JULY MEETING NOTES

The clubhouse alarm system is now functional. Everyone who has a key to the clubhouse must now have a key FOB to operate the system. Contact Cody Lovelace if you haven't been issued a FOB and need access to the clubhouse.

We have had three applications submitted from our junior club shooters for scholarships from the John Mohns Memorial Fund. This fund was set up from donations by the late club member John Mohns for scholarships and the promotion of junior shooting. Alec Patajo, Bill Riggs (both University of Nevada at Reno) and Emma Goist (Coe College in Iowa) have applied for scholarships as they are off to college next September. At the board meeting, a motion was made and passed to grant the scholarships.

During the board meeting, we discussed the placement of the new flagpole. The debate is between centered directly in front of the clubhouse or on the front/south side of the clubhouse in the raised area by the utility boxes, as well as what type of lighting we will use. We will soon have a locator company come out to see where the underground utilities are placed and what options we have.

Darrell Behounek asked me to remind pistol shooters to staple their targets between the uprights, not over them. We are finding a lot of the upright legs are getting shot up due to having targets stapled overhanging the upright 2x4s.

Kudos to Cody Lovelace for getting the air conditioning in the meeting room working. We noticed before the meeting that it was too warm in the room, so Cody tracked down the issue between meetings finding a tripped breaker in the electrical room.

600YD BLACK POWDER CARTRIDGE RIFLE SHOOT THIS MATCH HAS BEEN CANCELLED

It's time again to get ready for Paul Bunyan's 600 yd BPC/Fun Match. The date will be Tuesday, August 21st. The match begins at 9:00 am but arrive early to get signed up. The match fee is the usual \$10.00. The course of fire will be 15 minutes for sighting in followed by 15 minutes to shoot a ten shot group target. The next two targets will be 25 minutes each to fire 15 shots for score. You will need 40 rounds plus sighters and foulers. There will be a brief pause between targets for cleaning, etc. There will be two relays, one on the firing line and one in the pits pulling and scoring targets. When the first relay is finished, they will go to the pits and the other relay will come to the line for their chance at fame and glory. This is mainly a Black Powder Cartridge match, but the "Fun" part is if you don't have a black powder rifle, you can shoot that new-fangled smokeless powder rifle with jacketed or cast bullets. JUNIOR MATCH RESULTS

Our Junior Air Rifle team recently competed in the Junior Olympics/Civilian Marksmanship Program 3 Position Air Rifle Nationals June 23-26 in Camp Perry Ohio. The nation's top 3PAR precision shooters were invited (over 300 individuals and 55 teams). Each individual or team had to qualify to make these Nationals. Our team members are Alec Patajo, Emma Goist, Bill Riggs, Andrew Pham and Emme Nelson. There were 2 Nationals. First was the USA Junior Olympics. Our team finished 17th out of 55 teams. Overall the team shot very well. In the CMP Nationals our team finished with a respectable 12th overall out of 55 teams.

Andrew Pham shot a personal best in the CMP and was 1 point out of making the top 8 finals. Both Emma Goist and Bill Riggs shot personal bests. Emme Nelson shot extremely well considering she had a knee injury.

Four out of our five team members have now graduated high school and will be attending a 4 year university/college. Alec Patajo (University Nevada-Reno - NCAA Rifle team). Emma Goist (Coe College). Bill Riggs (University Alaska Fairbanks). Andrew Pham (University Nevada-Reno - NCAA Rifle team). Emme Nelson will be a senior in high school.

During the early part of 2018, the NRA sectionals were shot across the nation at all the affiliated clubs. These are sanction matches that are scored and submitted where the results are compiled nationally. The final national results were recently posted in June. This year Alec Patajo is our NRA Indoor Metric Smallbore Overall Champion (517 entries). He also earned the Overall Runner Up (Silver Medalist) in the Jr Position Air Rifle. Other disciplines where he ranked near the top - Jr Metric Smallbore & Precision Air Rifle Standing. Both Andrew Pham and Emme Nelson are also ranked in the sectionals.

RED LIGHT WARNING SYSTEM ON THE RIFLE RANGE

A number of individuals are using the rifle range red downrange indicator lights in an UNSAFE manner. The red lights are NOT to be used to call a cease fire.

To call a cease fire, you must communicate with all others on the firing line, clear and ground all firearms, and insure that the line is in fact safe. Then, and only then, should the persons proceeding downrange turn on the switch nearest to their firing position. When they return to a safe position behind the firing line, turn off the same switch. You must then communicate verbally with all others on the firing line to make sure the range is hot again and to insure that everyone has had time to put their eye and ear protection back on.

A few pointers to keep in mind:

- The red lights are not visible while you are sitting at a bench aiming at a target
- The red lights will not make you bulletproof
- Just because the red lights are off does not mean that it is safe to shoot.
- The red lights are an aid, not a replacement for eyes, ears, and brains!
- Always remember, do not handle firearms while people are down range.

IN THE NEWS

At the November election, firearms related bill I-1639 will be voted on. Several gun rights organizations have taken exception with the bill and how the signature gathering petitions were written. There is also a lawsuit being brought forward by the NRA regarding Seattle's safe storage gun law. In the national news, a recent decision by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in San Francisco "has recognized that the Second Amendment protects a right to openly carry loaded firearms in public for self-defense".
