Bob DeBoer's Winter Project


My winter project was to make some improvements to my 2002 TA that Rox and I purchased last March and also fix a couple of things on Rox's Reatta. So early in November we closed (as Rox calls it) The Iron Curtain, put the TA on jack stands and started.

During last Summer I had found some things I wanted to change on the TA. I put new brakes on it, up-graded to performance rotors and pads. I ordered new floor mats from Year One to dress up the inside. I then started changing all the fluids, changed the anti-freeze and went to a 160 degree thermostat. I changed the transmission oil and filter and the next thing I wanted to do was to change my Ram Air filter cover to the SLP Air package and Smooth Billow between the M.A.F & T.B. and since I had it all apart I blocked off the water passing through the throttle body. Next I had fun changing my spark plugs and found new positions I didn't know my body could yet do. Next on the list was to improve exhaust flow so I put on a Dymamax round Y pipe and Delete Cat Pipes, and while I was under there I detailed the bottom side of the

car. Rox asked "what I was doing" and I told her I was washing the bottom of my car. She was thinking what on earth for and why don't you come in and wash the kitchen floor instead!

I had been thinking of an easier way to get in and out of the Drivers seat. I remembered back in the 70's GM made a few swivel seats so I went on line and started searching for something to use and found Monte Carlo seats, but they didn't want to sell bases without seats so I started looking at office chairs and then it came to me. Boat seats, they swivel, so back online I went to look at Atwood, a manufacturer that makes boat accessories and there it was, swivels for boat seats. From there after talking to my brother I ended up at Cabela's and bought a locking swivel base. I now have a seat that turns about 20.....degrees and makes it easier to get in and out. I have one more thing to do before our Dust Off and that is to change the rear end oil and gears and space out the rear wheels 1" just for looks. So back to work and see you in the spring. **Bob**
