




Tending the Soil, Tending the Sower, 2020

We are accepting registrations for this year's catechists' formation day, scheduled for Saturday, September 26th at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church, Riverview. The day is open to all catechists, not only those who work in children's catechesis.

Given the changes which had to be made to ensure the safety of all, and honour the protocol outlined by the Archdiocese of Moncton in response to the global Covid-19 pandemic, the day will look different than past years and will begin earlier than previously advertised, now commencing at 8:30 a.m. with prayer. There will be three 1.5-hour sessions, facilitated by Trevor Droesbeck, Susan McCarthy and Charlene Peters with a 10-minute stretch break between the sessions. No tea, coffee or snacks will be provided; however, participants are welcome to bring their own. Masks upon entrance and during one-on-one conversations is mandatory.

2020-2021 Faith Development Registration

Registrations for the biweekly sessions of faith development for St. Augustine's and St. Lawrence O'Toole will be taking place on Sunday, Sept. 13^{th} from 12:15 - 1:15 pm in the church basement of St. Augustine's. Our faith development program is available for children entering grade 1 thru grade 6 in school this September.

In keeping with our Covid-19 protocols, please use the door at the top of the stairs in the parking lot, proceeding downstairs to the basement

and then depart using the elevator to the parking lot. We also ask that only one parent/adult be present for the registration so to minimize the number of people enabling us to maintain the proper social distancing during the registration. The remainder of the family may wait in the parking lot if necessary.

You can submit the form online or print the form (using the word or pdf document) and drop it off at our office using the mail slot located at the door facing Dominion St.

Please be advised that, in accordance with our diocesan policy, there is a fee of \$30 per child or \$50 per family (2 children or more) to be paid at the time of registration. We can only accept cash or cheques made payable to St. Augustine's or St. Lawrence O'Toole. No debit, credit or etransfer available. For those registering online, payment will be accepted at our first session.

Please note that this registration is only for our biweekly faith development program.

Exploring our Faith

The Grudge

Have you held a grudge against another person, place or thing, whether that grudge be grounded in truth or grounded in gossip? Perhaps you are harbouring a grudge right now. Are you someone who likes to grumble over, find fault with or show dissatisfaction with? If you are, then you may be a grudge-holder.

My father's mother died in 2017 at the age of 94, and her mother died at the age of 90 in 1983. For the last 30-odd years of my great-grandmother's life these women lived two small Nova Scotia towns apart but did not speak to one another over what I was told was a serious quarrel. The quarrel was so serious in fact that my grandmother did not attend my great-grandmother's funeral in 1983. Of course, you are curious to know the source of this quarrel and I am as well. If you ever find out the reason, please let me know because I have often wondered what could have happened to create this gulf between a mother and a daughter. At the end of their lives I wonder if they themselves remembered the source of the conflict and if it was worth it. Were they in fact aware of the cost? Who won, I wonder?

I do not intend criticism of these women or to cast them in a negative light. I think they were human, fragile and prone to the same human pitfalls each of us are prone to and were prone to 2,000 years ago when Jesus walked the earth teaching with parables.

The definition of "begrudge" is to wish to deprive someone of something, and I have discovered through prayer and self-reflection that two items I can be stingy with (apart from money) are grace and forgiveness, even when I expect grace and forgiveness from others and even when I have been the beneficiary of God's infinite grace and forgiveness every day of my life. This illuminates the hypocrisy of my own double-standards.

I may be the only person who read today's gospel from Matthew and related better to the slave who grabbed another slave by the throat than I related to Jesus' instruction to forgive someone 77 times. In the movies and on television at least, grabbing someone by the throat looks normal and satisfying, especially if I am 1,000% certain about how right I am about being wronged. Forgiveness requires not only love but perspective,



and a willingness to let go, all requiring far greater maturity and strength than I have been able to live up to at times.

I have also learned holding a grudge or begrudging someone forgiveness is costly...with the damage carried mainly by me, the grudge-holder, not the person I thought I was holding accountable.

"How can I forgive *them* for having *done that*?" you might ask. "They're not even sorry, and I can never forget what they did."

"Forgiveness is not about forgetting. It is about letting go of another person's throat."

Others are affected when I hold a grudge against them, but the greatest cost lays on my own shoulders and in my own heart, not the heart and shoulders of the person I am metaphorically holding by the throat, no matter what I might think.

May God's infinite grace and forgiveness be inspiration for me to share these precious gifts with everyone I encounter, even if my greatest desire is to seize them by the throat.

Attending Mass

A Reminder to follow these guidelines:

In the parking lot, please observe social distancing

At the church entrance, stop and allow the volunteer to check you in.

Inside the door, stop and you will be given hand-sanitizer (your hands will be 'squirted')

Inside the church, follow the volunteer to your assigned seat

During Mass, follow all arrows and markings on the floor, so we all stay safely 6 feet apart

During Mass, enjoy the Music Ministry, Hum along, but for now, no singing.

After Mass, respect the safety of keeping 6 feet between you and your fellow parishioners while leaving the building and when in the parking lot. Please do not gather on front steps after mass.



Thank you to all our volunteers!! Our church must be disinfected following every liturgy; there must be a person checking people in and having them answer the Covid-19 questions; there also needs to be someone just inside the door supplying all in attendance with hand sanitizer; and finally, there must be volunteers inside the church escorting people to their seats in a manner that respects social distancing.
