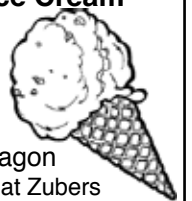

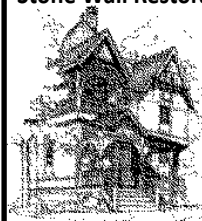

**FEATHERS IN THE WIND**

It is June 20th and I feel sort of “rattled.” It has not helped by my waking up every hour or so from having one nightmare after another. I think it is more the fact that I have yet another doctor’s appointment and I am afraid I will over sleep. Silly, isn’t it?

This is a week I should rejoice in the goodness that God has given me. You see tomorrow will be twenty years since my beloved Charlie was wheeled away and taken in for surgery. The diagnosis was not good,

He had mouth cancer and had already had most of his teeth pulled (two years after we had spent a fortune on having them straightened). “IF” the operation was successful he would have to have 36 radiation treatments. (I think that IF was what bothered me the most.)

There I sat with my sister manning what was then a relatively new device...a cell phone and our one son pacing the halls, the other son was home doing the most important job of all...praying.

I kept thinking of what I would do without him and prayed. Believe it or not, I did not cry.

When the doctor came back and told us not only that the surgery had been successful, but that he would soon be out of recovery and back in his room I did not know what to do next.

We went to the waiting room and sat with my two sons in silence.

I guess any of you mother’s would know what was running through my mind. I had one son who had just graduated with honors from college and was going to grad school (maybe) and another son who was dealing with a crisis of his own...being bullied. What would I do next?

Those weeks of radiation treatment were not nice. Charlemagne’s throat was raw and he could barely swallow. Thanks to people like Tante Linda and Lial he ate zucchini soup while Lucille Kraus would send him “Schmeer Kasse” which was about all he could keep down. All the other food seemed to make him choke and shutter from the pain of swallowing.

I remember standing in a grocery store with our youngest son and just begging God to give me some idea of what I could feed him because he was in such pain.

Ironically, within a week after the radiation treatments were over he could eat about as well as anyone who had a hole in the roof of his mouth. That would eventually be “fixed” thanks to the doctors at the University.

I will always be grateful to Dr. Mark Marz and Jolena Dickel for their support through all of this, not to mention all the people who would call, send things, and just be there. I know I sounded then, as I do now, like some sort of rambling idiot, but they stuck with me.

TWENTY YEARS is a long time, but this week will also mark the second anniversary of Rick Gerard’s esophageal cancer surgery. Imagine what he and his family went through and then look at him riding by on his tricycle every day. God is good!

I should also be grateful because today marks the sixth week since my cancer surgery. Friday I got a good bill of health and the promise that now I would not have to go and see the doctor as often. I want to thank all of you who sent cards, food, but especially prayers. I have no idea why God has allowed the three of us to live and others to go home to God, but I am grateful for HIS wisdom.

**OPA’S TRACTOR BARN**

Stop and check out the historic tractors in Opa’s Tractor Barn Museum, an open air museum in the old horse barn in West Amana owned by the Schanz family.

The barn, built in the late 1800’s was constructed using beam and peg, utilizing trees that fit the need of the builders and includes some beautiful chestnut beams. In the museum one can step back into time to farming in the 1940’s and 50’s. The family patriarch, Norman Schanz, remember’s being proud to be assigned his own tractor as a teenager, it was felt being assigned your own tractor meant that the equipment would be checked daily before use, and therefore better maintained. Some of the machinery at the museum was originally purchased by the Amana Society and has never left the colonies.

So step back in time and be sure to drop by the barn to check out the farming equipment there. Hours are 10 AM - 4 PM Tuesday- Thursday, admission is a free will donation used to maintain the property. Also, there are machinery parts for sale as well as a full line of “sewing machine” tractors available for purchase. While visiting, be sure to ask for a 10% off card for the Schanz Furniture and Refinishing Shop in South Amana.
