December 2, 2019

The last board meeting of 2019 was called to order by President Williams on December 2nd, 2019.

After the minutes of the previous board meeting were read and accepted, the financial report was read. The Committee Reports were given next. Jeri W. reported the February Carnival got a great beginning with the "Roost-er Holler" skit at Meet and Greet.

Diane L. reported on the Food and Animal Banks. Our donations are greatly appreciated and asked that we keep them coming. There is currently a need for sweaters for small dogs. If you have any, get them to her.

Linda M. discussed line dancing. It is currently scheduled for Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings and there is room for plenty more dancers.

There is a new Pet Committee and the first meeting is scheduled for December 17, 2019.

Carole F. shared with us the importance of the quilts made and donated. They are given to abused children to provide warmth and comfort. Susan N. also spoke on this committee and indicated that all volunteers are welcome. After all, sewing machines are a power tool.

Jeri W. reported the newsletter was sent to over 100 email addresses. You were asked to let her know if it hadn't been received and it would be resent. Renters are welcome to print a copy from the Clubhouse copies.

Carole F. reported a road cleanup was scheduled for December 14, 2019 and again in January.

Tom A. reported that \$205.00 worth of shirts were sold last month. The shirt inventory is very low and new ones were being ordered.

It was noted we had declined the offer from our neighboring park, Desert Springs RV. They had asked for \$7800 for usage of their facilities by our residents.

There was discussion regarding the \$400 fee paid for the phone in the Clubhouse. A motion was made and seconded to remove the phone and use the funds for projects around the park. The motion passed.

Stop signs had been purchased, paid for by RR and installed by the PCM Committee. Diane L. asked when a sign reserving the spot for laundry would be installed.

It was moved and seconded to allocate \$350.00 for the February carnival. Motion passed.

President Williams asked Committee Chairs to write up guidelines and procedures for their committees.

Herb B. requested totes be purchased and used to replace broken boxes used to store decorations. Thus, it was moved and seconded that up to \$100 be authorized for these totes.

Reminders were given to sign up for Flapjack Friday and be ready for the Christmas decoration contest. It was moved and seconded that \$50 be allocated for prize winners of that contest.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned. The next Roof Raisers meeting is scheduled for January 13, 2020.





- What if you choose one thing you could have forever, but you didn't get anything else?






Hi! I'm Buck! Remember me from last season? Because "Gamma" puts so much time into this newsletter I get to have my own page.

Volunteerism is so appreciated. Because we are a Co-Op, it is not only needed but expected.











COMMA COMMA


