**RICHARD E. "DICK" SMACH**

Richard Earle Smach, 92, formerly of Silver Bay, passed away Wednesday March 25, 2020 at VA Health Care Systems in St. Cloud. He was born October 19, 1927 to Laddie and Katheryn Smach of Berwyn, IL. Dick was a veteran of WWII, serving in the Pacific. He married Maryanne in Rochester, on February 11, 1950 and they lived in St. Cloud and South Haven for 38 years before moving to Silver Bay in July of 1988. In retirement they wintered in Cottonwood, Arizona for 18 years until 2002.

Dick worked for the Civil Aeronautics Administration after the war, as an electronics technician and was employed the rest of his career by Northwestern Bell Telephone Company, retiring in 1982.

Dick was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Silver Bay, the Mingus Gem & Mineral Club of Cottonwood AZ, Oak Creek Gem & Mineral Club of Sedona, AZ, the Carlton Gem & Mineral Club of Carlton, the Minnesota Archaeology Society, the VFW of Silver Bay, Eagles Club of St. Cloud, and the board of the Bay Area Historical Society. With Maryanne, Dick worked at Hamline College and the Minnesota Science Museum of St. Paul on projects.

Dick enjoyed fishing, hunting, bowling, golf, his love of rock hunting, lapidary work and making silver jewelry, and his electronic and video projects. Dick was an accomplished silversmith, and did flintknapping (making stone tools and arrowheads), and spent much time in the garden growing tomatoes, cucumbers and flowers.

His wife Maryanne preceded him in death on January 26, 2010 after 60 years of marriage.

**Two Harbors Resident Selected for 2020 Bush Fellows**

The Bush Foundation announced the selection of its 2020 Bush Fellows, a group of 24 visionary leaders who are thinking big about how to solve problems and shape a better future for their communities. This is one of the largest fellowships of its kind in the country.

One of this year's fellows is Jenna Udenberg, a Two Harbors resident who is passionate about making the North Shore more accessible and a destination for people with disabilities.

Jenna Udenberg is on a mission to make the world a more inclusive place for people with disabilities, especially her home community on the north shore of Lake Superior. A wheelchair user from an early age, she understands the physical and intangible societal barriers facing those with disabilities. She wants to change attitudes, approaches and accessibility so that the North Shore of Minnesota becomes a destination for people with disabilities and a model of welcome other areas can emulate. To become both an expert and advocate for change, she needs to learn how to better tell her story to remove the chasm between the non-disabled and disabled worlds. She will also pursue advanced training in Universal Design and visit other locations known for cutting-edge accessibility.

The Bush Fellowship is an investment in individual leaders. It provides Fellows with up to \$100,000 over 12 to 24 months to pursue formal and informal learning experiences that help them develop the skills, attributes and relationships they need to become more effective, equitable leaders who can drive change in their communities and region as a whole. The Fellowship is distinctive in its flexibility, allowing Fellows to articulate what they need to become more effective and agile leaders. Fellows can use the funding to pursue advanced education, networking opportunities, and leadership

resources, workshops and trainings.

"The Bush Foundation believes that strong and equitable leaders are necessary for our communities to be places where every person can thrive," said Bush Foundation Leadership Programs Director Anita Patel. "These 24 Fellows have demonstrated tremendous capacity to lead change, and we believe in their potential to make an even greater difference."

A total of 746 people applied for the 2020 Bush Fellowship. The 24 Fellows were selected through a multi-stage process involving Bush Fellowship alumni, Bush Foundation staff and established regional leaders. Applicants described their leadership vision and passion and how a Bush Fellowship would help them think bigger and become more effective leaders.

The Bush Foundation will accept applications for the 2021 Bush Fellowship beginning August 18, 2020. The Bush Fellowship is open to anyone age 24 years and older who lives in Minnesota, North Dakota, South
