Our biannual standard judged flower show scheduled for Saturday July 25 at the Redstone Home on Garden Center Drive has been cancelled.




Obviously, the senior centers are still not open to visitors and the requirements of a flower show are not conducive to changing the location or continuing with plans for a show at this time.

MONARCH BUTTERFLY RELEASE NEW AND REVISED!!

Everything has changed in 2020!! We have been forced to make adjustments just about everywhere! What a crazy year!



The Monarch butterfly release will be radically modified to provide much needed enjoyment but still keeping safety foremost in everyone's minds. The release will be held at the Lefevre Butterfly Garden located on the Garden House grounds behind the main building. Two releases are scheduled: 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM.

Sadly, we were forced to cancel Rick Mikula's entertaining presentation for 2020 and fervently hope to have him back again next year! We do, thankfully, have many talented speakers and will have a small ceremony before releasing the Monarchs. You can reserve a butterfly to release at the Garden House or you can take your butterfly home to release in your own garden. Don't want to wander the garden? Do a drive-up and we can bring your butterfly to your car.

Educational displays will be located inside the Garden House. The troughs will hold milkweed and Monarch larvae so visitors can witness the colorful larvae eating their way to the chrysalis stage. Fascinating!!

\$7.00 will reserve a butterfly. After two years of offering free Monarchs, we are not able to do so this year. Only 200 Monarchs have been ordered, cutting back from 400 in 2019. Be sure to reserve early!
