


Rule #2: REMEMBER THE ADULTS YOU TRUST... CHECK WITH THEM FIRST YOU MUST!





A "trusted adult" is a grownup who you may ask for help if you are lost. You may always ask your parents, family members, teachers or officers for help. Use the space above to draw some of your own "trusted adults" for me.


Rule #3: IT'S OKAY TO YELL... THEN GO RUN AND TELL!



If a stranger tries to touch you or take you with him or her, don't be afraid to yell out, "Leave me alone, you're a stranger!" Run away as fast as you can and tell a trusted adult, or run into the nearest store and get help. Color the picture above of the child running away from the stranger.




Rule #4: IT'S SAFER WITH TWO... YOUR BUDDY AND YOU!





When you're not with your parents, always travel with a "buddy." A buddy is someone you can be safer with in case you meet a stranger or if you are lost. Connect the dots above to give the child a buddy.


Rule #5: THERE'S NOTHING TO SAY... JUST WALK AWAY!



Never talk to strangers. Strangers may offer you candy or gifts. Don't take anything from anyone without checking with your parents first. If a stranger tries to talk to you, don't answer... just walk away. Color the picture above of the two buddies above being safe.



Rule #6: WALK WHERE IT'S BRIGHT... YOU'LL GET HOME ALL RIGHT!



When walking or riding your bike to or from home, don't take shortcuts through dark places like parks, alleys or yards. Stay on the sidewalks using familiar, well-lit routes. Help me find the safest way home.


Rule #7: DON'T GET IN THE CAR... RUN FAST AND FAR!



If a stranger in a car or truck tries to talk to you, offer you a ride or ask you for help, stay away from them. Get away fast, running the other way so they can't follow you. Never get into a car with a stranger. Color the picture above of the child staying away and being safe.
