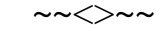
### Auction Items Needed

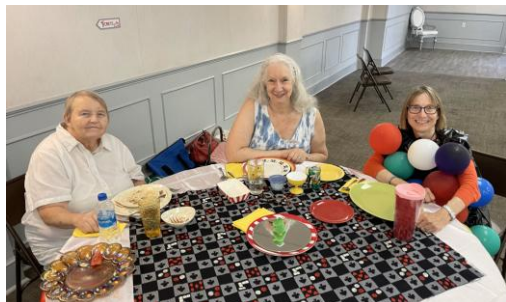
