Mr. Davis, from Gexcon, covered gas and dust explosions. Scott was able to discuss the basic parameters and explosion properties. He went into fairly good detail to explain flame propagation and acceleration mechanisms, while keeping at an understandable level. Scott explained factors affecting explosion effects and consequences as well as explosion loads.

Scott explained "far field" damage showing the energy that was released vs. "near field" damage relating to the details of the explosion. He was able to tie it all in to NFPA 921 that shows how they are able to recreate events and experiment as a tool to aid in their investigation. In short, he is paid to blow things up.
