Monthly meeting Minutes

We met at the McDonalds in Zeeland and cruised down to Vander Zee Motors in South Haven. Several members met us there because of their locations. Ray had arranged for us to gather in the upstairs room of the Three Blonde's Brewing, which is his daughter's business. We were served our supper selections and some sampled their brews.

Ray Vander Zee of Vander Zee Motors in South Haven shared his stories of growing up with his dad a Pontiac Dealer. His parents bought a farm in South Haven that grew produce and fruit and then another one which went well for several years. But when some bad years hit they needed an income.

So his dad got a job with the International Tractor Dealer in 1949. In 1957 he bought South Haven Auto Sales. Ray helped with sweeping floors for 25 cents a week. As he got older he began doing more of the jobs. They also had gas pumps so he was able to pump gas which included washing the windows, checking the oil and checking the air in the tires. Then he progressed to doing oil changes.

In 1963 he placed his first order for a car, a Lemans convertible. He detailed it when it arrived and it sold the next day. When the GTO's were coming out in 1964 he could not wait to see one after reading all the literature available. His dad was scheduled to attend a Dealer's meeting at Cobo Hall in Detroit. He begged his dad to request a ticket for him, too. He was 12 years old but when they arrived they learned that no women or children were allowed in the meeting. He waited in a room with the few women who were there. After a while he tried sneaking into the meeting room but was caught by a security guard. As the guard was escorting him out he spotted John DeLorean. After telling DeLorean all the facts he knew about a 1964 GTO and begging to get in he was successful.

He progressed to working in the Parts Dept, being the Service Advisor and Manager. In 1966 he was checking the cars as they arrived on the car hauler from Pontiac, MI. One day he was allowed to back a car off the hauler in late November when it was icy and snowing.

Later his dad wanted to go to an American Motors show at McCormick Place in Chicago. He chose to drive his Bonneville because it was more comfortable and would get there faster. As they arrived the parking lot attendant would not allow them to park there because it was not an AMC car.
