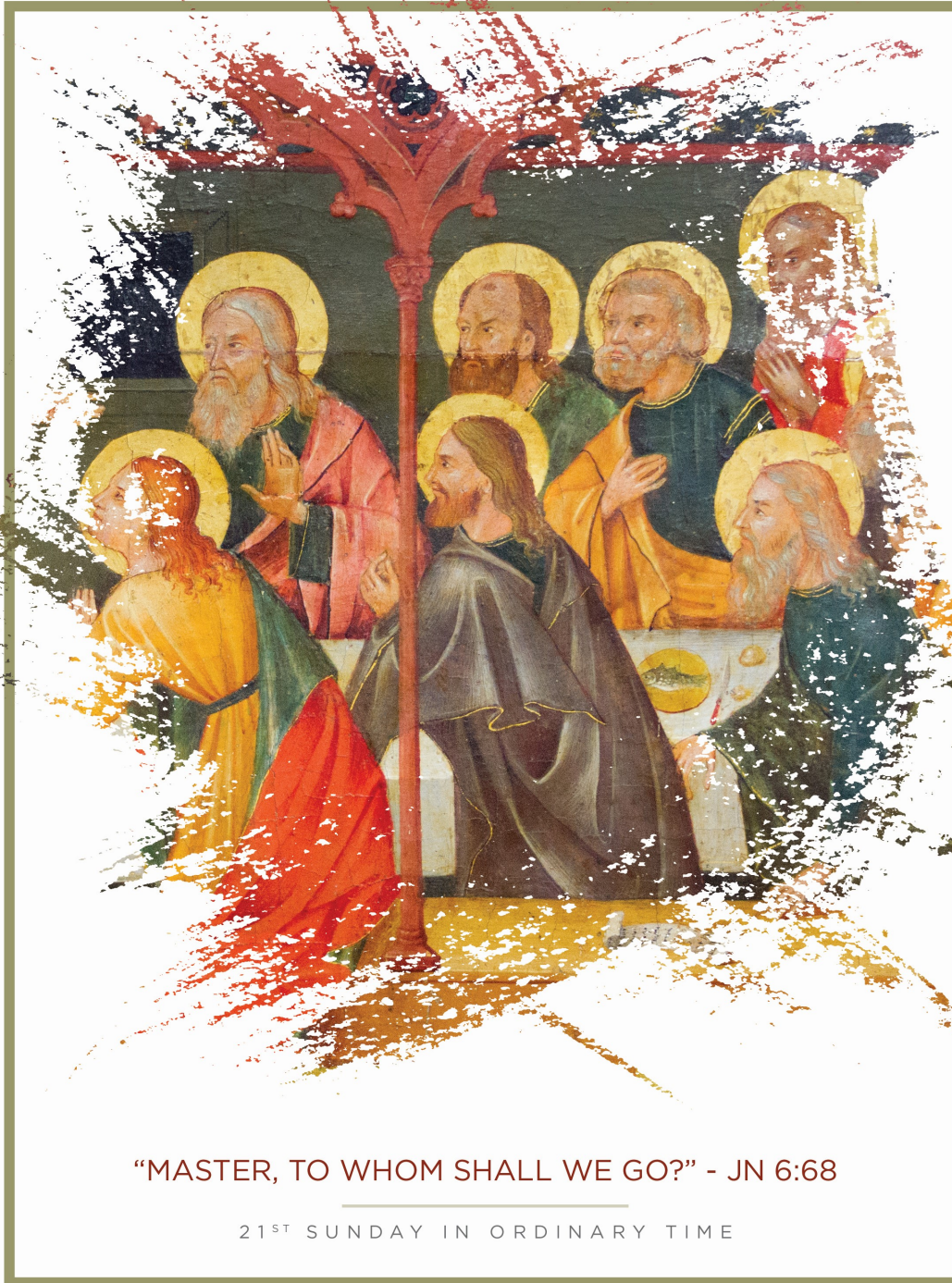

August 22, 2021

John 6: 60-69

This saying is hard, who can accept it? Think about who is asking this question in today's Gospel reading. These are the same people who witnessed the water being turned into wine and the sick being healed! This question only seems reasonable to us in today's world because we must "walk by faith, and not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7), but this was not the situation of this Gospel passage who had practically all the physical evidence possible that Jesus could do whatever miracles he wanted if faith were present. No matter how many miracles someone has seen, faith is necessary. We will never fully understand the heavenly mysteries of God that are the sacraments, especially the most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, which is Christ himself. We must be humble of heart and ask the Lord to supply where our faith is small. After all, "to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). Thank you for praying for the Bread of Life preaching series over the past five weeks. St. Rose of Lima

August 23

“Apart from the cross there is no other ladder by which we may get to heaven.”

St. Rose of Lima is remembered for her piety and chastity. From an early age she wanted to be a nun, and so would fast and perform (sometimes severe) penances in secret. At the age of 20 she joined the Third Order of St. Dominic. St. Rose was known to wear a large silver crown of thorns. It was very heavy and could pierce her head.

Legend says St. Rose was able to accurately predict the day of her death and she died on August 25, 1617. She is the patron of embroiderers, gardeners, florists, those who are ridiculed for their piety and those who suffer from family troubles.

Challenge of the Week:

Celebrate St. Rose of Lima this week! Bake cookies in the shape of a cross and decorate them with a crown of roses in the middle. Spend some time outside, and if you have a garden spend some time tending it as a family.

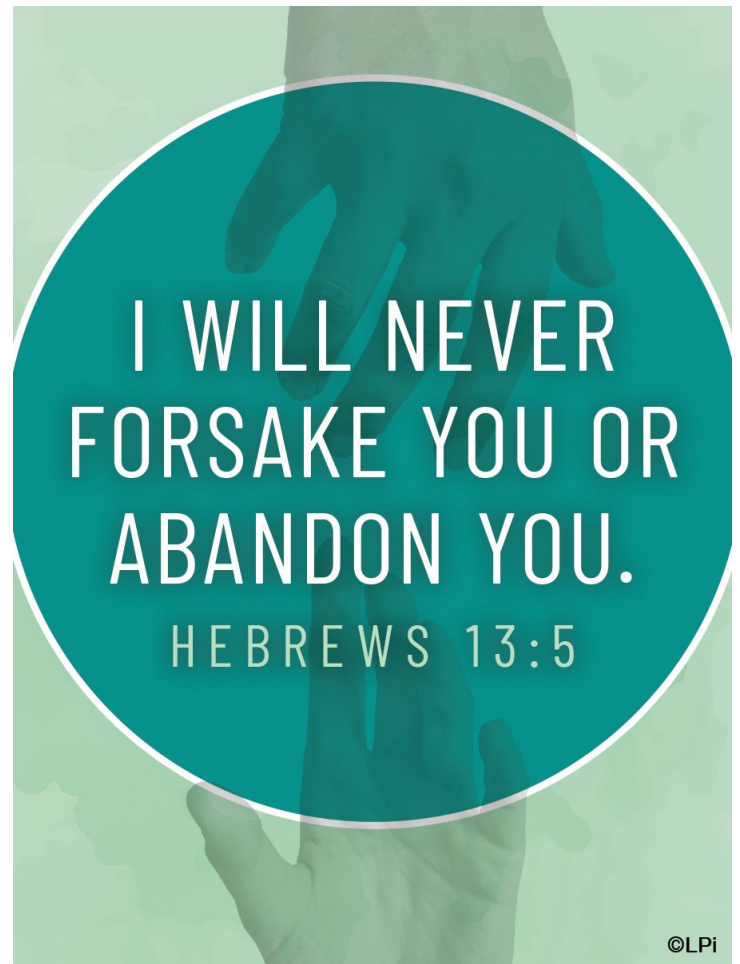

Safe Environment:

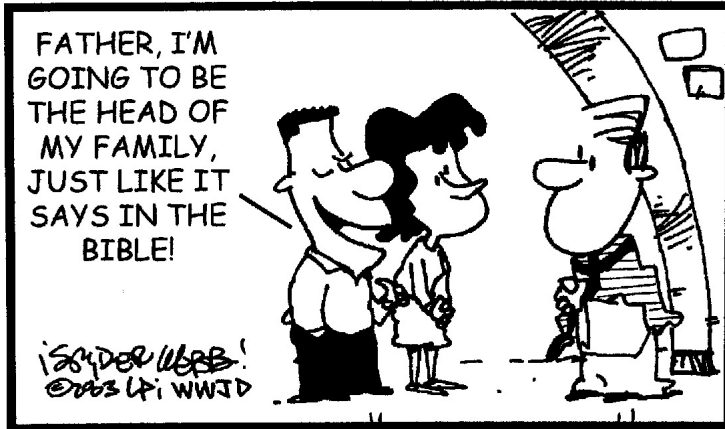

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Many people give their allegiance to something until it asks them to do something challenging or radical. Then, they find themselves rethinking whether they want to be associated with it. The same holds for God. Either we serve God, or we don't. There can be no lukewarm stance with regard to faith. If we are in, then faith in Jesus Christ asks us to do some difficult things: work in service of God's kingdom, love our enemies, offer no resistance to injury, and trust that the Eucharist is in fact Jesus' very Body and Blood. For some, buying into these things may prove too difficult and a return to a life without them is preferred. But truth is truth and it can only be found in God. If we find it hard to accept it from the mouth of Christ, where else can we go to find it? The task before us is to commit to the truth even when it may be easier to pursue something else. Truth is always worth obtaining even when it is difficult. Jesus offers us the truth of life, a life that is found in his own flesh and blood and a life of discipleship.
